"THE AUC PRESIDENT SERVING YOU"

The bright new year opens before us and we welcome it with open hearts, minds and arms! The message of Christ, as Unity presents it, is the message of our day, the day of 1974. May we speak it out, live it out in our lives as leaders in our world in this new year.

January is surely a time of beginnings for all of us. January 5, 1938, marked my own personal beginning as a worker in Silent Unity. During the next six years in Silent Unity, words were spoken every Monday morning that still ring in my heart. Known and loved by many of you: they are: I NOW JOYOUSLY RECONSECRATE AND REDEDICATE MYSELF TO THE WILL AND THE WORK OF JESUS CHRIST. For every minister and teacher in Unity these words become a truly personal prayer. Our own deep dedication to the Jesus Christ teachings is a private, individual experience. Certainly this is the strength of our success however, as we live it out in our own individual lives and ministries. This is our "beginning" in 1974.

I'd like to share some of the reports sent in relating to the proclaimed Dedication and Covenant Sunday in December. Mary Stovin, minister of Unity of Tacoma, Washington, writes: "First of all, I want to thank you for proclaiming the 'Day of Praver and Rededication', I gave a lesson on 'The New Covenant' and in preparation reread the entire book The Story of Unity by Jim Freeman. There were so many things in it that I had not read for many years, and I was truly inspired. This enthusiasm spilled over and there was a great response, We sang some of the old favorite Unity songs and had a healing meditation. . . it was very uplifting." Marian Penrod in Deming, New Mexico, advises: "December 2 we took as a special day of prayer and rededication in the spirit of the Fillmores' Dedication and Covenant. We felt our oneness with all the Unity ministries, It was a beautiful gesture to set aside this day for prayer and rededication," Quoting from a powerful service used on December 2 and shared with me by John Tant, minister of Unity Center of Christianity, Baltimore, Maryland: "We who study Truth in Unity can read the Dedication and Covenant by Charles and Myrtle Fillmore, These two souls made a covenant with everything they had or expected to receive, and today we are grateful for the 'covenant-mademanifest', Unity School of Christianity, with its ever-helpful prayer ministry, Silent Unity. . . Affirm within vourself 'I behold a covenant' if you have never experienced a conscious link existing between your soul and God, the Father. Let your words work in your consciousness and bring you to the glorious Presence and Power found in the Covenant waiting to lift you to new heights. It has been there since the beginning, You too can experience and enjoy it as many thousands are doing so right at this moment," Charles Roth, minister of Unity Truth Center, Indianapolis, Indiana, wrote: "Enclosed is a copy of the radio talk about the Fillmore Covenant. I am also sending a cassette of the Sunday service in which we had a terrific response to the special praverful remembrance of the Covenant of 1892. I went to the library and read the New York Times for November and December of 1892 on microfilm and also reviewed almanacs, At the Sunday service we turned the lights out, and using the screen behind the pulpit we projected the tremendously interesting historical data of that year-we placed ourselves in 1892! After giving the nationwide picture, I zeroed in on Kansas City-and the Fillmores' parlor. The climax was a man and woman reading the Covenant together into an offstage mike, ending with the soloist singing Myrtle Fillmore's words to The Rosary. Because of your interest in making that Sunday a special one of dedication, based on the 1892 Covenant, I thought you would be interested in how Indianapolis did it."

With this kind of cooperation throughout our AUC field, 1974 should be a powerful year of growth and blessings for all of us!

KINGSTON, JAMAICA, WEST INDIES — The Unity ministry of Kingston, Jamaica, was called upon by The Ancient Order of the Foresters to host that organization's 12th Anniversary Celebration. W. E. Goodison-Orr (Goodie), minister of Unity of Jamaica, gave the spiritual address. The meeting drew people from all over the island and in the words of Goodie, "The evening was beautiful. The musical part of the program was enjoyed by all, and I think my message was well received."

SUNCOAST RETREAT – The First Annual Suncoast Unity Retreat, sponsored by the twelve Suncoast Unity Ministries of Florida, was held December 9–12, 1973, at the Christian Retreat Campgrounds located on the beautiful Manatee river near Bradenton, Florida. The facilities include a cafeteria with a seating capacity of 200–300, a tabernacle, modern motel rooms and dormitories, and recreational areas featuring a heated swimming pool and courts for tennis and shuffleboard.

Dr. Ernest C. Wilson was the featured speaker at this sellout retreat. His three tremendous lectures, based on subjects from his Master Class Series, included human relations, prosperity, and healing. Many visitors drove in for Dr. Wilson's evening sessions. He concluded the final evening with a Christmas Candlelighting Service accompanied by beautiful music featuring Robert Newton, tenor soloist from Dr. Wilson's ministry, Unity on the Plaza, Kansas City, Missouri.

The daytime program activities were handled by ministers and licensed teachers from the Suncoast Area of Florida, including Paul Barrett, minister of Unity Christ Church, St. Petersburg; Catherine Brooks, minister of Unity Temple of Truth Church, St. Petersburg; Alma Coleman, minister of Unity Church of Christianity, Fort Myers; Ross Goodman, minister of First Unity Society, Tampa; Mary Hinkle, minister of Unity on the Gulf, Venice; Jack Kern, minister of Unity of Naples; Rudy Nan, minister of First Unity Center, Sarasota; Christine Reichel, licensed teacher, St. Petersburg; and Jim Sherman, minister of Unity Truth Center, New Port Richey. Lou Bass from Sarasota was the featured evening organist and pianist and Sarah Ann Jones of St. Petersburg provided the accompaniment during the day. Song leaders were Doris Fischer, Joan Goodman and Christine Reichel with Bennye Milton from Crystal River as featured soloist. Program activities included riverside meditations, Bible and group dynamics, meditation techniques, banner workshops, a reading pageant, Christmas tree trim and gift exchange party, and a closing circle of prayer.

The most frequent comment heard as the retreat approached the end of its three-day program was, "We must have another one next year!" The Retreat Program Coordinator, Paul Barrett, had this to say, "Being a part of this activity was one of the most rewarding experiences I have had since entering the ministry. The reward came from seeing and experiencing the joy and satisfaction that was exuding from the souls of those who were in attendance. Truly our Retreat theme, 'Christ is born in me as Light. . .as Life. . .as Love' became a living reality for the vast majority of those in attendance. We look forward to having an even better experience at next year's Retreat scheduled for November 18–21, 1974."

Active Outreach programs are being conducted at the University of Cincinnati and, most recently, classes have begun at a nearby shopping center where two new meeting rooms have been made available on a no-charge basis to this expanding ministry.

Larry, an expert trombonist, reports, "This was our first contemporary service in Syracuse, and the response and attendance was so great that we have scheduled a contemporary service for one Sunday of each month,"

This set of tapes was produced with a two-fold purpose. 

CHANGES IN UNITY SCHOOL PRINTING DEPARTMENT

Unity School of Christianity has entered into an agreement, effective January 1, 1974, with the I. J. Eagle Printing Company, Inc., of Kansas City, Missouri, whereby Eagle will print all Unity School publications and material. This

agreement, which covers only that portion of the publication process involving actual press equipment applications, provides for the sale by Unity School of all large press equipment to Eagle. All other aspects of the publication activities including the Copy Center remain unchanged. Unity School will continue all editorial, art and layout, composing, cutting, assembly, stitching, and distribution activities.

Commenting on the change, Charles R. Fillmore stated: "Unity School recently reached a decision point in its growth. Either relatively large capital investments and funding as well as the establishment of an aggressive recruiting and training program for pressroom personnel would be necessary to continue the in-house printing of the Unity publications, or we would have to make arrangements with a printing firm which has the equipment and manpower to maintain the high quality printing standard established by Unity School. After months of prayerful consideration and thorough analysis and study

of the factors involved, the decision was reached to sell our press equipment and utilize the services of an outside printing firm. After surveying other companies, we chose Eagle on the basis of their excellent performance and reliability in assisting Unity School for the past several years with overload printing. We are certain that Eagle has the ability to take on this additional workload and to continue to function in the excellent manner demonstrated in the past. Our agreement with Eagle includes a contractual stipulation whereby each of the ten (10) Unity School employees, whose work function has been assumed by Eagle, has been offered a comparable or better position with Eagle in order to protect that employee's income. We know that this decision and its present outworking are in order and will be mutually advantageous to all concerned."



The printing function in your AUC office is one of the most impor-

tant aspects of our being of service to each member of the Association of Unity Churches. The person responsible for maintaining the fine standard of quality so evident in material printed by the AUC is Arthur Bassett. A true craftsman, Art expresses his thorough knowledge and conversancy of the printing trade by constantly producing a high quality of printing output. The quality of his work far exceeds, in many cases, the supposed optimum of the AUC equipment to such a degree that the respective equipment and material suppliers have often requested samples of Art's work to show as examples of the high quality of workmanship obtainable.

Conducted jointly by Unity's Institute for Continuing Education and the AUC, the Extension Program provides for certain UICE classes to be taught in a Unity ministry

by accredited licensed teachers and ordained Unity ministers. The credit earned in these classes applies toward fulfillment of requirements for graduation from UICE. Perfect attendance is stressed for all Extension Program students and roll should be taken. If it is absolutely necessary for a student to be absent, only the following number of absences will be allowed in order to receive credit:

Construction is temporarily suspended at the present due to the unusually abundant snow falls received in the last several weeks. Construction will resume as soon as weather permits.

The foundation footings for the new Unity Inn were poured prior to suspension of construction. Suspension of activities due to weather was foreseen and appropriate time allowances made in the construction schedule; completion is still scheduled for late 1974 or early 1975.
