Russell A. Kemp

Russell Alger Kemp, 92, of Pacific Grove, a retired clergyman, died Saturday at Community Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula after an illness.

He was born April 26, 1894, in Grand Haven, Mich., and had lived in Pacific Grove since 1962, moving from Modesto where he had lived since 1956.

He was ordained a minister in 1949 by the Unity School of Christianity in Missouri, and was involved in church work for a total of 50 years. He retired in 1984. His last ministry before retirement was at the Unity Truth Church of Monterey, where he started in February 1962.

He served in the Canadian military as a young man, and was a minister at the Unity Assembly of Jesus Christ Church in Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada, and also was in Regina, Saskatchewan, Canada, and in Syracuse, N.Y., from 1948 to 1956.

Over the years he was a guest speaker in many cities, and in the 1970s and '80s his articles and poems were published in the Unity and Daily Word magazines. He also wrote a book, "Live Youthfully Now," published in 1969 by Unity School of Christianity.

He is survived by his wife, Dorothy.

Memorial services will be held Saturday at 2 p.m. in the Paul Mortuary chapel in Pacific Grove. Cremation will be at the Little Chapel by-the-Sea, with inurnment in El Carmelo Cemetery in Pacific Grove.

The family suggests memorial contributions to the donor's favorite charity.
