Report of Missions Trip to Cambodia (19 to 23 Dec 2025)

We thank God for the privilege to serve the Lord in Cambodia. Our missions team comprised Rev and Mrs Dennis Kwok, Car Vincent, Thian, Charissa Kwok, and myself. Our objectives were to:

1. Rejoice with True Gospel BPC's brethren on their 18th Anniversary.
2. Organise a Youth Gospel Meeting, Combined Sunday School, and a Christmas Service.
3. Visit Agape BPC and Lively Hope BPC in Sihanoukville.
4. Encourage Cambodian preachers, families, and church members.

Day 1 (Friday)

We departed from the airport at 5:30 pm, despite my initial flight on another airline being scheduled for 3:30 pm. By God's providence, my flight was delayed, so we all ended up on the same flight timing at 5:30 pm. We arrived safely at Cambodia new international airport about two hours later. After collecting our luggage and boxes, we discovered that one of the bags containing donations for the churches was missing. The airport staff suggested it might have been taken by another group with a lot of luggage before us. We waited patiently, but unfortunately, the luggage was never found. Nevertheless, we thank God that the important items like the speaker, hymn books and missions journals were intact. Pr Sopheak then received us warmly and we took a hired van to go to Kampot. We reached Kampot around 10 pm and had our first night devotion.

Day 3 (Sunday)

We arrived early in church at 7:30 am for Sunday school. About 25 children attended. Thian led in singspiration with three songs: “Sweet Peace, the Gift of God’s Love,” “I Have Decided to follow Jesus,” and “For God So Loved the World” while Caius played the portasound. Yee Min then gave a message on “Jesus, the Prince of Peace” (Isaiah 7:14). This was especially relevant in the ongoing border conflict between Thailand and Cambodia at that time and God’s Word pointed to the Only Peace-Giver for our souls who is Jesus Christ our Lord. Afterward, Car led in an activity where children worked in teams to bring cups from one side to another to teach them the importance of unity and peace in the church for more effective service to the Lord.

Thian led the singing, Caius played the piano and Car delivered the gospel message on "Jesus Is The Only Way" (John 14:6).

After the program, we spoke to two boys aged 16 and 17 who could speak English fluently and thank God they already professed to believe in Jesus and have been attending Sunday church worship services.

Day 5 (Tuesday)

Pr John, Lydia and Melissa fetched us at 4am so that we could reach the airport on time for our flight at 9.30am. The rest of the team departed at 9.30am, while I stayed back in Cambodia as I had a separate flight that took off at 9:30 pm. Thank God for Pr John and family who accompanied me for half a day before leaving for Phnom Penh to fetch Jonathan who started his school holidays. I arrived in Singapore at 12 am safely.

We embarked on a 3-hour journey to Sihanoukville, driven by Pr Rotha accompanied by his 2 older daughters. Along the way, we visited Pr Bun Kouy and family in Agape BP Church @ 80-roofs village to see their newly renovated place of worship which will be inaugurated in January 2026.
