

REGIONAL NEWS

Angelo Giordani reporting for the EASTERN REGION: WASHINGTON, D. C. — Unity Center of Practical Christianity, Washington, D. C., continuing its series of two-day retreats held each fall and spring, recently sponsored The Return at beautiful Manressa on the Severn river in Annapolis, Maryland. This retreat was jointly sponsored with Unity in Philadelphia, and was well attended by residents of the Washington, D. C., and Philadelphia areas. Under

the unique and inspiring leadership of George Stone, minister in Washington, D. C., emphasis is placed during the retreats on each individual participating and sharing ideas, thoughts, and concepts relating to the retreat theme. This technique is most effective in encouraging and leading retreatants to reach his or her own guidance and understanding from within. These short retreats offer the opportunity to "go apart" from one's environment twice a year for renewal and restoration, gain a more objective and positive perspective of one's life situations, and thereby change it for the better. They are very popular, especially for those who cannot be away for longer periods, and have been extremely successful.

The Spring Retreat sponsored by the Washington ministry will be held May 16–18 (Thursday afternoon to Saturday evening) at Blackwater Falls State Park in West Virginia. Marcus Bach will be the featured speaker and emphasis will be placed on diet, fasting, exercise, and health.

The educational wing of the church will be completed by November 18 and will be dedicated in a special service by the Reverend Colemon and special guests."

DETROIT, MICHIGAN — Our Great Lakes Regional Vice-President, Ruth Mosley, minister of West Side Unity Church, Detroit, has inaugurated a prayer activity for the region. UNITY WORLD HEADQUARTERS ACTIVITIES CENTER

Tuesday, October 30, 1973, construction began at Unity Village on the new Unity World Headquarters Activities Center (see architects' drawing above). This major construction project was initiated by the trustees of Unity School after months of prayerful planning and consideration. A landmark in the progress of the expanding Unity movement, the project is of great interest to each member of the Association of Unity Churches and construction progress reports will be published in future issues of CONTACT.

As described in a recent Unity School brochure, "The outstanding feature of the new center will be an 1,100-seat auditorium, which will contain modern facilities for Sunday and other services of Unity Village Chapel. Designed for maximum usefulness, the auditorium will also provide facilities for conventions, retreats, lectures, seminars, movies, multimedia presentations, as well as musical and dramatic productions. It can be divided into three separate classrooms for Association of Unity Churches' conferences and study groups. Those who come to the auditorium will enjoy comfortable theater-type seating, excellent acoustics, a sound system with separate controls for auditorium and conference areas, back-stage dressing rooms, elaborate lighting and projection capabilities, and other features designed to provide ideal surroundings for worship, study, and entertainment.

"From the outside, the Activities Center will present a high arcade design, similar to Unity Village's present distinctive architecture, but more modern and open. The design will feature the arches and red tile roofs so well known to those familiar with existing buildings at the Village. The auditorium will be air-conditioned, and a minimum use of stairways will provide ease of entry and exit. The seating will slope gently toward the podium, and the farthest seat will be only about one hundred feet away.

"The auditorium will be erected on the present parking lot area, at the east end of the Rose Garden. Just north of the auditorium, at the east end of the Silent Unity Building, a new Unity Inn will be constructed. The new Inn will seat approximately four hundred and seventy five diners, and it will feature the 'scatter serving system,' an innovative style of service. Divider walls will provide space for three private banquet rooms. Outside, the Inn will harmonize architecturally with other Village buildings. The present Unity Inn facilities in the Administration Building eventually will be converted for use as Sunday school and youth activity rooms, offices, and administrative facilities. The unfinished east end of the Administration Building will be refaced to present a harmonious whole.

"Dedicatory services for the Unity World Headquarters Activities Center took place during the 1973 Unity International Convention. Completion of the \$2,000,000 project is tentatively scheduled for late 1974, or early 1975."


Russell Haak, 5802 Galloway Drive, Oxon Hill, Maryland 20021.
