SOUTHEAST UNITY
MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

Minister's Conference
was held October 20-24,

1974, at the Don CeSar Resort Hotel, St. Petersburg Beach, Florida. Our 1974 theme, "Advancing All Together," is descriptive of the character of our Conference. Among our many accomplishments, we were able to fully discuss the proposed changes to the AUC

Bylaws and forward specific recommendations to the AUC Board of Trustees. Additionally, we elected a new Regional Representative and Alternate, selected a Y.O.U. Regional Coordinator, conducted a Post-Graduate Program on "The Effective Presentation of Christian Healing," and settled all our business affairs for the current year. We were especially pleased to have Bob Stevens, President of the Association of Unity Churches, with us for the first two days of our Conference. Bob was the featured speaker for our opening program which was attended by over 500 Unity people from the Tampa Bay area.

The Southeast Regional Conference has prayerfully considered the proposed changes to the AUC Bylaws and forwarded recommendations to the Bylaws Committee.

The Southeast Region is delighted to report that Loren Flickenger, minister of Unity Church of Pompano Beach, Florida, was elected as our new Regional Representative. His three-year term of office will begin after the AUC Conference next summer. Jim Sherman, minister of Unity Truth Center in New Port Richey, Florida, and the Host for our 1974 Southeast Conference, was elected as the Alternate Regional Representative.

The development of the Youth of Unity was another subject which was given lengthy consideration. We are pleased to report that the Southeast Region has adopted the Y.O.U. Regional Coordinator system proposed by the AUC Board of Trustees. We

have committed ourselves to hiring an interested lay-person who will work for one year to help us determine the most constructive courses for future action. **Joan Goodman**, from Tampa, Florida, was unanimously elected to this position and will be prepared to give us a full report and recommendation at next year's Regional Conference in Venice, Florida.

Our "Christian Healing" Post-Graduate Program was challengingly presented by Charles Neal and Mary Hinkle, ministers of Unity Center of Practical Christianity in Miami, and Unity of the Gulf in Venice, respectively. Effective "workshop meetings" and short presentations by registrants kept the program stimulating and the pace lively.

In another program, we met for an "idea exchange." Those in attendance were encouraged to share any ideas relevant to our work. "Sermonettes," suggestions for classes, special services, radio work, advertising, and promotion were offered. There was something new for everyone.

Unfortunately, our intended cruise of Old Tampa Bay was thwarted by high winds and ten-foot seas--we embarrassingly admit that we never left the dock. This is not to imply that we had a rough time at our Conference--we did manage a pleasant picnic on the beach and an exquisite banquet on another day.

This Conference provided everyone in attendance with an opportunity to preview the site of our 1975 Southeast Unity Retreat. We are expecting 500-600 Unity people to share the facilities of the Don CeSar Hotel with us next August.

As we look back at our Conference, one thing is clear: our greatest feat had little to do with the schedule, the hotel facilities, or the business we conducted. Perhaps more than anything else, we came to an increased awareness of our own interrelatedness as Unity ministers and teachers. We were a "family"--and that made our experience together very special.

ATLANTA, GEORGIA — One service project of Unity Church of Christianity in Atlanta is to provide Unity literature and publications to local hospitals each month. Jay Dishman, minister of this AUC member ministry, has shared a letter which he recently received from Chaplain Dan E. Keels, Jr., of the Northside Hospital in Atlanta, a portion of which is reproduced below:

Dear Jay:

Again, let me thank you for your willingness to provide our hospital with 50 copies of "Daily Word" each month. As I mentioned in our conversation, I have been hesitant about distributing much religious literature throughout the hospital. However, after reading from one of the copies of "Daily Word" I was most impressed and feel very good about making it available to persons who pass through Northside Hospital.

We bless Jay and each member and friend of Unity Church of Christianity in Atlanta for their very effective service projects which are helping in a most loving way to fulfill the spiritual needs of the people in their community.

SANTURCE, PUERTO RICO - During the month of November the Associacion Unity de Cristianismo Practico de Puerto Rico celebrated its 24th anniversary. The ministry's building mortgage of \$183,000, which was payable in 15 years, has been completely In celebration of this important event in the history of the ministry, different activities and programs were conducted during the month of November. These special celebrations were initiated with a worker's prayer meeting and fellowship on Friday morning, November 1, with Ralph and Rosemary Rhea of Unity School's Radio and Television Department participating. On November 2, a Seminar on Communication was held under the leadership of Ralph and Rosemary. On Sunday, November 3, Robert P. Sikking spoke on "The Reality of Divine Order" and an anniversary banquet was held at the Caribe Hilton Hotel after the Worship Service. The President of the ministry's Board of Directors, participating with Conchita Melendez, Minister Emeritus, conducted a service on Sunday the 10th which brought the past and future of the ministry into the present. On Sunday the 17th, members of the different organizations within the ministry were in charge of the Worship Service. rededication service was held on the fourth Sunday of the month at which time new members were received. A Thanksgiving Day morning service was held, followed by a breakfast, and then groups from the ministry visited different welfare agencies in the area to share gifts and fellowship. All in all the month's activities were a wonderful manifestation of the love and dedication to Truth present in and through Associación Unity de Cristianismo Practico de Puerto Rico.

ST. PETERSBURG, FLORIDA — Nicholas Griffin, minister of First Unity Church in St. Petersburg, Florida, has shared the good news of the expansion of this Florida ministry. The members of First Unity Church voted at a special membership meeting on October 13, 1974, to authorize the ministry's Board of Directors to purchase a certain tract of land. The Board was also authorized to proceed with the sale of the existing church buildings and to move toward the eventual construction of a new church home. The ministry's prayer for this project is "Divine Order is at work. Through Spirit we meet every challenge!" We bless Nick and each member and friend of First Unity Church for their ever increasing ability to serve and join with them in affirming their prayer thought for their building program.

Kay Arndt reporting for the NORTHWEST REGION:

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON — An experimental program of local U.I.C.E. training was launched in the Northwest Region the last part of October and results thus far have proven quite encouraging. Twenty students signed up for the first series of classes, which were offered in Unity Church of Truth in Seattle. The program, which is being conducted with the blessings of Unity School and the AUC, is designed to make U.I.C.E. training more attractive and easier to participate in by bringing the teachers and classes to the students. It is based on an intensive two-week period of instruction by regional ministers and licensed teachers. Teachers for the first session were: Max Lafser, associate minister of Unity Church of Truth, Seattle; and licensed teachers Vesta Barth of Bremerton and Ruth Hetherington of Spekane. Other series are planned for Spokane, Portland, and Vancouver.

VANCOUVER, B.C. — Marnie Stewart, ordained minister from Vancouver, B.C., has organized a group of enthusiastic Truth students under the name of Unity of North Vancouver. Marnie says they are still "nomads without a home" and asks our prayers for the right place in which to hold services. Even the handicap of meeting in different quarters each Sunday has not dampened the enthusiasm and determination of those wonderful people. We bless Marnie and each member of the group and know that Divine Order is now being established in the outworking and expansion of this viable Unity work.

Berton Coffey reporting for the SOUTHWEST REGION:

HONOLULU, HAWAII — Unity Church of Hawaii reports the establishment by the ministry of The Natural Learning Center of Hawaii. This activity has been created to provide opportunities for explorers of inner space to work out their own transformations of self and consciousness. The Learning Center acknowledges that for most people real personal growth takes time, care, and attention, and that the Learning Center's programs can be no more than guideposts on the path, or warm safe spaces for the person to accelerate and illuminate his or her evolution. The Natural Learning Center of Hawaii aims to present quality programs led by competent professionals at the lowest fees consistent with Right Livelihood. These programs are designed for personal growth and are not offered as a substitute for ongoing therapy.

Stan Hampson, minister in Hawaii, reports that as its first program, the Learning Center, with the kind cooperation of the ministry, offered a "Sampler in The Exploration of Human Potentialities," a short course in various approaches to realizing a person's potential as a fully-functioning human being. The course was conducted in six evenings, 2 to 3 hours per evening. The "Human Potential" movement has innovated within the major traditions of psychology, religion, medicine, and the arts, and has borrowed and adapted from Eastern traditions. The program contained some of the significant approaches to increased awareness and fuller humanness. Each approach addressed itself to normal persons who wish to explore other ways of feeling and thinking about themselves and others. The course was not an attempt to do therapy. Instead, its purpose was to allow interested people to find out from experts what each approach may have to offer them. Further exploration, if desired, is up to each indi-The evening seesions tended toward a format of a brief talk, then demonstration or audience experience, and an opportunity for questions and discussion. began October 16, and continued until November 20, 1975. The enthusiasm with which this series was accepted has encouraged the Learning Center to continue with the development and presentation of future programs.

Charles Korfhage reporting for the NORTHERN CALIFORNIA REGION:

UNITY STUDENT'S RETREAT — On October 11, 12, and 13, 1974, more than 700 Unity students from Northern California met at Asilomar, one of California's state parks and one of the most beautiful areas on the Pacific Coast according to many people. The meetings were held in the main hall, Merrill Hall, and the huge dining hall provided delightful, delicious meals each of the three days. This was the Nineteenth Annual such students retreat of the Northern California Region and one of the best. Our guest speaker was Charles Neal, minister of Unity Center of Practical Christianity in Miami. Charles spoke three times, twice on Saturday and once at the Sunday morning service. His talks based on the theme of the retreat, "Understanding Unlimited," were great and very well received.

On Friday night a hospitality time was held. An excellent caller for the square dance was brought in from San Francisco and the dance floor of Merrill Hall was filled to capacity with all those taking part as well as others watching from the side lines. It was a great evening! At the Friday afternoon meeting the keynote address was made by Charles Korfhage, minister from Sacramento. He gave an enthusiastic boost to the three-day retreat and at the close of his address distributed copies of a unique "Identification Card" (see Idea Exchange section of this issue). Saturday was a very eventful After an early morning prayer service on the beach, around a great roaring fire and with the waves of the Pacific pounding on the shore, breakfast was served in the Joy songs preceded a talk by Charles Neal. Later the group divided into five smaller groups and, with two ministers to a group, dispersed to five different locations for discussions of subjects having to do with the overall subject "Understanding Unlimited," such as "Understanding Yourself," "Your Family," "Your Neighbors," etc. The process continued after lunch. Later in the afternoon the ministers of the region met for a business meeting. Following dinner an evening of informative approach was presented by David Williamson, minister of Unity Church of Richmond, California. Dave gave an excellent visual lesson on the "Twelve Powers of Man."

Sunday morning all gathered in the Great Hall for a Sunday morning Worship Service. Charles Neal gave the lesson. The choir, which was made up of about 25 of those in attendance who spontaneously offered to sing, did a beautiful job. The organist for the entire retreat, playing the organ at all meetings and services, was Eugene Sorflaten, minister of Unity Temple of Santa Cruz. Much love and blessings and praise must be given to all who helped to make this retreat the wonderful one it was. Our special thanks and blessing to Beulah Ornbaum, minister of Unity Church of Castro Valley, who handled the registrations beginning long before the actual date of the Asilomar Retreat. To process over 700 reservations, handling money and all that goes with such a job, was a great feat in itself. The Northern California ministers wish that all the Unity students everywhere could have been present at this great retreat. Perhaps you felt our blessings for we included each of you in our prayers and blessings.

RENO, NEVADA — Unity Ministry of Reno, where Carlton and Jacklyn Buboltz serve as ministers, hosted a Northern California Regional Y.O.U. Sponsors Conference entitled "Workshop for YOU" on October 26. Present at the meeting were representatives from: Unity Ministry of Reno, Nevada; Unity Church of the Oaks, Sacramento, California; Unity Christ Church, San Francisco, California; Christ Church, Unity, San Jose, California; and Unity Temple of Santa Cruz, California. Topics discussed included such subjects as "Teenager Profile," "The Teacher-Sponsor Profile," and "How to Profile." Ideas were shared on effective ways and methods of presenting lesson material in educational and interesting ways. Those participating felt that the meeting was very informative and well worth the time and effort.

The Buboltzs report that the ministry in Reno is growing and expanding by leaps and bounds. Indicative of the recent growth of this Unity ministry is the fact that the ministry's mailing list has increased 118% in three months. All of the names added to the mailing list were done so at the request of the individuals involved. We bless Carlton and Jackie for their fine efforts and dedication to serving the spiritual needs of their community.

SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA — Christ Church Unity in San Jose, had its first Spanish-speaking Unity meeting on Sunday afternoon, October 27. Warren and Marguerite Meyer, ministers, report that twenty enthusiastic people were present. The basis for the discussion was the Emmet Fox pamphlet "The Golden Key." After time for Truth consideration, light refreshments were served. It was the general consensus that after the first of the year these monthly meetings would be changed to two-amonth. For the past two years Christ Church Unity has presented its Spanish-speaking "Tele-Oracion" minute messages on the telephone which have become quite popular.

WALNUT CREEK, CALIFORNIA — In the summer of 1972, a little more than two years ago, the Unity ministry in Walnut Creek, California, was contained in a three-room white house and the congregation numbered near 100. This group of enthusiastic Truth students together with their minister, Carol Ruth Knox, prayerfully laid the ground work and made the necessary plans for expansion of the Unity work in their community. On October 20, 1974, Unity Center of Walnut Creek dedicated their latest addition to their building program which has since September 1972 been manifesting additional church facilities for the now 300 member congregation.

Participating in the dedication service with Carol and Pierre Gallardo, assistant minister, were Phil Stone, President of the Board of Directors of this growing California ministry; Dr. Hilary Anderson, Professor of Integral Counseling, California Institute of Asian Studies; John Minkler and Carolyn Cogan, Co-Directors of Synergy School; Richard Beyer, Department of Education, St. Mary's College; and David Williamson, minister of Unity Church of Richmond, California.

With the completion and dedication of the Youth Education Building, a third Sunday service has been added to provide for the growth in attendance. This 7:00 p.m. service led by Carol will be devoted only to music, meditation, and a message. The message will be different from the two morning messages; the music will be special and drawn from Carol's musical background. The Northern California Region congratulates and blesses Carol and Pierre and each member and friend of Unity Center of Walnut Creek for their ever unfolding and expanding consciousness of Truth and for their willingness to be of service to each other and to others.




UNITY WORLD HEADQUARTERS ACTIVITIES CENTER



CHRISTMAS GIFTS TO MINISTERS

The following letter to Ann Landers, syndicated columnist for Field Enterprises, Inc., recently appeared in the local newspaper of one of our AUC members. A copy was

graciously forwarded to us with the suggestion that other members of the Association might also find it interesting.

Dear Ann Landers: I'm a busy physician and I have put off writing this letter since last Christmas. Now I am on vacation and have resolved to get it done.

In my practice I have a number of ministers, their wives and children. A number of years ago I took notice that most of them were overweight. In my conversations regarding their eating habits, I learned something that might be of value to your readers.

Last Christmas our own pastor received 34 pounds of chocolates, eight fruit cakes, 31 tins of home-made fudge, peanut brittle and cookies, dozens of jars of honey, jellies, jams pies, layer cakes. A grand total of at least 30,000 calories for each member of the family! When I asked my own wife what we gave our minister she said proudly, "I sent away for that wonderful, expensive candy we get from New York and I presented him with a five-pound box!"

I discussed the matter with a few men in our church and we decided to contact other members, pool our money and send our good minister and his family on a summer vacation. Doesn't this make more sense than stuffing them full of rich food? I recommend this plan for all church members everywhere. I have yet to meet a minister who wasn't enthusiastic about the idea. Our own pastor and his family were thrilled.
