As a result of the positive response to this initial meeting, the ministry is conducting a three month course in biofeedback. During the weekend of September 13-15, a successful intensive biofeedback workshop directed toward persons involved in the helping professions, i.e., physicians, nurses, counselors, ministers, teachers, physical therapists, etc., was conducted by the ministry.

Kay Arndt reporting for the NORTHWEST REGION:

SPOKANE, WASHINGTON – Scott Sherman, minister of Unity Church of Truth, Spokane, Washington, invited the Northwest Ministers to "Expo City" for their 1974 Regional Conference, August 26-29. It was an exciting four days which included on Monday night a presentation of "A World of Unity" in the Boeing International Amphitheatre at Expo. More than 1200 people attended, the largest number of people ever to attend a function in this particular outdoor theatre during the World's Fair. "A World of Unity" was an inspiring and enthusiastic musical program featuring Charles King and Connie Haines.

The Conference continued the next day with regional business and on Wednesday, Kay Arndt and Jack Barker presented the first Post—Graduate Program on "Effective Presentation of Christian Healing" to ministers and licensed teachers in the Northwest. Two new regional programs were approved by the Conference Body: (1) To offer a tour to Tahiti for Northwest Truth students in the spring of 1975, and (2) to begin in October 1974 a U.I.C.E. Extension Pilot Program in the Northwest. The purpose of the Pilot Program is to co-ordinate classes being taught in all Northwest ministries, and to create more opportunity for students to experience different teachers within the region. It will also relieve the duplication of U.I.C.E. classes taught in each ministry. Three classes for credit are to be taught afternoons and evenings October 21-November 1 in Seattle; November 11-22 in Spokane; February 3-14 in Portland, Oregon; and February 17-28 in Vancouver, B.C., Canada.

During the Conference, five new members were officially welcomed to the Northwest Region: Lora McAfee, associate minister of Unity Church of Truth, Spokane, Washington; Carl Reams, associate minister of Unity Center, Portland, Oregon; Don Jennings, minister of Unity in the Olympics, Port Angeles, Washington; Sandra Cousens, minister of Unity Church of the Valley, Yakima, Washington; and Marnie Stewart, associate minister of Unity Centre of Practical Christianity, Vancouver, B.C., Canada. Newly

elected officers for the region are Sandra Cousens, Secretary, and Les Saunders, minister of Unity Center, Portland, Oregon, who was elected to serve as Alternate Regional Representative.

Don Gates, minister of San Leandro Unity Church, who hosted the meetings, and Ken Brabeau, minister of Unity Church of Merced, California, also participated in the opening activities. Robert Sikking presented an audiovisual program sharing the many ways in which the Association has grown since its inception and increased its services to our Movement. A beautifully prepared and most tasteful noon meal was prepared and served by the ladies of the San Leandro ministry. The workers really out did themselves!

The meeting closed with a blessing and a prayer for the Unity work worldwide and with a prayer of protection as each person prepared to return home. These Minister/Board meetings are becoming increasingly well-programed and accepted. Bob Sikking along with Don Gates and the people in the San Leandro ministry are to be congratulated for presenting a fine session. The next Minister/Board meeting for the N.C.M.C. will be held in Sacramento, California, at Christ Unity Church in early spring. Since many will have to necessarily drive quite a distance, the program will commence on a Friday night with dinner and entertainment. Sessions will begin early Saturday. This will afford time to discuss many more interesting ideas and important points of interest.

CANTON, OHIO — On September 8, 1974, Unity Church of Truth conducted their Sunday service in a new location. June Dorrell, minister of this growing Ohio ministry, reports Sunday meetings are now being held at the beautiful Stark County Historical Center in Canton. The building provides ample space for the Worship Service and a house next door owned by the Historical Center is ideal for the Sunday School. A kitchen adjacent to the main meeting room allows the continuation of a fellowship time following the service. In addition, there is plenty of parking space. We join with the members and friends of Unity Church of Truth in giving thanks for the expanding activity of Sprit in Canton.

One program utilized by our Canton ministry to explain how science and religion are becoming even more effective partners in helping people is a meditation course based upon biofeedback. June recently made a guest appearance on a Canton television program and discussed the marriage of science and religion. She feels that, while the half-hour program only allowed a surface treatment of the subject, the discussion was a positive and constructive response to the increased public interest in this type of biofeedback research. June also believes the television program gave her an excellent opportunity to introduce Unity viewpoints and teachings.

m COLUMBUS}$, OHIO — Last January Unity Church of Christianity purchased, and moved to, a twelve room house located on five acres of ground and began developing plans for construction of a new sanctuary. Those plans are now being implemented and on

August 24, 1974, a Ground Breaking Ceremony was held for the planned structure. Robert P. Sikking from the AUC office joined Curtis and Gladys Wilson, ministers in Columbus, in conducting this important ceremony. We give thanks for the expansion of the Unity teachings which this viable Ohio ministry is manifesting.

DECATUR, ILLINOIS — This past August an International Day of Repentance and Intercession was observed in each major city of the United States. With the principle services conducted in Washington, D.C., and Honolulu, Hawaii, these ecumenical calls to prayer had as their statement of purpose a belief in the power of prayer. Especially the belief in the strength of prayer demonstrated through the unity of Christians throughout the world. In Decatur, the observance was sponsored by the Decatur Christian Foundation.

In order to allow as many of the churches in Decatur as possible to participate in the call to prayer, four services were held. The Foundation chose William Cameron from the some 140 area churches to give the main address at the 11:00 a.m. service conducted in the First Lutheran Church. Bill is the minister of Unity Church of Decatur and shared the platform with representatives from AME, Lutheran, and Church of the Brethren ministries. Other services were held at different times in Catholic, Four Square, and Christian Churches. Bill's message which stressed love and forgiveness beginning with self and thus spreading to the community and to the world was very well received. We bless Bill for being the fine example of practical Christianity which he is, and congratulate him on this occasion of his receiving special recognition and honor from other members of the clergy in Decatur.

LOUISVILLE, KENTUCKY - Unity Temple of Louisville, where Frank Hanson serves as minister, hosted on August 9-11, 1974, an International New Thought Alliance (I.N.T.A.) Mini-Convention. The convention's theme was "Love Isn't Love Until You An activity of the Central Eastern District of the I.N.T.A., the convention was attended by over 100 persons with almost 200 present for the Sunday morning session. Other Unity ministers who participated in the programs were Jack Barker of New Thought Unity Center, Cincinnati, Ohio; Ginny Hinners, of Unity-bythe-Side-of-the-Road, Cincinnati, Ohio; and Ruth Cox of Unity Temple of Louisville. Also participating were ministers of other New Thought movement churches, and Surinder M. Bhatia, Executive Director of the I.N.T.A., from Hollywood, California. As program chairman for this year's Convention, Frank Hanson feels that the Convention was an experience in expanding consciousness and stated, "It involved an unbelievable amount of work, but it was worth it. When we consider that people came from as far as Columbus, Ohio, and Hammond, Indiana, to be with us, I would say we had generated some enthusiasm." The gathering was so well received by all persons involved that the group voted unanimously to conduct a similar convention next year. Eisenmenger, a member of the Board of Directors of Unity Temple of Louisville, was appointed Committee Chairman for the 1975 program which will be conducted next September in a state park in either Ohio or Kentucky.

SHEBOYGAN, WISCONSIN — Congratulations and special blessings are in order for Unity Christian Fellowship in Sheboygan, where **Donald Bould** serves as minister. The ministry's building mortgage has been completely paid off. In celebration of this important event in the ministry's history, a special Rededication Service was conducted on September 8, 1974, and a mortgage burning ceremony was performed.

AMARILLO, TEXAS — Every person of our worldwide family of the AUC will want to unite in consciousness and be supportive of our fellow members in Amarillo, Texas, who are meeting a special challenge. As shown in the photo reproduced above, the roof of the sanctuary of Unity on the High Plains caved-in on August 22, 1974, as a result of heavy rain. Genavee Campbell, minister, advises that the Board of Unity on the High Plains has met every Sunday since this occurrence to expedite the reestablishment of proper worship facilities. She said, "Everyone has pronounced it all good and there is a great spirit of 'we can't wait to see the good that's going to come out of it."

Genavee shared the following report of what happened: "On Thursday, August 22, I felt strongly moved to go into the sanctuary. It had been raining quite heavily for several days, and I wanted to inspect some places in the ceiling of some small rooms adjacent to the sanctuary that had leaked in the past. While in the main part of the sanctuary I looked up at the brand new ceiling, which we had been enjoying for several months, and noticed it had waves in it. I also discovered some small pieces of the ceiling had fallen in an aisle. While there I heard a loud noise that sounded as if something heavy had dropped upon the top of the roof. Returning

to my office I attempted to contact the man who installed the ceiling, but couldn't reach him. Sitting at my desk, I felt a great uneasiness. Thirty minutes later I heard a crash outside that sounded like two cars had collided. The children from the summer session of our Wee Wisdom Montessori School were outside with their teachers waiting to be picked up by their parents. Together with Barbara Moffitt, Directress of the School, who came running into my office, I got outside in time to see the roof of the sanctuary and the wall come tumbling down like a slow-motion movie.

"We are grateful no one was hurt. Most of the rest of the building complex was not damaged from the cave-in, but without the roof on the sanctuary, the rest of the structure could not be protected from the weather. We have been fortunate to be able to use the YWCA to conduct our Sunday service. Many people consider our August bulletin, which had been printed for a month, a collector's item because the title for the Sunday immediately following the roof collapse was 'AND THE WALLS CAME TUMBLING DOWN.'

"Thank each of you in the AUC ministries for your wonderful prayers, we can feel them enfolding us. It's certainly great to have friends like you—especially at a time like this."

RESULTS OF SONGBOOK SURVEY

Included in the July/August issue of CONTACT sent to each ministry, was a songbook survey sheet. The form was designed to indicate, when completed and returned

to the AUC office, the interest of our Association's member ministries in the new Unity songbook being prepared by the AUC. The survey form was not an order blank but would only be used as a guide in determining the number of songbooks to print. On the survey form each ministry was requested to indicate the number of songbooks desired and whether they preferred a hardback or a paperback edition.

To date the AUC office has received 93 responses which indicate a possible need of approximately 16,000 copies. The distribution of preferences as to binding style was 13,500 for the hardback edition and only 2,500 for the paperback.

Based upon the responses received it would not prove beneficial to print the songbook in paperback since the cost of printing such a relatively small quantity would be prohibitive. Therefore, unless additional responses are soon received which indicate a significantly greater desire for the paperback edition there will be some question as to whether paperback copies will be made available. This decision would be made by the AUC Executive Committee.

If you have not returned your completed copy of the survey sheet to the AUC office, please do so immediately in order that the decision reached may be based upon a more representative number of ministries.


LICENSED TEACHER RECOGNITIONS


During July and August 1974, the Ad Hoc Licensing and Ordination Committee met with and approved 15 applicants for Licensed Teacher Recognition. The Board
