We are especially grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Olin Berry (our own Alma Redfern and her new husband) for inviting us, first to their lovely apartment in San Francisco, and then on to their vacation boathouse in Tiburon. There the magnificent view of the bay and the city, plus the sunset and coming on of the lights of the city, seemed to bring us together in even a greater sense of Unity. We are a happy family of ministers in Northern California!"

SOUTHEASTERN REGION

Paul Barrett reporting: The *Unity of the Palm Beaches* is busy with three new activities. First, there has been a growing interest in the film strip series of Chardin's "The Phenomenon of Man." The film

has been shown at various times for members of the church and to the public. The public was invited by inserting an ad in the local newspaper and it drew fifty-five persons to the sessions. A group of Catholic Sisters and Priests also requested a showing. This enthusiasm in Chardin's work is prompting the church to offer to show the series to any interested group as a valuable vehicle of outreach to the whole community.

"Psycho-cybernetics" continues to attract large classes. The class is presently being taught by Mrs. Billie

Blaine. Mrs. Blaine received her teacher training in Sacramento from Phil and Dorothy Pierson.

The newest innovation of Hal Rosencrans is the establishing of a Bio-Feedback Laboratory. Thirty interested individuals have signed up for a twelve-week course in experimenting with three electronic instruments for measuring depth meditation and relaxation. The students come to the laboratory two or three times a week for practice sessions and meet once a week as a group to share their experiences. The students are reporting favorable, interesting, and profitable experiences.

Unity Christ Church of St. Petersburg is the newest of our Unity ministries. It has sprung up out of the need for expansion and growth of the Unity work in St. Petersburg. The new church is moving forward under the leadership of Paul C. Barrett, assisted by his wife Terri. They are presently meeting in a 750 seat Seventh Day Adventist Church facility. A building program is under way to provide their own facilities as soon as monetary provision is adequate.

Paul and Terri report that the "response to this new ministry has been tremendous. It has proved the need for such a move in the St. Petersburg area, and is indicative that Unity, now with three ministries in St. Petersburg, will continue to flourish and grow." For the past two years the ministerial students have been conducting services at the Holmesdale Convalescent Home in Kansas City. These services are held on the second Sunday of each month. Mrs. Rodgers,

the occupational therapist in charge of the patients, tells us that the patients look forward with great anticipation to the Sundays that UNITY holds the service. She added that the "patients are so greatly helped."

A second-year student is given the responsibility for assignments for these meetings. During this year Roy Fox, of the Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania ministry, has been in charge. George Reiger, of the Philadelphia, Pennsylvania ministry, will take over for Roy.

Anywhere from twenty to forty ambulatory patients attend each service, participating as best they can. They love to sing. Additional ministerial students attend to lead in the singing, and to provide special musical programs.

STUDENTS CONDUCT MINISTRY AT JACKSON COUNTY JAIL

The Jackson County Jail in Kansas City, Missouri, has been going through some big changes lately. S.M.R.S. students have been involved in these constructive changes. Chris Morgan, a first-year student from Toronto, Ontario, Canada, who does volunteer pastoral

work under the direction of the jail chaplain, has informed us that Unity was invited to conduct its first Sunday service in March of this year. John Sherman, from the Seattle, Washington ministry, presented the message. Chris Morgan did the meditation and Conrad Stahl, originally from the ministry in Wichita, Kansas, provided the music. The Jackson County Jail houses 384 men at the present time, and some of them are now requesting Unity literature. Silent Unity also recently received a request from an inmate there for a visit from a Unity minister,

There is another activity in the continuing effort to involve the ministerial students in an experiential type of program relating to their future ministries.

FACULTY MEMBERS JOIN THEOLOGICAL SOCIETY

At the invitation of Phil White, Bible instructor in S.M.R.S., Bill Fischer and Nick Griffin recently joined the Kansas City Society for Theological Studies. Phil has been a member for



FIELD INTERVIEWS FOR PROSPECTIVE SMRS STUDENTS

William L. Fischer, Director of Ministerial Education for the AUC, is currently making a series of trips into the field for the purpose of interviewing and testing persons who are seriously

interested in applying for admission to the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies. During the week of January 22, Bill was in California, where extensive interviewing was conducted in Los Angeles and San Francisco. The week of February 12 will be spent doing the same thing on the East Coast, with visits to Virginia Beach, Washington, D.C., Baltimore, Philadelphia and New York. A similar trip is now being planned for the Seattle area. In the past these trips have proved beneficial in two ways: First, such trips have produced some excellent ministerial students, some of which are now serving quite successfully in the Unity field ministry. Secondly, they are of benefit to the applying students, since it saves them the expense of a trip to Unity Village for tests and interviews. If your area has a sufficient number of interested students to justify the expense of a trip there, please contact the Administration Office of SMRS.

REQUIRED READING COURSE FOR APPLYING STUDENTS

In our continuing effort to upgrade the standards of the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies, it has been felt that every student applying for admission to SMRS should be well-read in

what Unity teaches. Therefore, a Required Reading Course has been compiled, and each applying student is asked to read the books in the course prior to admission. The list includes the following books: "LESSONS IN TRUTH," "CHRISTIAN HEALING," "THE STORY OF UNITY," "KNOW THYSELF," "WHAT ARE YOU?", "TALKS ON TRUTH," "DISCOVER THE POWER WITHIN YOU," "PROSPERITY," "THE UNITY WAY OF LIFE," "BE YE TRANSFORMED," and "YOUR HOPE OF GLORY." It is felt that, if any student has read these books along with his classwork in a Unity ministry, he should have the basic knowledge of Unity he needs to begin his course of ministerial study.

INTENSIVE SEMINAR PLANNED FOR STUDIES IN BLACK CULTURE AND COMMUNITY

A special intensive seminar entitled "PROFILES IN BLACK" is being planned to be conducted from April 30 through May 2. Gordon T. Vivens, associate minister of the Detroit Unity Association, is in charge of this seminar. He will be assisted by

Phyliss Warren, a professional musician, who is a vital part of the congregation of Detroit Unity. She is active as a part of the musical staff of the temple, as well as being involved in other aspects of the ministry there. This seminar will deal specifically with how our ministerial students will deal with unique aspects of the black community. Current SMRS plans call for regularly-scheduled seminars of this type in order to better prepare our new ministers for working with all segments of our society. Further details of this seminar will be forthcoming in a future issue of CONTACT.

VITAL INTENSIVE SEMINAR CONDUCTED FOR SMRS STUDENTS

During the week of February 12, a tremendously important intensive seminar was conducted in the ministerial school. The title of this seminar was: "CONTEMPORARY

CHALLENGES IN CONDUCTING A MODERN UNITY MINISTRY." It was conducted by Grover Thornsberry and Dorothy Pierson, President and Vice-President of the Association of Unity Churches. Both of these progressive, successful ministers were able to draw on long years of experience in the ministry in presenting important ideas. The subjects covered were: "The AUC Charter, Bylaws and Code of Ethics," "Center Operation — Minister and Board," "What it means to be a Minister," "Counseling," and an opportunity for questions and answers. We are grateful to both Grover and Dorothy for giving of their valuable time to spend this week with the ministerial students.

We are especially grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Olin Berry (our own Alma Redfern and her new husband) for inviting us, first to their lovely apartment in San Francisco, and then on to their vacation boathouse in Tiburon. There the magnificent view of the bay and the city, plus the sunset and coming on of the lights of the city, seemed to bring us together in even a greater sense of Unity. We are a happy family of ministers in Northern California!"

SOUTHEASTERN REGION

Paul Barrett reporting: The *Unity of the Palm Beaches* is busy with three new activities. First, there has been a growing interest in the film strip series of Chardin's "The Phenomenon of Man." The film

has been shown at various times for members of the church and to the public. The public was invited by inserting an ad in the local newspaper and it drew fifty-five persons to the sessions. A group of Catholic Sisters and Priests also requested a showing. This enthusiasm in Chardin's work is prompting the church to offer to show the series to any interested group as a valuable vehicle of outreach to the whole community.

"Psycho-cybernetics" continues to attract large classes. The class is presently being taught by Mrs. Billie Blaine. Mrs. Blaine received her teacher training in Sacramento from Phil and Dorothy Pierson.

The newest innovation of Hal Rosencrans is the establishing of a Bio-Feedback Laboratory. Thirty interested individuals have signed up for a twelve-week course in experimenting with three electronic instruments for measuring depth meditation and relaxation. The students come to the laboratory two or three times a week for practice sessions and meet once a week as a group to share their experiences. The students are reporting favorable, interesting, and profitable experiences.

Unity Christ Church of St. Petersburg is the newest of our Unity ministries. It has sprung up out of the need for expansion and growth of the Unity work in St. Petersburg. The new church is moving forward under the leadership of Paul C. Barrett, assisted by his wife Terri. They are presently meeting in a 750 seat Seventh Day Adventist Church facility. 
