How could a man who was so cowardly at Christ's death become a man so fearless for the cause of Christ? How could such a man be useful for Christ? These are just some of the lessons of sanctification that we would want to learn from these chief of the apostles, and apply them into our lives, that we can transform ourselves into a useful and fearless servant for the Lord Jesus Christ too!

I bid you all to have a great time of learning about this ordinary man made extraordinary by God's grace through the vessel that is Rev Dr Prabhudas Koshy and also a warm time of fellowship between the brethren from the various churches!

Slow Down and Examine Your Life

“Thus saith the LORD of hosts; Consider your ways.”

Haggai 1:5

When a traveller passes rapidly through a country, the eye has no time to rest on the different objects in that country. So when he comes to the end of his journey, no distinct impressions have been made on his mind. He has only a confused notion of the country through which he has travelled.

This explains how it is that death, judgment, and eternity make so little impression on most men's mind. Most people never stop to think, but hurry on through life and find themselves in eternity before they have asked, “What must I do to be saved?” More souls are lost through want of consideration than in any other way. The reason why men are not awakened and made anxious concerning their souls is that the Devil never gives them time to consider. Therefore, God cries, “Stop, poor sinner, stop and think. Consider your ways.”

In the same way, the Devil tries to make the children of God doubt if there is a Providence. He hurries them away to the shop and market. “Lose no time,” he says, “but make money.” Therefore, Jesus says, “Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns.... Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin” (Matt. 6:26, 28).

The Devil tries to make the children of God live uncomfortable and unholy lives. He beguiles them away from simply looking to Jesus; he hurries them away to look at a thousand other things, as he led Peter, walking on the sea, to look at the waves. But God says, “Look here. Look unto me, and be saved. Run your race, looking unto Jesus only. Stop filling your days with haste and endless activity. Let Christ give you rest and fullness of life.”

When Tempted, Stand Firm

“For in that he himself hath suffered being tempted, he is able to succour them that are tempted.” Hebrews 2:18

All believers are a tempted people. Every day they have trails; every time is to them a time of need. The unconverted are little tempted. They don't feel temptations rising in their hearts, nor do they know Satan's power. Before conversion, a man believes as little in the Devil as he believes in Christ. But when a man comes to Christ, he becomes a tempted soul.

God at times brings His child into a situation where faith will be tried. Sometimes He exalts him to see if he will turn proud and forget Him. Sometimes He brings him low to see if he will murmur against God. Blessed is the man who endures temptations. Sometimes God brings people into a strait, where the trial is, to see whether they will believe in Him alone or trust in flesh and blood.

The world tempts a child of God. It watches for missteps. It loves nothing more than to see a child of God fall into sin; it soothes the world's conscience to think that all are equally bad.

The heart of God's children is a fountain of temptation. Sometimes it says, "What harm is there in that? It is a little sin," or "I will just sin this once and never again," or "I will repent afterward and be saved."

Satan hurls his fiery darts. He terrifies God's children away from Christ, disturbs them during prayer, fills their mind with blasphemies, and hounds the world against them.

Believers, you are a tempted people. You are always poor and needy. And God intends it should be so, to give you constant reasons to go to Jesus.

God Helps Us Withstand Temptation

“The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations.”

2 Peter 2:9

I have no doubt that Noah often said, “I fear that I, too, will be carried away by the flood. I fear my faith will fail me. I don’t know what to do.” And Lot often trembled in Sodom, as did David when Saul pursued him.

Many of you don’t know how to deliver yourselves. You are surrounded as with a flood: old companions, old lusts, a hating world, a roaring lion. Man doesn’t know how to deliver you. Nothing is more vain than the help of man during an hour of temptation.

The Lord knows. More is meant that these mere words imply. The Lord not only knows how to do it but will certainly deliver the godly out of temptation. He loves them. Every godly person is a jewel in His sight. He died for them, and He will not lose one. When He puts them into the furnace, He sits as a refiner. He has promised to stand beside you always: “He will not leave you nor forsake you” (Deut.31:8).

It matters not what the temptation is, but how great the temptation is, and how weak the believing soul is. Some children of God say sometimes, “If it were a lesser trial, I could bear it. If the furnace were not so hot, if the temptation were not so great, I could get through.” or “If only I had more strength, if I were an older and more experienced believer.” Look at these words: “The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations.” Is anything too hard for the Lord?
