

## Day 2 (28 June 2013)

### Quiet Time (Morning)

#### The Unchangeable Christ

*Christ, the same yesterday, and today, and for ever.* (Heb 13:8)

Jesus Christ is God manifested in human flesh. He was "found in fashion as a man," as Paul puts it to the Philippians (2:8). He is no mere creature of time, subject to all the limitations and changes that time brings.

True, His human nature was created in time, but it never existed except in union with the eternal Son of God. He is not a victim of the ravages of time. He does not grow old and weak. He does not change in His person, perfections, or purposes.

He cannot change because He is God who says, "I am the LORD, I change not" (Malachi 3:6). He has no need to change. He is altogether perfect. He cannot be improved in any way and so any change would mark a decline from divine perfection, which is impossible. He cannot be made to change, for there is no power in all creation that can victimize or overcome Him.

There is wonderful comfort in all this for the believer. Our Lord and Saviour is the same in Himself. He will always be "this same Jesus," the One who loved us and gave Himself for us, who has called us to Himself and reconciled us to God. His gospel never changes. The opinions of men change, but His truth stands forever. It is as true and as truly relevant today as it was when He first gave it. His love and grace never change. He never changes in His actions for us as our prophet, priest, and king. Earthly pastors come and go, but He lives forever. His power has never diminished, His promises have never altered, and He will never deviate from His purpose to bring His redeemed to glory.

We can face today and every day with confidence. Circumstances change. Friends change. But our Saviour remains constant: He is the unchangeable Christ.

### **Discussion 3:**

### **Discussion 4:**

1) How well stocked is your treasury of your knowledge of God's Word? Do you think you are sufficiently equipped in the Word of God to be able to share your faith with unbelievers around you, and to encourage and instruct fellow believers? If not, how do you plan to better prepare yourself?

2) Is it possible to be a Christian but yet do not have a treasury from which we bring forth things? In other words, it is possible to call yourself a Christian but yet never witness and testify for the Lord, and do nothing at all to edify the people around you? Are you such a person, or do you know such people around you?

### Quiet Time (Morning)

#### The Preciousness of Christ

*Unto you therefore which believe he is precious.*

(1 Pet 2:7)

This is the language of love and experience, the rapture of a soul that has proved the worth of the Lord Jesus Christ. In penning these words, Peter must have had many precious memories of Him. He could recall every feature of his Beloved, he could remember the matchless tones of His voice and the tender strength of the hands that had lifted him as he sank in the waters of the Sea of Galilee. But Peter went further than isolating certain features of the Saviour as precious. He said, "*He* is precious." Every redeemed soul confesses this; every believer knows it from personal experience. This old hymn chorus expresses our testimony:

What though the world its gifts deny,  
I've riches more than gold can buy,  
The key to treasures in the sky.  
O bless the Lord, I've Jesus!

Everything about the Lord Jesus is precious.. His person is precious. He is the Lord Jehovah, God the Son, Creator of the universe, who possesses all perfections. And yet, without ceasing to be eternal God, He became man in order to be our Saviour. His blood is precious. He shed that blood in sacrifice for the remission of our sins, with complete success. Oh, how precious is Christ and His blood to us who have been redeemed! The gifts He gives are all precious. What glorious benefits does our precious Saviour bring to us! Peace with God, deliverance from the guilt of sin and the curse of the broken law, assurance of eternal life, and never-failing grace—these are just some of the precious gifts that the Lord Jesus gives to us. But more precious still is the Lord Himself. "*HE* is precious." Is this your testimony? Then let nothing of this world dim your love for Him. Live for Him and tell the world how precious He is.

To forsake Christ for the world, is to leave a treasure for a trifle;  
eternity for a moment, reality for a shadow;  
all things for nothing.
