### LETTER FROM A LAYMAN

This July, the AUC office received a very expressive and thought provoking letter from George Trabert, one of our Unity Laymen who attends Unity Center of Walnut Creek in California. We are grateful for the thoughts shared by George and for the very evident message that his recent input has brought to our attention. Portions of George's letter are reproduced below:

"Recently I have had some input and impressions which when connected together form a message of importance to all organizations including Unity. I would like to share these thoughts with you. . .

"On June 23rd, Carol Knox, the minister at Walnut Creek, gave a talk using as a theme the slogan 'I didn't know that!" from. . .current. . .TV commercials. Her message in short was - To grow, a person must recognize a lack of knowledge ('I didn't know that!') and then proceed to take action.

"Last April I was in Washington, D. C., and visited the Thomas Jefferson Memorial. I was impressed by one of his quotations which is inscribed on the wall. The gist of the quotation is - Laws and institutions must change and evolve as the people's needs who they serve change and evolve. Surely you would not expect a man to wear for a lifetime, the first coat he is given as a boy. . .

"As I connect these thoughts and impressions the message seems clear. The leaders of Unity must remain alert to retain the freshness of youth and have the spiritual courage to continuously change and evolve to better serve the growing membership.

"The success of Unity depends upon people saying 'I didn't know that!"

HONOLULU, HAWAII — Stan Hampson, minister of Unity Church of Hawaii, Honolulu, shares the following report of this ministry's wonderful growth: "On July 28, we at Unity Church of Hawaii celebrated the topping off of our new Youth Education Building. In traditional Island style, the celebration began with the blowing of the conch shell; the children sang special music; we spoke the word of prayer to bless this new building:

and a string of 10,000 firecrackers was exploded, as is the local custom when the roof is up. This beautiful two-story building of eight multi-purpose classrooms is being constructed at a cost of \$260,000. We have only \$25,000 more to go to have the total amount. We have affirmed every step of the way, 'The miracle working power of God is building our Church.' By the time the building is completed in October, we will have it entirely paid for. We in Unity recognize the tradition of youth education, the major purpose of this addition to our church. In 1893, Myrtle Fillmore had her vision, 'Who will take care of the children?' We know in our church that our strength is in our youth. The younger the person in our church, the longer his exposure will be to the Truth principles. Also, a church with a strong youth program will extend its growth in numbers and prosperity. KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI — Mauritz Erhard, minister of Unity Northeast Church in Kansas City, Missouri, was the guest on an hour talk show July 18, 1974, aired over a local cable television system. The show was entitled "Exploring ESP" and the moderators extemporaneously discussed with Mauritz the Unity viewpoint on the practice and benefits of prayer and meditation. The history and activities of Silent Unity were also discussed. Dr. Stewart uses meditation techniques with his patients in much the same way as Dr. Carl Simonton who spoke at Healing Rally '74 in San Francisco last May. Betty Sikking, from our Vancouver ministry, led a three-hour afternoon session of Serendipity groups. featured "Dialogue with Ministers" followed by a salmon bake on the beach. Mary Fourchalk, minister of Unity In Action, New Westminster, British Columbia, conducted a Communion Service in the beautiful outdoor Cathedral of the Pines. Max Lafser, associate minister of Unity Church of Truth, Seattle, Washington, gave the Sunday morning address. GREAT LAKES REGIONAL PRAYER THOUGHT — "Jesus Christ is the Head of Great Lakes Regional Conference and we move forward in the Light." Our Regional President, Ruth Mosley, minister of West Side Unity Church, Detroit, Michigan, has requested that each member ministry in the Region hold the above prayer thought for the months of September, October, and November 1974.

REGIONAL YOUTH ADVISOR - The following is a summarized report on the workshops for Youth Sponsors, "Sharing Times with Sponsors," conducted this year by Dona Gilsdorf, Youth Advisor for the Great Lakes Region. A full day is These discussion sessions have proven to be utilized in presenting each workshop. very helpful in defining the responsibilities of the sponsors; the needs, attitudes, and goals of the Y.O.U. members; in providing time for sharing new educational material and teaching methods and techniques; service projects, conference, rallies, and social events are also given a place on the workshop agenda. A very well thought-out and prepared procedure on receiving feedback regarding the effectiveness of each workshop has been established. The results of such feedback indicated that the sponsors participating in the workshops found the sessions very helpful and recommend that the sessions be conducted at least once every six months, with additional emphasis on teaching techniques. Dona has also attended retreats sponsored by various Unity ministries and successfully led constructive rap sessions with the YOUers as well as the Young Adults.

DETROIT, MICHIGAN — Unity of the Infinite Presence in Detroit, where Jack Boland serves as minister, is experiencing such an overflow attendance that it has been necessary to expand the ministry's closed circuit television capabilities and install a new audio system. Jack reports that the ministry's usual seating capacity of 240 has been expanded to over 400 by utilizing closed circuit television. He feels that the greatly increased attendance on Sunday is a direct result of the heightened interest and attendance at the Wednesday evening classes conducted in the ministry. For example, an average of over 200 people attended the series of one-hour classes each Wednesday on "The Twelve Powers of Man." Currently, the Wednesday evening class is averaging over 300 persons each week for the recently inaugurated series of classes on prosperity.

SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS — Unity Church of Practical Christianity in Springfield, where Margaret Cain serves as minister, hosted on July 21 the annual Central Illinois Church Banquet. Held at the "Heritage House" in Springfield, this wonderful time of fellowship was attended by 115 Unity students from Decatur, Havana, Illiopolis, Jacksonville, Lincoln, Peoria, and Springfield. Bill Cameron, minister of Unity Church of Decatur, Illinois, gave the invocation. Rudy Leidig, minister of Christ Church Unity in Rockford, presented a Truth message.

IN MEMORIAM We have been advised that two members of the Association of Unity Churches, Beulah Scott and Everett A. Dell, have made their transition from this life experience and are now moving forward into the eternal life of Spirit.

Beulah Scott, ordained Unity minister who served for many years in the Yakima, Richland, and Pasco areas of Washington, made her transition July 25, 1974. Beulah originated the work in Yakima in the early 1930's and also taught classes in Boise, Idaho, and Mountain Home, Washington. After her retirement, she continued to teach classes on Whidbey Island in Puget Sound. We give thanks for her pioneering work, and see her continuing on the pathway of eternal life.

On August 3, 1974, Everett A. Dell, minister of Pontiac Unity Center in Michigan, made his transition. Active in all aspects of the teaching of Truth for the past twenty years, Everett served as platform assistant in Detroit, Michigan, prior to entering the ministry full-time. In 1962 he assumed the leadership of the Unity ministry in Pontiac and received ordination in 1964. We bless Everett in his ongoing and give thanks for his contribution of consciousness to the teaching of Truth.

### UNITY WORLD HEADQUARTERS ACTIVITIES CENTER

Construction of the Activities Center is rapidly progressing. The interior of the building is now taking definitive form. photograph at right was taken from a position inside the building which represents the entrance into the auditorium area. The interior height of the auditorium can be noted by referencing the relative size of the workers. In the background, the stage area is taking shape. In the foreground, along a line represented by the edge of that portion of the concrete floor already poured a folding partition will be installed to divide the auditorium into separate conference areas.





The view shown in the photograph to the left is from the southeast section of the balcony in the Activities Center. The dimensions of the stage area can be seen more clearly from this view. The worker shown in the upper left portion of the photograph is putting the finishing touches on the duct work for the heating and cooling system. The floor area in the upper portion of the photograph, to the immediate right of the worker, is the foundation for the equipment room of the auditorium. structural framework for the outside arches of the Activities Center can be seen in the unfinished portion of the wall shown in the left background.

BUILDING FUND Lester McClelland has shared the following idea which has been effectively utilized by Unity of Joplin to increase their building Based on the principle of prosperity demonstrated in the New Testament by fund. the parable of the Talents, the idea entailed withdrawing \$1,000 from the ministry's general fund and offering such monies to the congregation of Unity of Joplin to use as they deem appropriate as stewards of the funds. A reasonable time period The increase would go into the was established for the return of the funds. building fund and the original \$1,000 would be returned to the general fund. ministry prepared a Talent's Card upon which was pictured a treasure chest entitled A card was filled out for each person who accepted steward-"Chest of Talents." ship under this program, listing the person's name and address and the amount of money accepted. As part of the program, everyone who participates will have his or her name included on a card which will be placed in a small open treasure chest and enclosed in the hollow cornerstone of the new church building. display area inside the building will allow persons to view the enclosed treasure chest through a plastic window in the cornerstone. A bronze plaque explaining the project will be placed in the viewing area.

Some examples of how members of the congregation are utilizing the monies are: a ten year old girl accepted \$1 and purchased enough material to make bookmarks which she sold for \$12, returning the \$12 to the ministry; another person accepted \$5, collected driftwood from a local lake area, purchased straw flowers and other material with the \$5, and made decorative centerpieces which sold for an amount considerably higher than the cost; and another person accepted \$100, purchased gold, and at the end of a month sold the gold at a significant profit. The members of the congregation of this rapidly expanding Missouri ministry are also using many other creative, productive ways of increasing the amounts of monies they accepted under the project.

Les states that to date two-thirds of the original \$1,000 has been returned to the ministry along with an increase averaging \$2 for every \$1 accepted. In addition to doubling the original amount of monies, this concept of stewardship has greatly increased the congregation's interest and enthusiasm in its building project.

Kay Arndt, minister of Unity of Bellevue, Washington, is TEACHING TAPES establishing an outreach program using "teaching tapes" -cassettes and booklets, to interest prospective Unity students in the community. Using only the name MEDITATION CASSETTES, publicity stories and advertisements are being placed in local newspapers and in university and community college papers. Kay's subjects are: "How to Meditate," "Dynamics of Healing," "The Key to Abundance," and "How to Pray for Others." Professionally recorded, the cassettes contain theory on one side and a meditation experience on the other. aeronautical engineer and member of the Laymen's Professional Counsel, is the other voice on the tapes. Although this started out as a local service, the tapes have already found their way not only to Alaska and other states, but have also been translated into Dutch and currently are being used as class material in The Hague, Unity House in Bourne End, England, also has copies. Meditation Netherlands. Cassettes is one facet of a privately-funded endeavor called A/M Enterprises, Inc., designed to reach non-Unity people in a number of different ways and alert them to the fact that Unity is part of the local religious scene. More than 300 tapes have been distributed since the start of the program a few months ago.

### IDEA EXCHANGE Continued

Of interest to other Unity ministries as an idea for ministers to do, or to buy (\$5.00), is the most recent cassette — this is a dialogue between Kay and George Miller on the subject, "What is Unity." Newcomers to the Bellevue ministry have this available to them along with other material such as the AUC pamphlet "Twenty Questions About Unity." Kay believes the tape answers a need not only for people new to Unity, but also of long-time Truth students who want an explanation of the Unity way of life for family and friends.

A NEW BOOK BY JAMES DILLET FREEMAN: "LOVE, LOVED, LOVING!" James Dillet Freeman writes: "When I set out, I thought, I have to write a book about love that is not just a dry treatise or analysis of love, just another dull essay. I wanted to write something

imbued with love itself, so that people reading it would feel warm and excited. I think this book does this. It tells people what love is and how to love, but much more. It will make people feel that they are loved and that they want to love. It is a happy book."

Horne which appears in the September issue of UNITY Magazine: "Here is another book of beautiful poems and essays from the prolific pen of James Dillet Freeman, Director of Silent Unity, who is sometimes referred to as Unity's poet laureate. As the title implies, the work is an expression of the greatest thing in the world: love. The poems are carefully classified under various sections such as Love Is in Our Genes; What kind of Love is Love?; In a World Love Made; How Much Do You Love?; If I Do Not Have Love; Only Love Can Set You Free; Something in Us Tells Us; Moments of Love; Love Is a Passionate Pursuit; The Miracle of Love; A Man and a Woman; The Most Important Things; The Love of Power and the Power of Love; and others.

"Writing of the lack of love in the world, the author says: 'We are going to live pitiable half-lives and deprive ourselves of the rich and beautiful life we might have as long as we continue to cheat and lie and connive against each other and be unloving. . We turn ourselves into miserable misers of spirit, when we might be lovers and sons of love, and we turn the earth into an armed camp where it might be a paradise.' There are many things we need and want, he says. However, the desire to love and be loved transcends all other desires and needs. 'Human beings have to love one another whether they want to or not. Love is in our genes.' Love is human as well as divine, 'What makes me less than human is not my inability to think but my inability to love.'

"The author says we have survived as a species not because we have been violent but because we have been able to cooperate. During the history of man the violent have killed the violent, but the loving have continued to love. As a natural consequence the heirs of the human race have been getting less violent and more loving.

"Mr. Freeman expresses a thought that is sublimely beautiful when he says: 'I have never loved anyone or anything that my life was not deepended by that love. I was more and life was more because of the love that had been added to it. The least love gives to life a meaning all the non-love in the world cannot give it. The least love is worth more than all the non-love there is.' You will enjoy, appreciate, and profit by reading this beautiful book."

To restore normal answering you simply dial a special code.
