



# DECEMBER 2, 1973 PROCLAIMED AS A DAY OF PRAYER AND REDEDICATION IN THE SPIRIT OF THE DEDICATION AND COVENANT SIGNED BY CHARLES AND MYRTLE FILLMORE

In December of 1892, Charles and Myrtle Fillmore, husband and wife, put in writing their deepest feelings about their missions and goals in life. They wrote their "Dedication and Covenant" (shown in the reproduction to the right) as a graphic dedication of their total commitment to the work of the Spirit of Truth as expressed through the Society of Silent Unity.



This document remained unknown to anyone for fifty years until it was discovered among some papers by a worker in the Unity Library in 1942. It certainly is a stirring statement of dedication made by two of God's wonderful and beloved children. May each one of us feel, in our own life, the inspiration expressed by Charles and Myrtle Fillmore in their "Dedication and Covenant".

The President of the AUC, acting upon a recommendation from the Expansion Committee, has proclaimed the first Sunday in December 1973 as a special day of prayer and rededication in the spirit of the above Dedication and Covenant. Unity ministries throughout the world will be uniting in prayer to observe this day. We know that each Unity ministry will keep this day in the spirit of our true unity which is love for the message we teach and love for each other.

#### **REGIONAL NEWS**

Featured were Unity speakers William L. Fischer, Director of Ministerial Education for the AUC; Donald O'Connor, Unity Christ Church, St. Louis, Missouri; May Rowland, former Director of Silent Unity; Ernest Wilson, Unity on the Plaza, Kansas City, Missouri; Charles Roth, Unity Truth Center, Indianapolis, Indiana; Sig and Jane

Paulson, Unity Village Chapel, Unity Village, Missouri; and, Donald Curtis, Unity Church of Dallas, Dallas, Texas. Chuck Kisner and his accompanist, Rose Parenti, musical artists from Los Angeles, California, presented a message of Truth through music. David also reported the observance in August of the FOURTIETH ANNIVERSARY of the Unity work in Springfield.

Such seminars will enable the instructors of an Extension Course to fulfill the teaching prerequisites of the Extension Program. The Extension Program, conducted jointly by the Unity Institute for Continuing Education and the AUC, allows Unity students to receive U.I.C.E. credit for classes taken in the local ministry.

Edd Dawson, minister of Unity Center of Medford and newly elected Secretary of the Northwest Region, shared the following report on the seminar in Bellingham: "We were treated to the ideas and personalities of Jack Barker from Cincinnati, Ohio, and our own Kay Arndt from Bellevue, Washington.

"Jack teamed with Kay to present the first day-long intensive workshop on The Dynamics of Teaching. A consciousness of love and sharing keynoted the day's success. An unbelievable amount of information was made available, much as a banquet feast, and everyone agreed it was fit for a king or queen. Without reservation, the Regional Conference Body endorsed the establishment of the Post-Graduate Plan and the presentation.


#### **REGIONAL NEWS Continued**

#### "THE AUC PRESIDENT SERVING YOU"

- With Ideas to Share -

During my tenure as President, I plan to attend each of the regional conferences. This will afford me the wonderful opportunity to meet and visit with many of you, and to be in a position to receive many interesting ideas. Ideas which may be shared with you. For example, during Convention '73 I asked Elizabeth Sand Turner for her opinion on the subject of "speaking in tongues". Elizabeth replied by letter, "I am glad to write you and give you references to Paul's statements in regard to 'speaking in tongues'—see I Cor. 14. Practically the whole of this chapter is devoted to a contrast between the desirability of 'prophesying' (by which Paul means preaching and teaching) and the undesirability of speaking in tongues, especially in public. Do you have a copy of the Abingdon Bible Commentary (1 Vol.)? It is an excellent reference book and the comments on 1 Cor. 14 are very good (pages 1188-1190). There are only 3 short incidences mentioned in the Bible; Acts 2:4, 10:46, and 19:6." I have a great respect for Elizabeth Sand Turner and since the subject of glossolalia is current, perhaps these references will be enlightening to you. They were to me.

In September I was privileged to be guest speaker in Indianapolis, Indiana. Charles and Betty Roth have done, and are continuing to do, such a great work in that city! Charles is full of good ideas in regard to conducting a Unity ministry. His lesson sheets for many of our basic Unity books are simply great! Later in the month, I received an equally warm welcome as guest speaker in Portland, Oregon, where Les and Natalie Saunders and Gwen Norment function as a light-filled team. Continuing on up the coast, I attended the NORTHWEST MINISTERS' CONFERENCE in Bellingham, Washington. What a group of harmonious, working-together ministers in the Northwest region! The presentation of our Post-Graduate Credit Course was, for me, the highlight of the Conference. Jack Barker and Kay Arndt did a tremendously skillful job of presenting teaching ideas and methods to all those attending this initial presentation. ## AUC HEALING RALLY

The Association of Unity Churches is sponsoring a Healing Kally in San Francisco, California, on May 2-4, 1974. To be held at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel, the meetings will feature excellent Unity speakers, prominent persons in the field of healing, and include meditations and song sessions.

James Dillet Freeman, Director of Silent Unity, will be a featured speaker and will present the outstanding program of Unity's unfoldment as a movement that he did at the 1973 International Convention in Kansas City. This program includes many photographs of the Fillmores and was one of the highlights of our Convention '73. The members of your Executive Committee will also be on the program.

We are fortunate to have Dr. Carl Simonton scheduled to be with us to share his research of the effects of counseling and meditation on the healing of cancer. He has slides that will visibly show the tremendous healing work he and his staff have effected. Dr. Simonton will be presenting his work to the International Radiotherapy Conference in Honolulu, Hawaii, just prior to our meeting.

There will be a presentation by Apollo 14 astronaut Edgar Mitchell. During his talk he will show a film on healing that brings out many exciting aspects of our healing potential.

We have invited **Dr. Evarts Loomis**, a leader in the field of treating the Whole Man. We hope to be able to present a showing of a film recently made in Europe by Dr. Loomis. This film, developed jointly with the Charles and Myrtle Fillmore Foundation, features other doctors, such as **Dr. Paul Tournier**, who share Dr. Loomis' ideas on treating the Whole Man.

We have invited Mr. Larry Lewis to be with us also, but as yet have not received confirmation of his acceptance. Mr. Lewis is 106 years of age and has a health consciousness which allows him to run 6½ miles a day and to carry on a full and active life.

All in all, the Healing Rally will be full of insight, inspiration, joy, music, and prayer. A perfect combination to produce a healing consciousness in which we all may be renewed. You will want to be a part of this experience and enjoy the beauty and excitement of San Francisco as well!

Registration forms for the Healing Rally will be available in early November at all Unity ministries. Due to limited space available, we must of necessity place a restriction on the number of registrations. Therefore, you are urged to make your reservations early if you want to attend this very special Unity gathering.

#### A WORD FROM JACKIE NEAL, YOU COORDINATOR

I would like to thank you on behalf of the International Youth of Unity for your loving and prayerful support of the 1973 International YOU Conference, "In The Beginning . . . "It was a pleasure to witness this experience and to touch the concerns, ideas, and feelings of others through meaningful programs and times of sharing.

The 1973 YOU Conference ushered in a New Beginning for the Youth of Unity.

This year will involve the research of and planning for a Youth of Unity that is less complicated in its structure to enable our YOU to fulfill its primary purpose. That purpose is to provide our teenagers with the opportunity to learn the Truth of Unity through spiritual, educational, and fellowship experiences. A Research Committee has been selected and a special introduction will be given in the next issue of CONTACT. The work of the Research Committee will be based on your ideas, suggestions, and prayer support. The Committee began its work in September, and throughout the year its plans and progress will be reported to you in CONTACT. The committee consists of four YOUers, Elizabeth Bayless, Unity Village, Missouri; Russell Haak, Washington, D.C.; Lisa Jackson, Memphis, Tennessee; David Vetter, Santa Ana, California; two ministers, Gwen Norment, Portland, Oregon; and George Stone, Washington, D.C.; and me, Jacqueline Neal, your YOU Coordinator.

As you can see, this year is a very dynamic one for the YOU. Special guidelines have been in effect concerning International and Regional Officers' responsibilities and Regional Rallies. We hold to the idea that a Regional Rally be planned to provide the opportunity for YOUers to have a spiritual and fellowship experience.

Those ministries that are hosting Regional Rallies this year are encouraged to provide this experience through means, methods, and approaches that are meaningful and productive for them. The experience of the Rally then has its focal point in the ministry that is hosting the Rally. Brief Regional Rally guidelines will be sent to these ministries soon. If we may be of assistance in any way, please let us know.

BLUE CROSS and BLUE SHIELD Our Blue Cross and Blue Shield Plan became effective August 1, 1973. If you are not a member and desire to avail yourself and, if applicable, your family of this excellent group coverage, you may do so at any time. We request that you fill out a Blue Cross and Blue Shield Membership Application card and return the card and your check for the first month's coverage to the AUC office prior to the first of the month. After you are enrolled in the Plan, your payments must be received in the AUC office before the 21st of each month. For example, if you wish to enroll in the Plan effective November 1, you must fill out an application card and send it and your check for November's coverage to the AUC office in time to reach us before the 21st of October.

There are three different coverages available: Individual (\$16.81 per month), Family (\$45.30 per month), and the Medi-Care Tie-In Plan (\$8.51 per month).

If you already have Blue Cross and Blue Shield coverage, your present membership can be transferred. The AUC's Plan provides excellent coverage and, if your's is an Individual or Tie-In Plan, or you have more than one dependent, our Plan probably provides better benefits than your present coverage. For additional information, please contact your AUC office.

## SCHOOL FOR MINISTERIAL AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Since this year's Student Body is the largest ever enrolled in the history of Unity, we thought it appropriate to briefly review the history of the ministerial training in Unity.

Unity in 1946 felt the need for a more defined method of training its ministers than had previously been utilized. A ministerial training program was established at that time under the direction of James Dillet Freeman. Designed and structured as an "on the job" type of training program, the ministerial students were employed in Silent Unity and were allowed time from their jobs in order to attend the training classes. This type of program was conducted for approximately 20 years and provided the Unity movement with many fine and talented ministers.

The concept of training Unity Ministers, being viable, evolved in 1966 from the "on the job" training program to an actual ministerial school. David Williamson served as the first Director of Education for the newly established School for Ministerial and Religious Studies. Since the ministerial students were no longer employed in Silent Unity, a loan grant program was devised to provide financial assistance, and was operative for several years before being phased out. From 1966 through 1968 the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies was conducted and administered by employees of Unity School. In August 1968, William L. Fischer was hired as Director of Ministerial Education for the AUC. During Bill's first year in SMRS he served as a faculty member representing the AUC. In July 1969, however, the administrative responsibilities for SMRS were transferred from Unity School to the Association of Unity Churches.

The first year that SMRS was under direction of the AUC, the student body consisted of a total of 14 students. This year, in the 1973-74 student body, a total of 74 students are attending classes. The growth in the number of students enrolled is a direct result not only of the untiring efforts and dedication by all of the ministers, teachers, and staff of SMRS but also of a similar effort and commitment by you in the field. Throughout the years since AUC has assumed the responsibility for the training of ministers, those associated with SMRS have attempted to stay abreast of the most progressive, educational techniques available, and to apply such techniques wherever feasible in the ministerial education program. In order to assist the staff of the ministerial school in an advisory capacity, a Ministerial Education Advisory Committee was appointed by the AUC. This committee, comprised of experienced ministers in the field and of laymen with the qualifications of professional educators, has for the past five years worked with the Director of Ministerial Education. The committee has been invaluable in obtaining and submitting input and thereby assisting Bill in his continuing efforts to employ progressive and creative ideas.

The utilization of teacher aid equipment has become an important part of the growth oriented outlook which has kept SMRS moving forward. A video tape system is used in those classes where applicable and the effective utilization of both overhead and opaque projectors has greatly enhanced student interest in the material being presented. SMRS also has an electronic telephone amplification system whereby contact can be made by telephone with a minister in the field. This system enables a minister in the field to teach a class in SMRS direct from the minister's own study. The amplification system also has microphones which can be used in the classroom to allow students the opportunity to ask direct questions of the minister in the field. This is a live, dialogue type technique and offers an innovative approach to presenting "outside speakers" without having the speakers travel to Unity Village.

Ministerial education in the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies is an integration of deep personal experience and of learning the skills necessary to function as a progressive twentieth-century minister. Instilling the student with a deep sense of commitment to the Truth ministry is one of the most important parts of the experience aspect of being a student minister. The fact that such sense of commitment has been accepted by students is reflected in the field service record of the graduates. As of the summer of 1973, 92% of the graduates were functioning successfully as Unity ministers in the field.

We do not mean to imply in any way that we feel that SMRS is a finished product. As a school, SMRS is in its infancy. We are constantly on the alert for even better and more effective teaching techniques and school policies that will enable us to have not only the finest ministerial school in the New Thought Movement, but one that has the respect of the religious academic community in general.

The increase in interest among people to attend the School of Ministerial and Religious Studies indicates that Unity is at an exciting threshold of growth. The procedures utilized in the selection of students has made it possible for the most talented potential students available to have an opportunity of availing themselves of our ministerial education program and, accordingly, to serve God and mankind through the Unity ministry.
