It is especially a great testimony to our AUC Sunday School material. Her report, in part, is as follows: It was obvious from the beginning that our lessons were not only meaningful, but really fun for the children. Our near perfect attendance record and the enthusiasm for our school can be attributed to the great curriculum developed by the Association of Unity Churches. The Image for Living curriculum is very complete from the teacher's standpoint, I can speak with some authority when I say that the lessons meet the criteria of a good learning format. The greatest credit for the curriculum is that children learn Truth principle from the lessons!

For many of the parents this was their first exposure to the Unity message. We made certain that they were informed of the content of the lesson via a "Dear Parents" letter weekly. The parental enthusiasm for our program was fantastic and much literature has been shared with the parents.

Since most of the children lived in the neighborhood, an ancient Japanese temple gong was used to announce that it was time for Unity Monday School, as the children named it. And as we strike our temple gong to begin our second school year of Unity Monday School on the Island of Maui we know that all who appreciate the Unity message will be there with us in spirit and will bless our work.

DES MOINES, OHIO — Bill Hines, minister of Unity Church of Des Moines, has shared the wonderful news that the Des Moines ministry has entered into expansion plans for their present church building. Scheduled to start construction this spring, additions to the ministry will include a large library and literature sales room, an additional teaching room (or auxiliary chapel), and a sound-proof room which will enable persons with small babies to attend and view the service without disturbing the other members of the congregation. Our blessings go forth to Bill and the members of this fine ministry as they prepare to be of greater service to the Des Moines area.

MESA AND PHOENIX, ARIZONA — On April 12, 1974, seven metaphysical churches of the Mesa-Phoenix-Scottsdale area in Arizona took part in a series of special Good Friday services based upon the Seven Last Words of Jesus Christ. The Yaysnoffs donated their talents as a way of expressing their thanksgiving for the healing power of God working through June Yaysnoff. June, who had lost both legs as the result of an accident, performed from her wheel-chair, She has received recognition in a medical journal as the first person to have stood and walked on her prostheses right away. June is eager to encourage our veteran double amputees to know they can also make a "come-back" through the power of prayer.

The Yaysnoffs formerly performed widely in Europe and the United States. They say the Teaneck Unity concert has proved to them that they can once again resume their tours. Their faith and courage are an inspiration, and their music is outstanding and exciting.

DENVER, COLORADO — Unity of Denver, where **Jim Lewis** serves as minister, conducted a special Dedication Service on Tuesday evening, March 26, 1974, for the ministry's newly completed Sanctuary. **Ernest C. Wilson**, minister of Unity on the Plaza in Kansas City, Missouri, was special guest speaker for this wonderful occasion. Jim reports that the new Sanctuary has been a dream and vision for the past two years and, now that it is a fact, is already filled to near capacity on Sundays. LEMAY, MISSOURI — In the spring of 1954, the Unity church building in Lemay was completed and the members and friends of Lemay Unity moved into their present facilities. To commemorate the TWENTIETH ANNIVERSARY of this occasion, the congregation of Lemay Unity Church, where Tom Skalitzky serves as minister, shared on April 28 a special anniversary dinner. We know that each AUC member joins with us in the South Central Region in giving thanks for this growing ministry and in our blessings for its continuing unfoldment and expansion.

Charles Korfhage reporting for the NORTHERN CALIFORNIA REGION:

SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA — Christ Unity Church, Sacramento, California, under the leadership of Phil and Dorothy Pierson and Charles Korfhage is entering into the final phase of its remodeling plan. The ministry is completing the conversion of its facilities, which originally housed a large bowling alley, into a beautiful church. The office and educational section of the building was completed three years ago.

The sanctuary, small chapel, library, and additional class rooms will be completed in this final building phase which involves a cost of over \$200,000. The Sacramento ministers especially want to express praise and appreciation to the Justus Credit Union for supplementary financial assistance given at this time. Wilson Hembree and his staff in Justus Credit Union are truly interested in helping the Unity ministries throughout the country. Each Unity minister and board member is encouraged to become a member of our own Justus Credit Union and thereby assist the great expansion work of the Unity field ministries.

There is an amazing story unfolding in the development of the Unity property in Sacramento located at 1415 L Street in the downtown area. Last week Phil and Dorothy received the following letter from John Cuddeback, minister of Christ Church Unity, Asbury Park, New Jersey: Dear Dorothy and Phillip: I came across something the other day that made me wonder, — so wonder with me, will you? In looking over a book, "The Master Mind" edited by Annie Rix Militz, I noticed that in the back of it, it lists: Sacramento — Home of Truth, 1415 L Street, with the name, Christine Fraser. This volume is dated April 1917 to September 1917. I wondered if you knew that "Truth" was planted so early at your address. Congratulations! It's good to know that you are finishing the Sanctuary.

In 1917 Unity was taught in a private residence at 1415 L Street. In the ensuing years, the home was torn down and in the early 1930's a bowling alley was built on the property. Fifty years after Unity was first taught at 1415 L Street, and without anyone apparently knowing of it, the Spirit led the Unity people of Sacramento back to that location to purchase the property and establish a full-time church building! Amazing and true!

SAN RAFAEL, CALIFORNIA — Candida Wright, minister of Unity-in-Marin, reports that the San Rafael Chapter of the West Central Region of the Youth of Unity hosted the Annual Regional Rally on April 19, 20, and 21. The theme of the rally was "Everything in One." Jared McFerrin, President of the San Rafael Chapter, advised that the Rally was held in the lovely outdoor setting of the Santa Barbara Retreat Center on the Dominican College campus in San Rafael and was inwardly inspiring and outwardly interesting.

VALLEJO, CALIFORNIA — The new Christ Unity Church of Vallejo, California, an outreach of Christ Unity Church of Sacramento, is now in its fourth month of service. Charles Korfhage, co-minister with Dorothy and Phillip Pierson in Sacramento, serves as minister in Vallejo three Sundays of each month. The Vallejo ministry is growing in every way: more people, more activities, and more substance. Part of the increasing activities of the church is a new Wednesday afternoon class taught by David Williamson, minister in Richmond, California. This class is also growing each week. We know in time this work, like the former outreach of the Sacramento church in Reno, Neveda, will have its own minister and will be able to incorporate and conduct a full-time ministry.

BRING A FRIEND TO UNITY MONTH — Gene Sorensen, minister of Unity of Livonia, Michigan, reports that during the month of December the ministry worked with the BRING A FRIEND TO UNITY MONTH idea. On November 25, each person who came into the Livonia ministry was given a packet which contained a special brochure on the ministry describing its activities, a personal letter from the minister, and a calendar of the month's activities. The packet was enclosed in a 6" X 9" envelope ready for mailing. Each person who received the packet was asked to share it with a friend as a way of introduction to the Unity way of life. Gene also distributed pamphlets about Unity each Sunday morning to each person attending the service. The person was asked to read the pamphlet and share one with a friend (Your AUC office publishes and distributes many pamphlets suitable for such distribution). The BRING A FRIEND TO UNITY MONTH idea has as its purpose the doubling of the number of persons attending the ministry and thereby doubling the ministry's prayer power and effectiveness. A purpose easily accomplished by each person who attends the service simply bringing a friend to the next service.

INTERPRETATIONS OF LESSONS IN TRUTH — Charles Roth, minister of Unity Truth Center, Indianapolis, Indiana, has taken his scripts on Lessons In Truth originally written for the Unity Radio program in Indianapolis and produced a very attractive and informative instructional booklet entitled Interpretations of Lessons In Truth. Also, as an aid to remind Truth students of the value in keeping their thoughts happy, constructive, and loving, Charles has developed and produced an effective card entitled "Plus and Minus Tent Card" which visibly serves as a personal reminder to the user to keep his or her thoughts and mental responses to life situations positive. 

MODIFIED HYMNAL FOR ORGANIST — Dan Douglas, an April SMRS graduate and ordinand, has shared his technique of modifying the Unity Song Selections hymnal in order to assist the organist using the hymnal. Dan's modification process which causes the hymnal pages to lie flat when opened involves removing the hymnal cover and cutting the binding from the pages. This in effect changes the hymnal into a loose-leaf format whereby the cover and the hymnal pages may be punched and bound utilizing either plastic or metal binding materials.



NEW UNITY BOOK — Unity School has just published THE MASTER CRAFT OF LIVING by William L. Fischer, Director of Ministerial Education for the Association of Unity Churches. This book would make an excellent graduation gift. The following are excerpts from the review which appeared in the May issue of UNITY magazine: William L. Fischer . . . deals with such subjects as relaxation, forgiveness, healing, repentance, happiness, courage, marriage, calmness, love, victory, prosperity, thinking, and prayer. Many of these chapters first appeared as articles in New Magazine, Weekly Unity, and UNITY Magazine.

The book must be read thoroughly and thoughtfully to be fully appreciated, for the author is dealing with absolute truth-eternal verities, that is.

"Every person," he asserts, "demonstrates situations and experiences in his life in accordance with the thought-molds he provides . . . We must see things as we think God wants them to be . . . The master craft of thinking is really that of constructive thinking."

Of prayer he says, "(It) is the most powerful form of energy a person can generate." Concerning prosperity he writes, "God wants you to be prosperous and has already given you all that you can accept as belonging to you." With regard to victory he avers, "In running the race we call life we are not in competition with any other person. Our competition is ourself." "Love," he says, "when properly expressed (is) responsible for some of the most beautiful accomplishments in the world." Calmness is one of the crying needs of the contemporary world. "The truly serene person knows that the source of his calmness is within." "A truly happy person has a consciousness of happiness, unrelated to things."

In his chapter on healing, the author rightly relates divine healing to that of medical science in its desire and continuing effort to overcome imperfection and promote wholeness of mind and body. "Forgiveness," he says, "is the quickest way to end trouble and to have peace and unity." Affirmation and meditation are important ingredients in the accomplishment of relaxation.

EXTENSION PROGRAM

Notice to the teachers and students of Extension Program classes in your ministry: Extension Program students who previously took classes for credit in UICE, but who have not taken classes in recent years, should be apprised of the policy whereby a student is expected to complete all of his or her UICE requirements within ten years in order to apply for licensed teacher recognition. If more than ten years has elapsed, a student may be requested to repeat some or all of the studies previously completed. Also, please call to the attention of students who are taking Extension Program courses that there is a time limit on the finishing of their papers. The papers must be completed within six months from the date the classes end in the ministry.
