## Foreword by Pastor

In this foreword, I want to encourage you from Apostle Paul's words of thanksgiving from 1 Thessalonians 1:2-3 saying, "We give thanks to God always for you all, making mention of you in our prayers; Remembering without ceasing your work of faith, and labour of love, and patience of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ, in the sight of God and our Father." Apostle Paul keeps thanking God for the spiritual growth of the Thessalonian church. Indeed we must always thank God when there is spiritual growth among His people. God desires His people to grow spiritually. It is not a church with a big building that gives Him joy. It is not a church filled with people from the first to the last pew that gives glory to Him. It is a church which grows spiritually, walks faithfully and obediently in His truth. It is a church which earnestly contends for the faith once delivered unto the saints (Jude 3)! That is what pleases God, and gives joy and glory to Him!

What does spiritual growth mean? Does it mean that as long as I am regular in worship services, prayer meetings, Bible study and fellowship groups I am growing spiritually? Of course, if you are hardly found in either of the above-mentioned, it is quite unbelievable to say you are growing spiritually. Attendance in spiritual activities is not the yardstick for spiritual growth. Then what is? Verse 3 tells us what makes a faithful and obedient church that grows spiritually. And this is a challenge for us. Apostle Paul mentioned three important elements about the church that is growing: ① Work of Faith, ② Labour of Love, and ③ Patience of hope. These are three elements that described the Thessalonian church as a growing church. Faith, hope and love are the primary virtues that must be seen in every true church of the Lord Jesus Christ. Let us look at each of them.

Work of Faith. Faith means belief and trust in a person or object with confidence. In this case, the object of faith is the Lord Jesus Christ. And it is this faith in Him that produces work. It is a working faith, a living one, not dead. James chapter 2 provides the inspired explanation of such working faith. In other words, true faith will result in a changed life. Once converted, we are never the same again. We are prone to believe that in order for God to accept us in heaven, we must be good enough. Therefore we work hard to live a righteous life, do good works, give to charity, help the poor, be kind to animals and believe somehow by doing so, there is better chance of getting into heaven. We must realize that our good works can never give us salvation. It is by grace through faith that gives us salvation. It is not good works that leads to salvation. It is salvation that leads us to good works. True faith stirs up the church to work. When a person believes in Jesus Christ, he is stirred to work and serve Him. A strong faith stirs up, arouses, activates and energizes believers to work and carry out the mission of Christ.

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## Foreword by Pastor

True saving faith is a working faith, a faith that produces work. Do you have this faith? Do you want such a faith? We must pray for a working faith to be found in us, for we need this to be a growing church.

Labour of love. It is an agape love that constrains us to labour for the Lord Jesus Christ. This sacrificial and self-giving love stirs the church to labour for Christ. The word "labour" means to toil, to labour to the point of exhaustion. When a person truly loves Christ, he is prompted and driven to labour tirelessly for Christ. Note that the believer who is driven by love to serve Christ is the believer who has really understood the love of Christ being manifested in his own life. He is so conscious of this love that he knew the only right response to his Saviour is to labour for Him. He is mindful of what his Lord has done for him. For He has borne his sins and punishment so that he may be restored and be forgiven of all his sins. A believer knows he is unworthy of his Saviour's love, and instead deserves to be punished and condemned to perish in hell. It is with this humility, gratitude and thanksgiving that he reciprocates with love for His Saviour in labour. We labour for God because we love Him. The world has kept us busy and more busy each day. Yet regardless of the demand of the world, I thank God that some of you have put aside your time and no matter how tired and drained out, you still want to labour for the Lord. I pray and hope it is not out of convenience we labour for Him. It should not be by the way, but out of the way that we serve the living and true God. Service is one of the best expressions of our love for God and for God's people. Service to God is not confined only within the church and the fellowship group. We can serve God anywhere in our office, school, workplace, home, anywhere by living for Him, by shining for Him, by words and actions. Let us labour for Him today and serve Him according to His way even when it is out of the way.

Patience of hope. The word "patience" in the original language gives us the idea of super endurance. It is having a spirit which will never say die, and will never give up easily. 'Hupomone' is the Greek word for patience. When someone tries to provoke you to sin and to fall into temptation, remember to hupomone! When someone makes you envy, angry, greedy, be hupomone! It is a hope that inspires patience. Hope means an expectation and desire for something to happen. The hope of the believer is in the Lord. Hope in the Lord Jesus Christ stirs the church to endure with great patience in all its work and labour. We need to hupomone! For our hope is in Christ. As such we know no matter what happens, He will still guide us. He will still provide for us. He will still strengthen us. He will still sustain us all the way to the end. He will still bless us. He will still be there for us. Our patience of hope is to know that our Lord is going to receive us into heaven at the end of this life and reward us according to our labour on this earth. Therefore, with this patience of hope, we are driven to endure in hope. We do not complain. We do not give up. We do not say die easily. Let us hope with patience, for our hope will not be in vain.

These are the three virtues we all must possess, ① Work of Faith, ② Labour of Love, and ③ Patience of Hope, if we want to be a growing church. Let us ask God to help us to be a growing church for His eternal glory. Amen.

## Word from our Advisor

***Bless the LORD, O my soul: and all that is within me, bless his holy name.***

***Bless the LORD, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits:***

***Psalms 103:1-2***

In this psalm, the psalmist calls on himself and others to bless God. To bless God is to praise God with a strong affection for Him and a sense of gratitude (Barnes).

### ***Who we are to bless***

We are to bless the LORD, who is Jehovah, the God of covenant, Who keeps His promises, and will never fail. His covenant blessings are not based on our faithfulness, which will utterly fail, but based on His own faithfulness.

*2 Corinthians 1:20 For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us.*

Our God is also the perfectly Holy One, and we bless His Holy Name. All that He does is perfect and right. He cannot stand sin, yet He loves us. He does not accept sin, but provides a way to remove them in order to save us, at the cost of His own Son. Therefore He is worthy of our praise.

In the first 2 verses, we are told 3 times to bless the Lord. This triple emphasis shows how important it is for us to praise God, and there is no excuse not to.

### ***How we are to bless***

The psalmist calls upon himself to bless the LORD, 'O my soul: and all that is within me.'

We are to bless God with all our faculties – all my soul, and all that is within: our heart, our will, our affections, our emotions. What is in the heart and soul will be, and has to be, manifested externally – a joyful expression of gratitude, such that it will be obvious. However, many only perform an external form of praise – Singing with the lips, but not with their heart; Praising with their mouths, but not with their purpose; Blessing with their hands, but not their affections.

The praising and blessing of God must be with our whole being – from the inside to the outside, just as we ought to love the Lord: *Mark 12:30 And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment.*

### ***Forget not all His benefits***

Praising and bless God is both our privilege and duty. There is no greater joy than to praise God, and worship Him. As we remember what our God has done for us, we cannot but bless His Name, and praise Him. "Remembrance is the hallmark of gratitude" (Dr SH Tow).

But how prone we are to forget – Who God is, and what He has done for us, especially in healing us of our spiritual disease of sin. We need constant reminders of all the benefits and blessings He has bestowed upon us because of His grace and mercy and love.

The year 2015 is just past. The Lord has indeed been good to us – as the Adults' Fellowship, and as families and individuals. Do we remember the blessings of God, and do we praise and thank God for them? Or have we so quickly forgotten them? Let us be grateful for what our God has done, and seek Him in the new year. May all members and friends strive for a closer walk with God, a better understanding of God's Word, and a life of obedience and testimony for His glory.

Remember our AF motto: ***Philippians 1:21 - For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain.***

TAF organized a Gospel meeting on 18<sup>th</sup> April at Westmere Condo. Preacher Clement Chew spoke on “Behold...the Lord shall come!” and we also showed a video on the theme that evening. Preacher Joshua Yong expounded on the theme found in chapter 3:7, *“Return unto me, and I will return unto you, saith the LORD of hosts.”* The LORD here gives His people numerous chances to turn from their evil ways. In spite of their sinfulness, the LORD demonstrates His unmerited, free grace.

I am reminded to think about this.




We are thankful to God for providing the funds, working through the faithfulness of the members in giving to the work.


We thank God for each Truth AF'er, the sacrificial giving indeed is a great encouragement.
