Kay Arndt reporting for the NORTHWEST REGION:

SEATTLE, WASHINGTON — Another in a series of very productive meetings involving ministers and ministry Board members in the Seattle area was held in Unity Church of Truth in Seattle on Saturday, November 9, 1974. Grover Thornsberry and Max Lafser were the host ministers. These Board/Minister meetings have been conducted twice a year in the Seattle area and have played an important part in bringing about a better rapport among all attending. The November meeting included a "Serendipity Experience" program

led by Michael Murphy, minister of Unity Church of Christianity in Seattle, and Betty Sikking, wife of Thomas Sikking, minister of Unity Centre of Practical Christianity in Vancouver, British Columbia.

CINCINNATI, OHIO — The 68th Annual Interfaith Thanksgiving Service was conducted in Cincinnati, Ohio, on November 28, 1974. New Thought Unity Center, our Cincinnati ministry served by Jack Barker, participated in this ecumenical activity which was held at St. John's Unitarian Church. The guest speaker for the service was Rabbi Leonard B. Troupp. Jack advises us that this service is the oldest interfaith activity in the City of Cincinnati and adds a great deal to the dedicated time of praise and thanksgiving entered into by all who participate in the service.

DETROIT, MICHIGAN — This past fall the members of the Youth of Unity, the youth group of Detroit Unity Association, successfully conducted a service project which not only helped to beautify their community but also provided a considerable amount of monies for a worthy cause. Glenn Mosley, minister of this progressive Unity ministry, shared the good news that the ministry's Y.O.U. raised \$1,500 for Detroit's Sickle Cell Anemia Detection Center by raking leaves in northwest Detroit. The project, which spanned a three week period in November, captured the attention of not only the local residential area but was featured by THE DETROIT NEWS, which carried a large photograph of the Y.O.U. members engaged in their service project and a fine write-up about the project.

EVANSTON, ILLINOIS — Unity Church on the North Shore, where **Bob Means** serves as minister, recently completed an expansion project. This past November the ministry began using their new beautiful and functional Garden Room. Bob states, "We now have a true learning center of Truth for all. Classrooms are provided for our expanding Sunday School as well as adequate classrooms for adult classes. The beauty of the Garden Room provides a perfect environment for learning. A folding partition also allows the facility to be utilized for large meetings and social functions." We give thanks for Bob and for the continuing growth and expansion of our Unity ministry in Evanston.

SAINT LOUIS, MISSOURI — On Saturday, November 16, 1974, some 60 Unity ministers, Board members, and their spouses met at Unity Christ Church in Saint Louis for a Great Lakes Sub-regional Board/Minister meeting. Donald O'Connor served as the host minister. Each of the Unity ministries in the Greater Saint Louis area was represented as well as the Unity ministries in Springfield and Decatur, Illinois. Included in the program was a most informative and much appreciated audio-visual presentation by Bob Sikking on the AUC. A delicious noon meal was prepared and served by the women of Unity Christ Church.

### Angelo Giordani reporting for the EASTERN REGION:

RICHMOND, VIRGINIA — Unity Center Richmond hosted on October 11–12, 1974, a dynamic and highly productive Sunday School Seminar. Conducted by **Milly Collins**, the two day program was attended by representatives of the Richmond ministry and of Unity of Fairfax, Virginia, and Unity Church of Tidewater in Virginia Beach, Virginia.

ROANOKE, VIRGINIA — "UNITY — A WAY OF LIFE" is the title of a new half-hour television program being produced for showing in 1975 by WDBJ Television in Roanoke, Virginia. The program will be presented by Alan and Kathryn Rowbotham, ministers of Unity of Roanoke Valley. The first series which will run thirteen weeks, began on January 5, 1975, and there is a possibility of a continuing program during the remainder of the year.

The entire cost of production for this program has been undertaken by WDBJ TV. Their aim is to provide a different, low-key, approach to religion in contrast to, and as a realistic alternative to, the usual evangelistic approach of the paid religious programs. The Rowbothams feel that the fine quality of the one-minute "The Word" spots received from Unity and aired on this same TV station, have been greatly responsible for this tremendous opportunity offered to Unity of Roanoke Valley. James Lewis reporting for the SOUTH CENTRAL REGION:

SAN ANTONIO, TEXAS — Norman Olsson, minister of Unity Church of San Antonio, Texas, has announced that the San Antonio ministry will soon have its own spiritual home. The ministry's Board of Trustees recently unanimously approved the purchase of an existing church facility. The present owners and occupants of the to be acquired facility will be vacating the premises about July. The San Antonio ministry's new home comprises 7/10 of an acre of land, with enough parking on ground and adjacent areas for up to 200 cars. There is an adjoining acre of land that could be acquired in the future as expansion needs dictate. Two buildings are on the property. The main building is the sanctuary, eleven years old, of durable brick construction, vaulted "stran-steel" beam roof, with newer central heat and air-conditioning system. Double entry doors open to a foyer with an office on each side. Seating will accommodate 240 people. Beyond the church building is a concrete block educational-social building that will provide for an expanded Sunday School, classes, and social activities. Norman states that the new facility will permit the ministry to adequately accommodate more than double its present attendance.

### Paul Barrett reporting for the SOUTHEASTERN REGION:

CHATTANOOGA, TENNESSEE - Unity Center of Practical Christianity in Chattanooga, Tennessee (see photo of ministry at right), now served by Dana Voght, is one of our newest full-time ministries. The Chattanooga ministry was started as an outreach program of Unity Church of Christianity in Atlanta, Georgia. Jay Dishman, minister in Atlanta, traveled some 130 miles every Thursday evening in order to serve the spiritual needs of the Unity congregation in Chattanooga before the full-time ministry was established. We bless Jay for his dedication to Truth and give thanks for his continuing willingness to expand the Unity Movement through establishment of study groups.

August, Dana and the members and friends of Unity Center of Practical Christianity have worked together to refurbish the ministry's building facilities. The eleven rooms of the facility now include a chapel, three Sunday School rooms, an office for the minister, a foyer, a kitchen, 2 bathrooms, and comfortable quarters for Dana. Dana reports that the ministry is rapidly growing and an average

of over 30 people now attend the Sunday service. In addition to the Worship Service, the ministry is conducting an active prayer ministry, Y.O.U., Sunday School, Thursday evening healing class and service. With "Majestic Heritage" as the ministry's by-words this fine work in Chattanooga is moving forward to meet the spiritual needs of their community. We bless them for their vision of growth and for their faith which is now manifesting that vision.

### Charles Korfhage reporting for the NORTHERN CALIFORNIA REGION:

RENO, NEVADA — Carlton and Jacklyn Buboltz, ministers of Unity Ministry of Reno, began in December an outreach work in Tahoe City, California. The meetings are held in the Rideout School in Tahoe City and are being conducted under the name UNITY OF LAKE TAHOE. Carlton and Jacklyn advised that this expansion project is but the first of two planned by the Reno ministry. We bless the Buboltzes as their ministry of service reaches out to additional communities.

SAN RAFAEL, CALIFORNIA — Sunday, November 17, 1974, was a very special day for Unity-in-Marin, where Candida Wright serves as minister. On this particular Sunday, the ministry celebrated its TENTH ANNIVERSARY. Elinor Johnson, a charter member of the ministry and its soloist during these ten years, sang at the Anniversary Service conducted by Candida. A time of fellowship and a luncheon followed the service.

WALNUT CREEK, CALIFORNIA — In response to an increased local interest for more knowledge in the field of health and the process of healing, the Institute of Mystical and Parapsychological Studies at John F. Kennedy University in Martinez, California, is offering a series of one day seminars entitled "The Body and the Art of Healing." The five-part series, which began in October and will continue once a month through February, is being conducted at Unity Center of Walnut Creek. Carol Knox, minister of Unity Center of Walnut Creek, conducted the first of these sessions and presented an overview of the theories and methods of spiritual healing, focusing on recent scientific discoveries concerning the healing mechanisms of the body. Since the series is being conducted under the auspices of a university, persons attending the series are eligible to receive college credit. Registration and tuition arrangements were handled by John F. Kennedy University.

In addition to Carol, four other guest lecturers have or will share their experiences and insights into the nature of health and disease, and interpret the spiritual principles and laws which govern the healing process. Each portion of the series is conducted at the Unity ministry and features a lecture in the morning session. A noon luncheon is served after which time is devoted to discussion, and demonstrations of methods and techniques of healing. Carol feels that having the series conducted in the Unity Center of Walnut Creek provides an excellent introduction to her Unity ministry. Considerable publicity was given to the series and to the Walnut Creek ministry both by releases from John F. Kennedy University and through extensive feature article coverage in local area newspapers.

IN MEMORIAM

The AUC office has been advised of the transitions in December of Lillian M. Cook and Georgiana Tree West. We know that each member of our Association joins in blessing these fine Unity ministers as they continue in their spiritual ongoing.

Lillian M. Cook made her transition on December 26, 1974, in Tucson, Arizona. A Memorial Service was held for Lillian on January 15, 1975, at Unity Church of Truth in Great Falls, Montana. Lillian began her ministry in Great Falls in 1945 and served there until 1955. She then moved to Arizona and served in the Unity ministry in Tucson until her retirement.

Georgiana Tree West made her transition on December 15, 1974, in Cleveland, Ohio. Associated with Unity since 1924, Georgiana served Unity ministries in Kentucky, New York, and New Jersey. In 1928 she founded the Unity ministry in New York City and served there until her retirement in 1957. A widely published Unity author, Georgiana served the Unity Movement in many capacities and was president in 1938 of the organization of Unity ministers which preceded the establishment of both the UMA and AUC.

### BLUE CROSS/BLUE SHIELD MEDICARE TIE-IN-PLAN

The AUC office has just received notice that the Blue Cross and Blue Shield program which supplements Medicare (the Medicare TIE-IN-PLAN) is being expanded

again. This expansion will cover the increased deductibles which the Social Security Administration has announced will take effect with benefit periods beginning on or after January 1, 1975. These higher deductibles, all in the Part A (hospital care) portion of Medicare, are. . .

Hospital Inpatient Care:

- (a) The first \$92 of hospital charges (was \$84) each spell of illness;
- (b) \$23 a day (was \$21) for the 61st through the 90th hospital day each spell of illness;
- (c) \$46 a day (was \$42) of hospital charges for the 60 "lifetime reserve" days;

Post-Hospital Extended Care (in a facility such as a skilled nursing home): \$11.50 a day (was \$10.50) for the 21st through the 100th day of care in a skilled nursing facility.

In their letter advising us of this change, the Blue Cross/Blue Shield Company stated: "Although Tie-In-Plan benefits will pay these increased deductibles at no increase in dues now, it may be necessary to adjust dues sometime in 1975. There has been no change in Tie-In-Plan dues since 1971. Yet, Tie-In-Plan benefits have been expanded every year to cover deductibles which, as of January 1, 1975, will have increased over 50% since 1971. The Medicare deductibles may now prove to be more than the existing Tie-In-Plan dues structure can cover, and we are following the situation closely. You and your group members may be sure, though, that we will NOT increase dues until and unless it is absolutely necessary to do so."

If the increase in dues is necessitated, such increase will ONLY apply to those of our AUC members who have the Medicare Tie-In-Plan. An increase in dues for the Medicare Tie-In-Plan will not cause a blanket increase in dues for all of our members. The AUC Ethics Committee while meeting in session at Unity Village during our Conference this past June discussed a project which the members of the Committee felt would be of

value to each member of our Association. The project was to develop a series of statements based upon the Code of Ethics of the Association of Unity Churches which, when accepted and affirmed by each member of the Association, would constitute an individual and collective affirmation of responsibility. The objective of the project was to place into the hands of each member of the AUC a copy of such "Affirmation of Responsibility" printed on paper suitable for framing. Under the leadership and guidance of the Ethics Committee Chairman, Larry Kendrick, minister of Unity Church of Truth in Syracuse, New York, a draft of the project was prepared and presented to the Board of Trustees of the AUC, who wholeheartedly approved the project in principle and referred it to the Executive Committee for finalization. The Executive Committee has been working closely with Larry Kendrick and final copy of an affirmation of responsibility entitled "I AM UNITY" has received unanimous approval by those involved in the project. An 8½" X 11" copy of "I AM UNITY" printed on parchtex paper is enclosed with each mailing of this issue of CONTACT. We recognize, appreciate, and bless Larry and each member of the Ethics Committee and each other person who assisted in this project for their fine work in bringing this inspiring document into manifestation.

# Book Rack

BOOKS-KEYS TO WISDOM'S TREASURE Hush R. Horne offers the following thoughts regarding books: Cicero once said, "A (man) without books is a body without a soul." Books are keys to wisdom's treasure, and gates to lands of pleasure. Francis Bacon said, "Some books are to be tasted, others to be swallowed, and some few to be chewed and digested."

It takes two to make a book—an author and a reader. The author puts himself into words but the words are not complete until they have been translated into the reader. Those who do not read good books have no advantage over those who cannot read them.

An ancient Egyptian king wrote over his library, "The Medicines of the Soul." The fate of civilization, as we understand it, is bound up with the fate of good books; and the fate of good books depends upon the existence of a permanent nucleus of readers who are artists in their approach to books—those determined to remain so, regardless of what restrictions are attempted or imposed. These will be the guardians of human consciousness, trustees of the arts of loving, to whom writers, who are artists, will appeal and be responsible.

Richard De Bury has said: "Books are masters who instruct us without rods... without words or anger, without bread or money. If you approach them, they are not asleep; if you seek them, they do not hide; if you blunder, they do not scold; if you are ignorant, they do not laugh at you."

Books are telescopes, compasses, sextants, and charts which men have prepared to help us navigate the dangerous seas of human life. If all the neglected books were dusted simultaneously, we would possibly have a record dust storm, with the sun going into eclipse for a whole day!

When a small boy saw a Bible, which is often called the book of books, covered with dust lying on a shelf in his home, he asked his mother whose book it was. "It is God's book," she said. "Well," the boy commented, "don't you think we should return it? Nobody seems to read it here!"

The world of books is the most remarkable creation of man. Nothing else that he builds lasts so long. Monuments fall, nations perish, civilizations grow old and die out, and after an era of darkness new races build others. But in the world of books are volumes that have seen this happen again and again, and yet live on—still young, still as fresh as the day they were written, still telling men's hearts of the hearts of men who have been gone for centuries now. Books can be friends. Come, let us read!

### U.I.C.E SCHEDULE FOR 1975

The Unity Institute for Continuing Education (UICE) has expanded its 1975 schedule to include the following five sessions:

Session I March 8-21
Session II June 28-July 11
Session IV July 12-25
Session V October 11-24

Those students who need certain courses to complete their UICE credits should check with UICE for up-to-date schedules in order to make certain that these courses will be offered during the session they plan to attend.

A special feature of the March and October Sessions in 1975 will be the offering of both Part 1 and Part 2 of certain courses in 2-hour classes. This will enable the student to take both parts of the course at one session instead of attending two sessions as was formerly necessary.

In offering five sessions in the Unity Institute for Continuing Education some changes in class scheduling are necessary. New in 1975 will be 2-hour classes so that a course may be completed in one 2-week session. This means that Part 1 and Part 2 of a course may be taken in one 2-week session, rather than taking Part 1 in one 2-week session and Part 2 in another 2-week session. When Part 1 and 2 are taught as one course in a two week period, UICE will only accept students for the entire two week period. The student who has had Part 1 previously will be required to sit in on the first part, but will not have to do the assignments over again for that part. These composite courses will be offered in Sessions I, II, and V. Some will be offered in Sessions III and IV so that those who need the other half of a course will be able to get it. When a class is presented in 2-hour sessions, the 2-hour class will earn the student the same credit as two 1-hour sessions. In taking the composite courses it is recommended that a student take 1 fundamental course, 1 Bible course, and 3 elective courses, some of which should be light, such as Joy Songs and Exercises. ### NEW REQUIRED U.I.C.E. CLASS FOR ALL PROSPECTIVE LICENSED TEACHERS

One of the responsibilities of the Association of Unity Churches is the licensing of Unity teachers. When a graduate from UICE becomes a licensed teacher, he or she also becomes a

member of our Association. For this reason, it is important that each licensed teacher be apprised of the responsibilities and privileges which membership in the AUC imparts. This area of knowledge and study has often been overlooked in the educationary process of preparing persons for licensed teacher recognition.

Therefore, beginning this year all prospective licensed teachers will be required to take a new class called, Licensed Teacher Orientation. It is necessary that this class be taken in the year the student applies to the AUC for licensed teacher recognition. The class will consist of two, two-hour sessions and will be taught by Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director of the Association of Unity Churches. This will be a non-credit class with no papers, taught in a seminar fashion. The hours for the class will not be pre-scheduled, but will be arranged at registration time. Anyone graduating from UICE this year, and planning to apply for licensed teacher recognition, should be sure to keep this class in mind, and schedule his or her time accordingly. The class is also open to anyone else who would like to attend.





### UNITY WORLD HEADQUARTERS ACTIVITIES CENTER

The new Unity Inn is nearing completion. The move from the present Inn to the new facilities will be accomplished during the month of February. The photo at right shows the interior of one of the areas which may be utilized as a private banquet room. The new Inn is constructed in such a way as to allow the dining area to be separated by movable divider walls into as many as four areas of various sizes. The three section private dining area will seat a total



of 188 persons. This area may be further divided into separate banquet rooms having seating for approximately 84, 44, and 60 persons. Each banquet room has an entrance from the outside as well as an inside entrance from a main hall. Each room has its own coat closet, public address system, and temperature and lighting controls. The tables and chairs are wood. The chairs are upholstered in a rust colored Naugahyde. The table tops are inlaid with a vinyl, in a contrasting color. Beautiful carpeting harmonizes with the overall decor. We know that each AUC member is eagerly looking forward to dining in the new Unity Inn during our AUC Conference this June. Our Conference Banquet is also scheduled to be held in the new Inn.



Among the many new pieces of modern equipment in the kitchen of the new Unity Inn are the three units pictured at left. At the left in the photograph is a large steam kettle. The double steam kettle unit provides additional cooking capability. The unit at the right is a steam pressure cooker for fast, efficient cooking of frozen vegetables.



IDEA FOR EASTER SERVICE
Ray Eversole, minister of Unity of Lake Worth,
Florida, submitted the following item for communication to his fellow members of the Association. Ray writes, "In our wonderful
attitude of sharing our good with other like minded Truth Students, I would like to
share an idea that I have found to be extremely effective during our EASTER Service.

"I know that most use a cross at Easter in some form or other. Most are familiar with putting flowers on a cross. Previous to Easter our hostesses and secretaries cut slips of paper into two inch squares upon which have been printed "WORDS OF JESUS." These squares are of different colored paper and we try to color code them in accordance with the different persuasion of color on the individual. In the week before Easter, the papers are folded (not tightly but at the tip of the center folds) and placed on the Styrofoam cross (of any size that you might choose) so that the appearance is that of a cross covered with flowers.

"During the service the congregation is invited to come forward and take a message from the cross and to let the consciousness choose the message that is personally for them. As the messages are taken from the cross and it becomes vacant, there is a spiritual feeling that Jesus has risen from the cross and now lives; in the hearts and minds of those who have received the message, INDEED, JESUS CHRIST LIVES. It is one of the most moving and inspirational and personal experiences that my congregations have ever experienced in Unity. You might like to try it."
