We have conceived of CONTACT being a number of things. From time-to-time we have hoped that we might have contributions that would be a source of encouragement and blessing to you. The following contribution is shared with the thought that it might have special significance to many of us. I only wish that the author had divulged his name so that we might give proper credit. I only know that the writer's letter was postmarked from San Jose, California.

We, in Unity, are wondering why the movement isn't growing as rapidly as it should. We have so much to offer the world but the world is not beating a path to our Centers. Why not?

My opinion is, along with Catherine Ponder's article in August's "Unity", that we Truth students are not balancing the mental with the heart. The heart is the center of that divine spark, warmth, compassion, tenderness—a Christ love for all.

Even Charles Fillmore wrote in "Truth Demonstrates Itself":

"Many people are deluded by cramming the intellect with lessons on Truth. One Truth statement understood and demonstrated in life is worth more than many lessons and statements about Truth."

Leslie Weatherhead in "Psychology, Religion, and Healing":

"In an ideal church there exists a central group of people, with a warm experience of God in their own hearts and a capacity and will-ingness to receive every person into such a real fellowship that the love of God is meditated through loving persons to the soul of each.

Most people require a constant supply of appreciation for their mental health and happiness. If they cannot get it at home, the church should help at this point.

There can be no more integrating factor in personality, more powerful or more socially valuable than a sense of the love of God, flowing into human hearts, both directly from Him and through His other lovers in the fellowship of the church, and then out to the starved lives of others whom men come to love for His sake and whom they seek to serve in His name."

David Seabury wrote in "High Hopes for Low Spirits":

"We must find a way to make that warm "feeling" contact with the Creative Center within (our Christ within) to receive the universal energy and power. 'Contact' is a state of touching."

In my prayer work this is what I have been using (with very wonderful results):

Remember, dear one, prayer does not change God; He is unchangeable. Prayer does, however, change people, making them receptive to His good which is without limit! All we need do is claim it--for ourselves or for our dear ones. But first we must make that warm, "feeling" contact with our Christ within. How do we do this?

Turn to the inmost depths of your heart. He is there. Touch Him. Touch Him with your soul....as you do, His radiant love (for God is love) flows through your heart, spilling over into every atom and cell in your body. It flows in and through your mind. In this warm contact, every good word and thought connects the heart and mind with the very powers of the Universe, God!

In this powerful current, claim the good you desire. See it already manifested in your life. Feel the joy of having it. Hold on to this image and feeling, never letting go, always thanking God for it even though it may yet be in the invisible. It will come into the visible, sooner or later, depending on the closeness of your contact with Him and on the consistency of keeping that current of Power flowing steadily.

There is one more thing we must do--listen for His guidance. It will come as an idea, an inspiration, an impulse, or an urge. You will know it comes from Him by that very "right" feeling about it. Express this feeling. As you do, everything will fall into place, easily and perfectly with scarcely any effort on your part, for "The Father within me does His works."

Our young people are the hope of Unity. They know how to connect heart and mind, they are feeling, vibrant, compassionate! Oh, let us not turn them away with our clinging to the "status quo", the keeping of the organization intact, the deluge of "triplicate copies"—they are close to nature, to God—they are simple, natural, and honest. If we in our middle years can not bend, then our only hope is in our youth—unless the mental coldness turns them away! I have heard one of our brilliant, talented young men say "I am leaving Unity, because of the regimentation, the organization, the paper work." I answered him that we must not leave Unity, not yet, it is a wonderful channel for His work, His compassion, His love—it is up to him and me, and all those others who feel the need of warmth and humanity in our everyday contacts to promote this "feeling and love" that each soul needs desperately.

How do you feel about it? Organization man or a man of God?

YOUTH EDUCATION MANUAL

The manual will be the basis for leadership training seminars being conducted this year by Dan. We are seeking to train persons whose prime responsibility is to train teachers. This will give each center, and certainly each region, trained persons to carry on a regular follow-up training program after seminars conducted by Dan.

Greater emphasis could be offered by the opportunity for your students to listen again in the privacy of their own homes to their copy of the tapes. We would be more than happy to make available copies of the Convention program for you to distribute among those participating. This could be an added incentive to greater participation in your presentation of Unity International Convention--1970. Not only could this add broader scope to your ministry, but it can be very meaningful in offering a new dimension, a unifying dimension to the whole of our Unity ministry.
