Report of Church Gospel Night 2025

Thank God for our Church Gospel Night held on 28 June 2025 (Saturday) in the L3 Sanctuary.

The organising committee consisted of Dn Franco Wong (committee chairman), Rev and Mrs Dennis Kwok, Pr David Chew, Mrs Carine Chua, Mrs Sara Wong, Jodie Cheong, Ernest Kwok, Hadassah Chew, Michelle Lee, Thian Za Mawi, Timotheus Chua, and Wong En-Si.

The Gospel Night was held in English, with on-site Mandarin translation via headphones. Thank God for the 13 visitors who came. Together with our church members and their children, there was a total of 100 attendees. Thank God for giving them the desire to attend. As of 4 July 2025, the livestream garnered 113 views.



Rev Dennis, the meeting chairman, began the meeting at 7.30pm with a word of welcome and led the congregation in the singing of “How Great Thou Art!” After the opening prayer and the singing of another hymn, “As Pants the Hart for Cooling Streams,” Hung Chao Wei shared his testimony of salvation.



Chao Wei was brought up in a non-Christian home. By God’s providence, he met a friend in the army who shared the Gospel with him. He began going to church but struggled to attend regularly due to both external and internal pressures. During one Sunset Gospel Hour, God convicted His heart of his sins and his wretched life. That day, he surrendered his life to Christ.

However, he continued to live for the things of the world, and life remained largely unchanged. It was only much later that a message based on Romans 12:1-2 convicted him to wholeheartedly follow Christ. From then on, he walked closer with Jesus and experienced God guiding him each step of the way.

After Chao Wei’s sharing, the church choir presented a song item, “I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say.” This was followed by congregational singing of “Jesus, Thou Joy of Loving Hearts” and the reading of John 4:5-14.



Rev Samuel Joseph then preached on the topic “Can Man Never Thirst Again?” The message focused on “Our Great Need” and “Our Great Saviour.” “Our Great Need” referenced how the Samaritan woman (John 4) at the well needed physical water, but her life was also thirsting for communion with the Saviour. It was a thirst for forgiveness and reconciliation with God. We too thirst and long for things to satisfy us on earth. However, only “Our Great Saviour” can fill this void. While the woman was sceptical of Christ’s ability to assuage her thirst, He showed her that she could not save herself. In the same vein, only He can satisfy all the requirements of God and take away our guilt, sin and death. He has paid it all through His perfect life, His death on the cross, and His triumphant rise from the grave. Thus, the only way by which man can satiate the thirst in his soul is through Jesus Christ alone.



The Gospel Night ended with the hymn “Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken,” a closing prayer and announcements. All then proceeded down to the fellowship hall where Jodie and her team had prepared a spread of refreshments. Sara and Ernest set up a resource table where Bibles, tracts and books were made available for those interested. Counsellors from each of the fellowship groups were paired to the various visitors, engaging them in discussion about the Gospel and the message they had just heard.

Thank God for the many who came, and the many who served. May He work in the hearts of the unsaved hearers that they might come to know Him in His own good time.
