Testimony (Abel Tam)



The churches in urban Sihanoukville and the rural 80-Roofs Village face their own attacks from Satan as he tries to thwart the spread of the gospel.

Amenities in the village tend to be very far away and inconvenient to find. Many struggle to provide for their daily necessities, working long hours every day to provide for their physical needs.

In urban Sihanoukville, the ground on which the seeds of the gospel are sown is very hard. It has truly become a "sin city" – rife with casinos and vices and its people enjoying the lusts of the flesh, disregarding their need for a Saviour.

Despite these spiritual and physical challenges, God continues to strengthen and protect His own. Many still set aside time from work to attend church and worship God on the Lord's Day, and to serve God in their own ways, such as preparing refreshments. Some may be more needy, but they learn to truly trust in God to provide for them, just like the widow who gave of her 2 mites. Those who have shown to value their spiritual needs over their physical needs, even in poverty, really put us to shame and call for us to reflect on our own walk with God. Amidst the carnality and wickedness in Sihanoukville, I have seen those who have chosen to live godly and spiritual lives both in and outside of the church.

Their struggles are very real. Thank God for enabling the preachers to lead their congregations in the strait and narrow way. Besides seeing God's mighty work, I now also understand their needs in a real way and can pray for them more effectively. I hope that many more can visit Kampot and Sihanoukville, to better pray and support their ministries, so that many souls can come to know Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Saviour.
