REGIONAL NEWS



Paul Barrett reporting for the SOUTHEASTERN REGION:

The Christian Retreat Campgrounds near Bradenton, Florida, which were previously selected as the Retreat site, will not be available in November. As soon as another location is decided upon, an announcement will be published in

CONTACT. Accordingly, this Retreat has been deleted from the Calendar of Events.

UNITY IN THE CARIBBEAN – We are pleased to share the following portions of a glowing report received from Bert Coffey, minister of Unity Truth Church in Vista California, of the tremendous work being done by our Unity ministries in the Carib-Bert, together with his wife, Eva, recently completed a three-week trip which included stops in Puerto Rico, Trinidad, Guyana, and Jamaica. Association Cristianismo Practico de Puerto Rico, our ministry in Santurce, Puerto Rico, led by Francisca Mendez, is experiencing overflow attendance in their beautiful church which seats 400. Likewise, a growing number of enthusiastic Truth students is attending Associacion Unity de Cristianismo Practico en Ponce, Inc., in Ponce, where Nicolina Benitez serves Unity of Trinidad & Tobago in Port-of-Spain, where Violet Assam serves as minister, and Silent Unity Centre of Prayer in San Fernando, led by Sylvia Chevalier, are thriving under the direction of these fine Unity ministers. An indication of the expanding outreach work in Guyana (on the top edge of South America) is demonstrated by the fact that the Unity students of Guyana purchase over 1,000 DAILY WORDs each month. The Unity work in Jamaica is also thriving. Jamaica led by Wildorf Goodison-Orr (Goodie) is in the process of purchasing its own property after meeting for many years in other facilities. We give thanks for the enthusiasm and dedication of each of the aforementioned ministries and their leaders.

Kay Arndt reporting for the NORTHWEST REGION:

EUGENE, OREGON — On Sunday, March 31, twenty-one young people from Our Saviour's Lutheran Church in Eugene were guests at the Worship Service of Unity Truth Chapel, where Rose Elaine Lightburne is the minister. Accompanied by the assistant pastor of the Lutheran church, the young people had elected to visit the Unity ministry as part of their program "Getting Acquainted With Your Neighbor's Church." Being apprised of the Unity work through the ministry's advertisement in the local newspaper, the students expressed a strong interest in learning about the Unity message. Rose Elaine met with the group following the service in order to answer their questions and to distribute packets of complimentary Unity literature. The young people were especially impressed with Unity's acceptance of women in the ministry and the ecumenical attitude of Unity.

PORTLAND, OREGON — Unity Center in Portland where Leslie Saunders and Gwen Norment serve as ministers, conducted a Tenebrae Service on Thursday evening, April 11. The ritual of Tenebrae dates back to the fourth century in the Christian church.

Tenebrae means darkness and the service commemorates the last three days of Holy Week. Beauty, reverent awe, and moving wonder marked the Tenebrae Service as it was dramatized through music, the spoken word, and symbolic action. Conducted by Gwen, the service was planned to express the concepts of Unity and to meet the deepest needs of those seeking greater understanding and spiritual growth through experiencing the Easter message as it relates to our lives today. The celebration which included musical accompaniment and the voices of a 25-member choir assisted in preparing the congregation for the glory and joy of Easter morn.

SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL CONFERENCE — The South Central Regional Conference was held at Unity Church of Denver on April 22-25. On Wednesday evening another inspiring public meeting was held with Dorothy Pierson and Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director of the Association of Unity Churches, presenting individual lessons.

The Conference concluded its time of learning, growing, and sharing with a breakfast on Thursday morning.



UNITY WORLD HEADQUARTERS ACTIVITIES CENTER

Viewing the construction area from the Tower, the progress of the work can be measured by comparing the similar view printed in previous issues of CONTACT. The outer walls are in place for the new Unity Inn (left portion of the photograph) and the roof decking is being laid. Note that the windows of the new Inn harmonize architectually with the other Village buildings.



The majority of the structural steel framework is now in place for the Activities Center (shown in the right portion of the photograph). Housing the new 1,100-seat auditorium, the Activities Center will contain modern facilities for Sunday and other services of Unity Village Chapel. The auditorium is so structured that it can be divided into three separate areas if needed for use during the AUC Conference and similar meetings.



This view from the east side of the Activities Center provides a closer look at the building's massive steel skeleton. The height of the building (50 ft.) can be better appreciated from this perspective. At the top of the photograph two workmen may be seen riding the crane's cable which is used as a means of transporting the workers from the ground to the top level.

The concrete structures in the foreground of the photograph will, when completed, become the south and east planter boxes. Another planter is to the north of the building. The huge planter boxes will border the Activities Center and provide additional beauty and compatibility with the existing area.

I am very happy to share with you at this time a few comments on our YOU Regional Rallies. There has been an overall increase in Rally attendance by YOUers and the ministerial participation has impressed the YOUers tremendously. Each Rally was special in itself and benefited each participant. I am grateful for the opportunity to visit the Rallies and be a part of the program. You will be happy to know that thus far the Proposed Revised Bylaws have been very favorably accepted and, as planned, will be presented to the YOU Conference Body with revisions as needed this summer. Once again your continued prayer support is appreciated and your love is being demonstrated through all the programs of the Youth of Unity.

On April 19, 20, and 21, Unity of Tacoma, hosted the Northwest Regional Rally. The Rally was held at the Seabeck Christian Conference Center and 100 young people and adults joined to participate in the Rally program. The Rally theme, "Hang In There" was selected by the Tacoma YOUers who literally did that through the planning and during the Rally experience.

Assistance for the Rally planning also came through Tacoma's two junior sponsors. Mary Stovin, minister in Tacoma, reports that the delegates from last year's Conference continued to serve and be leaders in the Y.O.U. group, adding much to the Rally planning.

Some of the highlights of the Rally were the Talent Show and the workshop, "A Purpose For Your Life." The Talent Show was organized in such a way that each chapter presented a skit as well as individual participation. "A Purpose For Your Life" was our main Conference workshop last summer at YOU Conference. The response to this program developed by the Union College Character Research Project has been tremendous. An excellent response also came when this material was represented at the Rally.

During the business meeting elections were held and **Kent Powell** from Spokane is the new Regional Representative and **Shannon Webb** of Tacoma and **Howard Allen** of Spokane are serving as Co-Alternates.

REPORT ON HEALING RALLY '74

We give thanks for the tremendous effectiveness and success of Healing Rally '74 conducted by the Association of Unity Churches at the Sheraton-Palace Hotel in San Francisco, California, on May 2-4, 1974.

The purpose of the Healing Rally was to bring together persons from throughout the world who are interested in the healing of the whole person, in order that such persons may share ideas, strengthen their prayer power, and enjoy a time of fellowship.

Over nine hundred (900) persons attended the meetings and participated in a program which featured outstanding physicians, scientists, and Unity ministers and lay Phillip M. Pierson, co-minister of Christ Unity Church, Sacramento, California, who served as Program Chairman stated: "Charles Fillmore, Unity's cofounder, once wrote, 'Anyone who will search for the science in religion and the religion in science will find that they harmonize and prove each other. The point of unity is the Spirit-mind common to both. So long as religion assumes that the Spirit that creates and sustains man and the universe can be cajoled, and by prayer or some other appeal can be induced to change its laws, it cannot hope to be recognized by those who know that unchangeable law rules everywhere and in everything. Again, so long as science ignores the principles of intelligence in the evolutionary and directive forces of man and the universe, just so long will it fail to understand religion and the power of thought in the world, visible and Phil also stated that the Healing Rally was a manifestation of Charles Fillmore's spirit of scientific inquiry and suggested that through scientific research we can learn how to apply the principles of spiritual healing and more practically share them with others.

The first speaker on the program was James Dillet Freeman, Director of Silent Unity. Jim spoke on the healing principles utilized by Silent Unity in conducting their effective prayer ministry for over eighty (80) years. Over one million (1,000,000) letters are received each year by Silent Unity from persons requesting prayer assistance. In addition, over a quarter million (250,000) persons telephone each year. Jim also gave an audio-visual presentation of Unity's unfoldment as a movement.

Dr. Elmer and Alyce Green of the Menninger Foundation in Topeka, Kansas, spoke on biofeedback and brain wave training. Dr. Green is Director of the Voluntary Controls Program of the Menninger Foundation and Mrs. Green is the Training Director. An award of appreciation plaque was presented to the Greens by the Association of Unity Churches in recognition of the pioneering efforts of this husband and wife team in scientifically proving and demonstrating man's ability to take conscious control of his physical and mental states.

Dr. Carl Simonton, former Chief of Radiation therapy at David Grant USAF Medical Center, Travis Air Force Base, shared the findings of his research on the effects of counseling and meditation on the healing of cancer. Dr. Simonton is presently engaged in private practice and research work in Texas.

Dr. Bennet R. Wong, psychiatrist from Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada, spoke on the results of his experience of some twenty years in healing the whole person (mind, body, and spirit).

Dr. Evarts G. Loomis, physician, surgeon, and lecturer, presented a film on healing which he developed jointly with the Charles Fillmore Foundation (Unity), featuring other renowned persons such as Roberto Assagiloi, M. D.; Karlfried Von Durkheim, Ph. D.; and Paul Tournier, M. D., who share Dr. Loomis' ideas on treating the whole person.

Dr. Dan Stipe, a physician engaged in private practice in Idaho, joined with the other doctors, and with ministers, James Dillet Freeman; Glenn Mosley of Detroit Unity Temple, Michigan; Hal Rosencrans of Unity of the Palm Beaches in West Palm Beach, Florida; and Robert Stevens of Christ Church Unity in San Diego, California, in participating in a panel discussion on healing. The nine Unity ministers who comprise our Executive Committee of the Board of Directors of the AUC presented individual talks on "Healing Principles."

Ms. Connie Haines, popular vocalist and ministerial student at Unity's School for Ministerial and Religious Studies, presented special evening programs which blended music, inspirational message, and meditation.

During this tremendous Healing Rally we were privileged and blessed in having as special soloist Mrs. Nancy Heydt and as organist Mrs. Joan Engel. Both Nancy and Joan presently share their musical talents with Christ Unity Church in Sacramento, California.

We appreciate the fine job Unity Christ Church, our ministry in San Francisco, did in planning, organizing, operating, and bearing the full responsibility of the literature and cassette sales room during the Rally. David McClure, minister in San Francisco, his wife, Barby, and the many members of the San Francisco congregation are to be congratulated for the excellent assistance they provided in assuring the success of the Rally. It was evident that much prayer work and physical effort had been done by these dedicated persons.

Meditations were led by Johnnie Colemon, minister of Christ Unity Temple, Chicago, Illinois; Scott Sherman, minister of Unity Church of Truth, Spokane, Washington; and Catherine Knight, associate minister, Detroit Unity Temple, Michigan. Barby McClure led the Rally audience in a metaphysical exercise.

We also appreciate and bless the many members of the staffs of AUC and Unity School, especially **Pete Rhea**, Director, Cassette Program, for his invaluable technical assistance and advice in producing Jim Freeman's presentation on Unity.

Our affirmation for the Healing Rally was, "I ACCEPT THE HEALING POWER OF GOD IN ME! "I AM A RADIANT CENTER OF LIFE NOW!." We give thanks that each person who participated in this tremendous healing experience had his or her sense of God's innate healing capacity within them strengthened and made a power in their lives and in the world.
