

She has been a member of Unity on the Plaza (the Temple) in Kansas City for many years. While the Temple was being constructed, much of the leadership and direction of the initial building bond program came from Hazel. In fact, she issued the very first of the mortgage bonds for that undertaking.

C.: Lisa Jackson, Memphis, Tennessee; David Vetter, Santa Ana, California; George Stone, Washington, D. C.; and me, your YOU Coordinator. We were very happy to welcome Eugene Sorensen, minister of Unity of West Suburbia, Livonia, Michigan, who served as our ministerial advisor replacing George Stone who was unable to attend.

Our two days of meetings were blessed by the balmy spring weather which enhanced the quality of our time together. It was nice to know that the many hours of individual preparatory work; i.e., the gathering of data, ideas, and suggestions had come to a climax. As we began to pool our resources and become committed to our task as a team, Conference Room B came alive with ideas. A consciousness of order, balance, and prayer moved us swiftly, but smoothly along. The action was revise, rewrite, rephrase! After 15 hours of diligent, tedious, but happy work the 1974 proposed revised International Youth of Unity Bylaws were completed.

Copies of these proposed revised Bylaws will be mailed to each ministry prior to the YOU Regional Rallies. The Committee encourages ministers and sponsors of YOU to become familiar with these Bylaws and share them with the members of their YOU. As YOU Coordinator, I will be attending all nine of the rallies to present the proposed revised Bylaws to the regions and entertain discussion and receive suggestions.

The work of the YOU Research Committee will be completed in August when the Bylaws are adopted by the YOU Conference body. Until August the Committee will be working with the revision of the YOU Guidebook which was based on the suspended YOU structure and Bylaws. Your continued prayers for success are invited. All of the committee members felt and appreciated the support, love, and encouragement conveyed by the Association of Unity Churches Board of Trustees on behalf of the Unity ministries.

YOU CONFERENCE
This year the YOU Conference has been extended by one day.

It will be held here at Unity Village, August 17-23, 1974.

In order to accommodate the extra day our Conference fee has been raised from \$50.00 to \$57.00. We are bringing this to your attention now so that you may advise your YOU sponsors and YOUers. Printed material concerning YOU Conference will be mailed to sponsors very soon.



JUSTUS CREDIT UNION REMOVES LIMITS FOR DEPOSITS

Responding to requests from Unity ministers and individual members, Justus Credit Union has announced that, effective immediately, any individual or corporation member of the Justus Credit Union may now have unlimited deposits.

Currently the Justus Credit Union has \$630,000.00 on loan to AUC ministries and ministers; loan commitments of \$277,500.00 to be disbursed in 1974; and deposits of \$450,000.00. Justus Credit Union has received many inquiries recently for loans. They hope to receive enough deposits to fulfill all of the requests for loans from the AUC members.

The anticipated dividend on corporation deposits of \$50,000.00 or less is 6% for the coming year. As is customary in most financial institutions, Justus will provide a higher rate of return on larger deposits. Those deposits in excess of \$50,000.00 will receive ½% more on the amount over \$50,000.00. You are reminded that deposits received in the credit union office by the 12th of the month will receive interest from the first.

POST-GRADUATE PROGRAM COMMITTEE MEETINGS

On February 19th and 20th, the members of the Post-Graduate Program Committee met at Unity Village. In attendance were Kay Arndt, minister

of Unity of Bellevue, Washington; Jack Barker, minister of New Thought Unity Center, Cincinnati, Ohio; William L. Fischer, Director of Ministerial Education for the AUC; Frank & Martha Giudici, SMRS faculty members; Christina Knox, minister of Christ Unity Temple, Chicago, Illinois; Charles Neal, minister of Unity Center of Practical Christianity, Miami, Florida; Dorothy Pierson, co-minister of Christ Unity Church, Sacramento, California; Ed Rabel, SMRS faculty member; Charles Roth, minister of Unity Truth Center, Indianapolis, Indiana; Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director of the AUC; Sue Sikking, minister of Unity-By-the-Sea, Santa Monica, California; and Phil White, Director of Education for Unity School. The Committee established and effectively accomplished the following goals.

First, considerable time was given to the evaluation of the Post-Graduate Program thus far. To date, at six of our seven Regional Conferences, a course has been offered on teaching techniques. The evaluation of this course and the response in the various regions was extremely valuable. The decision was made to offer this teaching techniques course on Wednesday of the Pre-Conference week if there are enough pre-registrants. It was felt that the course was sufficiently valuable to retain it for presentation again at a future Pre-Conference meeting several years from now.

Second, the Committee invested a great deal of prayerful time and discussion to setting up a ten year schedule for the Post-Graduate Program. Sufficient basic work was done to assure the orderly development of a well-planned program that will serve our Unity movement well.

The third matter to be brought to the attention of the Committee was the planning of the Post-Graduate Program courses for Pre-Conference this year. After much discussion and prayerful consideration the decision was reached to extend an invitation to Ed Rabel to prepare and present a Post-Graduate course on Bible Interpretation. Such course to be structured to offer the basic material in an audio-visual manner, i.e., in written form with transparancies and on tape. An invitation has also been extended to Wilfred Harricharan to conduct a business administration course for Unity ministers. Wilf, a member of the Laymen's Professional Counsel, is a university professor of business administration and is President of the Board of our Unity work in Brooklyn, New York, where Don Nedd is the minister. Wilf recently gave a similar course to our student ministers and it proved so effective that it was the consensus of your Post-Graduate Program Committee that it should be made available to ministers in the field.

A considerable amount of time and effort was also given to planning the Post-Graduate Program course at the Regional Conferences in the late summer and fall and in the spring of next year. The decision was made to offer this year a course entitled "Effective Presentation of Christian Healing." Thirty-six ministers have been invited to prepare an outline on assigned chapters including visual aid materials. The purpose of this selection of material is to assist in the preparation and presentation of the extension course class on Christian Healing. A considerable effort is being made to involve an increasing number of our ministers in our Post-Graduate Program in the future.

Idea Exchange

Many of our Unity ministries have shared with the AUC office some of the innovative and creative methods used by their individual ministries in effectively disseminating and teaching Truth. This new, regular monthly feature entitled Idea Exchange will enable your ministry to share your ideas and to be enriched through the receiving of ideas from your fellow ministers and teachers. Each of you is encouraged to submit to the AUC office ideas which may be shared through CONTACT.

CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION — Larry Swartz, minister of Unity of Tucson recently installed a closed circuit television system as an extension of the Sunday morning service. The sanctuary of this Arizona ministry presently seats 240 persons. With one television monitor in a separate chapel and another in a meeting room, this Arizona ministry can now seat some 440 persons for the Sunday service.

MINISTRY PHONE NUMBER — David L. Schumacher, minister of Christ Church Unity, Springfield, Missouri, has had the last four digits of the Springfield ministry's telephone number changed to correspond with the ministry's street address. That is, the ministry is located at 2214 E. Seminole and the phone number is 887-2214. David reports that this change has greatly assisted the members and friends of the ministry in placing their telephone calls to the ministry.

AFFIRMATIONS IN LOCAL NEWSPAPER — Roy Fox, minister of Unity of Jackson, Michigan, reports excellent response to a "consciousness-builders" ad which this Michigan ministry places daily in their local newspaper. Coordinated with the ministry's Dial-A-Thought message the ad containing the affirmation appears in print the same day as the tele-

phone message is being aired. A sample ad is shown at right. Only the affirmation changes daily. The first three lines of the ad remain the same.

DIAL-A-THOUGHT CARDS — Unity of the Infinite Presence in Detroit, Michigan, under the leadership of Jack Boland is receiving between 700-800 calls a day to their Dial-A-Thought. Jack has shared the following three expansion methods utilized in this service: 1) Have Dial-A-Thought cards published and distributed to your congregation for them to share with others in letters, conversations, etc. Jack carries 500 of these cards to each special lecture he gives and distributes them to the audience. He also distributes these during his hospital ministry. 2) The language of the cards refrains from using "churchy" language and keeps the message broad, uplifted, and pertinent to the needs of today. 3) The ministry uses their own equipment and adds machines as the demand increases. At the present time, five machines are being utilized.

OUTREACH — Charles Roth, minister of Unity of Indianapolis, Indiana, has reported that the average attendance at the Sunday morning service in Indianapolis is 500 people. Charles feels that the Outreach program inaugurated sometime ago in Indianapolis contributed greatly to the unfolding and expanding work of this ministry. The following figures covering only a single twelve month period, when translated into lives that have been influenced and changed for the better, indicate the excellent reception of Unity's message in the area served by this ministry. Dial-A-Prayer Calls, 311,370; Radio Scripts, 62,346; Meditation guides, 20,400; and Cassettes, 2,190, which is a total of 396,306.

SCHOOL FOR MINISTERIAL AND RELIGIOUS STUDIES

The Association of Unity Churches is and was from its inception designed as a service organization. An organization dedicated to the growth of the Unity field movement. In line with such dedication, the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies has had as its constant goal the expansion of the Unity ministries. Through an increased number of ministers-in-training and an increased number of Unity ministries and classes in the field, today more than ever before a larger number of people are able to avail themselves of the Truth teachings and the Unity way of life.

Since 1968, when the AUC assumed the responsibility for actually training Unity ministers, our expansion and growth can be seen in the following data: (a) The number of ministerial students has increased ten-fold from seven in 1968 to seventy-four in 1974. This has been effectively accomplished without the necessity of SMRS making any major increase in staff. During this period of increase only three new faculty members have been added; (b) The total number of ministries and classes has increased from 255 to 335; (c) The total number of ordained ministers (active and inactive) has risen from 375 to 448; and (d) Whereas in 1968 only seven persons received ordination, thirty-five are scheduled for ordination in 1974.

A continual, objective observation of operating procedures in the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies, has kept the ministerial education program operating smoothly. Today, there is a greater feeling of oneness and cooperation among the staff and students than ever before. Regularly-scheduled faculty meetings assure progressive input to keep the program vital.

New screening procedures in the admissions process enable us to admit the best possible candidates to the School. This, in turn, assures a high quality leadership in the future. We are receiving more applications to SMRS at this time than ever before. This surely indicates that Spirit has a plan for the growth of the Unity field movement.

A major firm in the country today has the motto: "We Try Harder." This is also our motto in SMRS. We are trying harder to do the job you have asked us to do . . . to graduate and ordain fine, dedicated Unity ministers. We appreciate your love and continued support in this endeavor.

ILLUSTRATIONS SERVICE
FOR MINISTERS

Recognizing that appropriate and relative illustrations make a significant contribution to the effectiveness of a minister's presentation, William L. Fischer, Director of Minister's

terial education, has recommended that the ministers-in-training in SMRS develop and/or avail themselves of a good library of illustrations. One of the more highly developed and organized illustration services recommended by Bill is the Wilde's Illustration Service for Ministers published by the W. A. Wilde, Co., 1665 B. Washington Street, Holliston, Massachusetts 01746. The purpose of the service is to provide ministers with a wealth of choice and current illustrative material in a handy format. Offered at a cost of \$17.95 per year the service provides six or more prepunched pages of illustration material each month and a loose-leaf binder. Bill feels that the majority of the topics are relative to Truth teachings and the alphabetical arrangement of the topics facilitates usage.


