## NEW CONTACT DATE DESIGNATION POLICY

#### HEALING RALLY '74 PROGRAM

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, GLENN MOSLEY, CHAIRMAN

GROVER THORNSBERRY Due to the increasing and expanding responsibilities of his ministry, Grover Thornsberry, minister of Unity Church of Truth, Seattle, Washington, submitted his resignation from the Board of Trustees and the Executive Committee. Accepting Grover's resignation with regret, the Board elected Robert Stevens of San Diego, California, to the Executive Committee, and Thomas Sikking of Vancouver, B. C., Canada, to the Board to fill the unexpired term of Grover.

REPORT ON 1973 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION A deficit of \$29,314 was incurred by the AUC as a result of sponsoring the 1973 Unity International Convention held this past July in Kansas City, Missouri. The excess expense over income amount has been re-

covered from the AUC tithe account. The decision as to whether or not to sponsor in 1976 a convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, will be deferred until after Healing Rally '74 is evaluated.

1974 AUC CONFERENCE We are pleased that plans have been developed whereby delegates may attend the 1974 AUC Conference and participate in the program planned for the ministers and teachers. Due to limited housing facilities at the Village, delegates will be required to secure their own housing off the Village grounds. The Pre-Conference program, however, is reserved exclusively for ministers, teachers, and their spouses.

A special one day seminar for spouses will be conducted during Conference by **Doctor Donald Hillerich** of Wittenberg University, Springfield, Ohio. All spouses, including spouses of ministerial students, are encouraged to attend and participate in the seminar.

A daily child care program will be provided by the AUC during each day of the Conference on a no-charge basis for the children of those attending Conference. A list of persons available for babysitting in the evening will also be provided for anyone wishing to contract for their services.

## FINANCE AND BUDGET COMMITTEE, CHARLES NEAL, CHAIRMAN

PROPOSED BUDGET FOR 1973-1974

The Finance and Budget Committee submitted a proposed budget of \$384,000 for the 1973-1974 year. The proposed budget will be printed in detail in the

1974 Conference program booklet, a copy of which you will receive prior to Conference. The Committee emphasized the importance of full support by each member of the AUC in maintaining this budget. Adequate support will enable the AUC to continue expanding the services offered to its members.

## FINANCE AND BUDGET COMMITTEE Continued

#### **EMERITUS GRANTS INCREASED**

Upon recommendation of the Finance and Budget Committee, the AUC Board of Trustees has approved a ten dollar (\$10) per month increase in the Emeritus

Grants. This additional amount was granted due to the rise in the cost of living.

#### COST INVOICES FOR FREE LITERATURE

The AUC office prints and distributes each month a significant volume of literature on a no-charge basis. The Finance and Budget Committee has recommended

that a standard cost invoice, showing the cost of producing the material and the actual amount of postage expended, be enclosed with each shipment of free litera-This action is in response to the many requests received from ministries asking for guidelines in determining the appropriate amount to remit as an offering. voices covering Silent 70 material will reflect actual postage costs only.

#### **EXCEPTIONS TO** L & O POLICIES

The Licensing and Ordination Committee requested that paragraph 5 of the Licensing and Ordination Policies dealing with exceptions to such policies be

more clearly defined in order to alleviate misunderstanding on the part of the recommending member minister. The Committee made the following statement: simple completion of time within a center ministry as a licensed teacher does not constitute an exception in our judgment. It is our feeling that were we to grant this type of exception we would find a multitude of licensed teachers applying for ordination, thereby defeating the high standard of academic excellence we are endeavoring to maintain." This recommendation was approved by the Board of Trustees.

## MIDYEAR COUNCIL OF COMMITTEES Continued

## MINISTERIAL EDUCATION ADVISORY COMMITTEE, CHARLES ROTH, CHAIRMAN

PROGRESSIVE TESTING PROGRAM The Ministerial Education Advisory Committee met with the ministerial students and with the staff of SMRS and has recommended that a progressive testing program be instituted in SMRS whereby ministerial students

would periodically be required to pass tests before being allowed to continue their training.

The results of such tests would be taken into consideration and evaluated by the L & O Committee and by the SMRS Progress Counselors. It is recommended that the tests cover such subjects as Fundamentals of Truth, Bible, English, and the ability of the students to communicate these fundamentals in an effective and coherent manner.

#### BYLAWS COMMITTEE, MARLOWE KLINE, CHAIRMAN

BYLAWS CHANGES

The Board of Trustees has concurred with the Bylaws Committee's recommendation that certain changes be made in the AUC Bylaws at Conference this year. The proposed changes will be distributed in the near future to each member of the Association for review prior to Conference. The Bylaws Committee is also working on the revision of the Recommended Bylaws for Unity Centers.

## YOUNG ADULTS RESEARCH COMMITTEE, ELVINA HAUSMANN LEE, CHAIRMAN

Y.A.U. The Young Adults Research Committee has recommended that regional coordinators be appointed
in each AUC region to coordinate local YAU activities
and communicate with the AUC office. For the present, the members of the
Young Adults Research Committee will function as the regional coordinators.

Recommendations were made that time be allocated at regional conferences for presentation and discussion of ideas and programs relative to YAU, and that an annual YAU retreat be held at Unity Village in addition to regional and subregional retreats. 
