

Rooted To Fruit MEET - THE - SENIORS

"The branch cannot bear fruit of itself." (John 15:4)

How did you begin to bear fruit? It was when you came to Jesus and cast yourselves on His great atonement, and rested on His finished righteousness. Ah! what fruit you had then! Do you remember those early days? Then indeed the vine flourished, the tender grape appeared, the pomegranates budded forth, and the beds of spices gave forth their smell. Have you declined since then? If you have, we charge you to remember that time of love, and repent, and do thy first works.

Be most in those engagements which you have experimentally proved to draw you nearest to Christ, because it is from Him that all your fruits proceed. Any holy exercise which will bring you to Him will help you to bear fruit. The sun is, no doubt, a great worker in fruit-creating among the trees of the orchard: and Jesus is still more so among the trees of His garden of grace.

When have you been the most fruitless? Some of us have been taught that we have nothing out of Christ, by terrible abasements of heart before the Lord; and when we have seen the utter barrenness and death of all creature power, we have cried in anguish, "From Him all my fruit must be found, for no fruit can ever come from me."

We are taught, by past experience, that the more simply we depend upon the grace of God in Christ, and wait upon the Holy Spirit, the more we shall bring forth fruit unto God. Oh! to trust lesus for fruit as well as for life.

Let nothing keep thee from that hallowed intercourse, which is the choice privilege of a soul wedded to THE WELL-BELOVED. Be not content with an interview now and then, but seek always to retain His company, for only in His presence hast thou either comfort or safety. Jesus should not be unto us a friend who calls upon us now and then, but one with whom we walk evermore.

Thou hast a difficult road before thee: see, O traveller to heaven, that thou go not without thy guide. Thou hast to pass through the fiery furnace; enter it not unless, like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, thou hast the Son of God to be thy companion. Thou hast to storm the Jericho of thine own corruptions: attempt not the warfare until, like Joshua, thou hast seen the Captain of the Lord's host, with His sword drawn in His hand.

Thou art to meet the Esau of thy many temptations: meet him not until at Jabbok's brook thou hast laid hold upon the angel, and prevailed. In every case, in every condition, thou wilt need Jesus; but most of all, when the iron gates of death shall open to thee. Keep thou close to thy soul's Husband, lean thy head upon His bosom, ask to be refreshed with the spiced wine of His pomegranate, and thou shalt be found of Him at the last, without spot, or wrinkle, or any such thing. 
HOW IS YOUR WITNESS? (Phil 1:27-30)

- **3)** (i) "Expect great things from God, attempt great things for God." William Carey. When the football team played with the objective of glorifying God, God blessed them with good results. When we study/work or do, do we do it for God's glory or for our own glory? What will prove that we are studying (or doing something) for God's glory? Is glorifying God an afterthought or an aim before we do anything?
- (ii) Coach Taylor gives a speech to the football team, emphasizing the importance of honoring God in everything we do. Are we honoring God in our studies, our CCAs, at our workplace, at home, in church and everywhere else? Give examples.
- **4)** (i) Coach Taylor was facing many trials in his life. He questions why God must be so unfair. Have you felt the same?

- **6)** (i) Mr Bridges told the story about the farmers. When we pray, do we truly believe that God will answer our prayers? Consider the cursing of the fig tree in Mark 11:12-14, 20-24. Share with your group about the times when God had answered your prayers.
- (ii) Are we like the farmer who prepared his fields for the rain? i.e. are we doing our human responsibility when we seek God in supplication?
- **7)** Do we share the gospel with those around us? If not, why? Do we fear what others think of us? Are we embarrassed to be Christians?


