

Paul was a cosmopolitan,
a Jew by race; a Roman citizen
by birth, born in Tarsus, a Greek
By religion; first a Hebrew,
Even a narrow fanatical
Pharisee, persecuting all
Christians. Then converted to
(over)

Christianity. He traveled extensively.
He was the first and covenant ^{of}
both Jews and Gentiles. He was
not only a ~~Jew~~ ^{Jewish} and a Roman
Citizen, but he also lived in both
the spiritual and material worlds.
Paul had dreams, visions and practical
experiences that gave him counsel

Paul was a tent maker by trade
A teacher, a preacher and
a great religious reformer,
a missionary to the Jews and
Gentiles,
Justification by faith,

of being. He talked with Jesus after
the ascension. The fourth dimension
or "place" in the heaven, where
Jesus is, was revealed to Paul.
Jesus "stood by" him at night and
assured him that he should
bear witness to the truth in
Rome. Paul was often inspired

by the Spirit in his writings; on
the other hand he had an intellectual
understanding of truth that
impinged upon spirit and
understanding.

In the light of modern
metaphysics we see that Paul
was a Christian philosopher.

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He saw Jesus in his psychic body
and talked with him in the
Hebrew language. Paul did
not develop the Christ within,
yet he caught glimpses of it.
He said "Christ in you the
hope of glory." "Let Christ
be formed in you." But he

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himself failed to put on Christ
as Jesus did. Christ ^{was} the
indwelling life and intelligence
of Jesus. Jesus called the Christ
Father. "The Father within me he
doeth the works." "I know the
development of the Father as

his body from the tomb. He ⁷
proclaimed the indwelling life
until it vitalized the electrons
of his body and made it a
perpetual dwelling place for
his soul. Paul did not
accomplish this, because
Christ was to him an

external entity instead of an ⁸
indwelling life and intelligence.
So Paul died and his body went
to corruption. In this respect
he fell short of attaining the
full round Christian character.
Since his death in Rome
Paul has incarnated many

times, not yet having attained
the power to overcome death.
This shows that the victory over
the last enemy, which Paul saw as
a possibility, ~~is~~ requires very
great spiritual power. The
popular ~~belief~~ idea that Paul
and the other many saints

Christians, went to heaven's
death, and are ^{at the} ~~right hand of God~~
right hand of God in glory, is
not borne out by the facts.
The fact is that not one
of the human ^{except Jesus} ~~race~~ has yet
overcome death, consequently
not one has yet entered into
