

LOWELL FILLMORE - IN MEMORIAM Continued

Lowell Fillmore, President Emeritus of Unity School of Christianity, made his transition Sunday, March 9, 1975, at St. Luke's Hospital in Kansas City. Lowell was ninety-three (93) years of age and resided at Unity Village.

Lowell, eldest son of Charles and Myrtle Fillmore, co-founders of Unity School, was born in Pueblo, Colorado, in 1882. At the age of two, he moved with his parents to Kansas City where he resided until his move in 1928 to Unity Village, Missouri.

Lowell served as president of Unity School of Christianity from 1948 to 1972 when he became President Emeritus, a position he held until his death. Before accepting the position of president he was treasurer of the Unity School organization.

Employed by Unity School in 1899 following his graduation from high school, Lowell served the Unity movement continuously for seventy-five (75) years and was active in the Unity work until the time of his death. In 1909 Lowell founded WEEKLY UNITY magazine, and served as its editor until it was consolidated in 1972 with UNITY magazine. He was well-known for his writings in various Unity publications and for three books which he authored: Things to be Remembered; The Prayer Way to Health, Wealth, and Happiness; and New Ways to Solve Old Problems. He was frequently a guest speaker and lecturer throughout the United States and Canada.

Lowell was a member of the first Board of Directors of Unity School of Christianity and served on the Board until his death. He had been a member of the Board of Trustees of Unity Village since the municipality was incorporated in 1953. He was chairman of the building committee that planned and erected Unity Temple on the Plaza, and was a member of the Temple's Board of Directors from its founding.

He was the recipient of the 1970 International New Thought Alliance Award for outstanding leadership and example among New Thought churches. In 1965 he received the Lee's Summit Centennial Civic Award.

Lowell is survived by his wife, Alice Lee Fillmore. Lowell and Alice observed this year on Valentine's Day the forty-ninth (49) anniversary of their wedding. Although they had no children, a niece Frances Fillmore, daughter of the late Royal Fillmore, lived with Mr. and Mrs. Fillmore throughout her childhood and until her marriage to J. Robert Lakin.

A Memorial Service for Lowell was conducted on March 12, by J. Sig Paulson in the Unity World Headquarters Activities Center at Unity Village.

Lowell's proximity to the AUC offices made him a regular visitor and a dear friend to each staff member. When at his desk he always participated in the Daily Word meditation time of the AUC staff. For many years Lowell was an ordaining officer for our Unity ministers, extending his special blessing through us individually to the part we play in the Movement. Your consciousness of blessings to Lowell in his eternal ongoing and to Alice and the rest of the family will be very meaningful. The love that we share within the Unity family was certainly the keynote of Lowell's life and ministry.







Charles Korfhage reporting for the NORTHERN CALIFORNIA REGION:

SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA — Christ Unity Church in Sacramento, where Phil and Dorothy Pierson and Charles Korfhage serve as ministers, have shared with us the news that the ministry has signed a lease for new facilities for the Unity group at Auburn, California. The new facilities in Auburn are large enough for a book room activity,

a meeting place for classes, and a Sunday morning service. The facilities are located in a new commercial mall and are next to the mall's theatre entrance thus providing maximum visibility for the Auburn activities. Charles Korfhage will conduct Sunday services in Auburn. Dorothy Pierson is conducting classes in Auburn each Thursday morning. We know each member of our Association blesses these dedicated ministers as they continue to expand the outreach activities of Christ Unity Church.

SAN JOSE, CALIFORNIA - Christ Church Unity in San Jose, where Warren and Marguerite Meyer serve as ministers, is helping to meet the spiritual needs of the Spanish speaking Unity students in the San Jose area by conducting monthly meetings in the Spanish language. Presently, Warren is teaching a Sunday afternoon class with one of the Unity students functioning as translator. The class is studying May Rowland's book "Dare to Believe." Warren and Marguerite report that a Fiesta — Pot Luck Supper was recently held in conjunction with the meeting of the class and added greatly to the spirit of fellowship always present within this group. The Spanish food and delicacies were enjoyed by all who attended.

CINCINNATI, OHIO — Ginny Hinners, minister of Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road in Cincinnati has shared a report with us regarding the Worship Task Force of the Southeastern Ecumenical Ministry (SEM). This association is made up of the clergy from the 26 churches in the Cincinnati area that are members of SEM. The association traditionally conducts an early afternoon Good Friday Service at a local commercial mall. This year Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road has been asked to furnish the musical portion of the program. On the evening of Good Friday the ministry conducted a candle lighting service at SEM Villa's beautiful chapel.

DETROIT, MICHIGAN - Evidence of the tremendous growth and expansion manifested by Unity of the Infinite Presence, Detroit, is the wonderful report on the ministry recently shared by Jack Boland, leader of this Detroit ministry. The ministry's 1974 attendance figures show an increase of 50% over 1973. The number of persons taken into membership in 1974 was over four times that of 1973 and the 1974 gross income of the ministry was in excess of twice the amount received in 1973. The ministry made great strides forward in improving and enlarging its facilities including air-conditioning the ministry, installing closed-circuit television, the addition of two new classrooms for Children's Church, and the purchase of a residence next door to the church. Also indicative of this ministry's ever expanding abilities to meet the spiritual needs of people in their area is the fantastic growth in usage of the ministry's Dial-A-Thought. During 1974, two additional Dial-A-Thought machines were purchased, making a total for the ministry of 8 machines, and an additional telephone line was installed making a total of 6 lines available. The Dial-A-Thought message which is changed daily is heard by an average of over 1,600 callers each day with some days reaching a peak of 2,000. As a result of the Dial-A-Thought, many groups in the Detroit area have requested Jack and Wes Wallin, associate minister of Unity of the Infinite Presence, to be their guest speakers.

Kay Arndt reporting for the NORTHWEST REGION:

PORTLAND, OREGON — Les Saunders, minister of Unity Center in Portland, Oregon, participated in a special conference on career education during the weekend of January 30—February 1, 1975. The Oregon State Board of Education and Portland State University jointly extended the invitation to Les to participate in the conference which was entitled SYNCON. Les was the only minister among the 60 persons invited to attend

this assemblage. Initially the people were divided into six groups with each group considering questions about the current status of Career Education as perceived in the various educational agencies, institutions, and communities of the greater Portland metropolitan area. Les reports that he was in a group labeled as "Professionals." Other groups were categorized under such headings as: government, educators, industry, and social services. After the group discussion period, the entire assemblage came together for a general assembly discussion designed to correlate different view points. The final reports are to be made available to local school districts, intermediate education districts, community colleges, State Department of Education, and others interested in the conference. Les states that he found the experience to be very enjoyable and personally enriching. We bless Les for being a fine representative of not only the ministry in general but in particular the Unity ministry which we all love so much.

On Monday evening, June 16, 1975, Dr. Loomis will present his program entitled "Healing The Whole Man" to our Conference body. He will speak on the meaning of the whole person and discuss natural healing techniques through art, exercise, and nutrition. As a part of his presentation, Dr. Loomis will show a film which he made recently in Europe.

This film developed jointly with the Charles and Myrtle Fillmore Foundation, features other renowned persons such as Roberto Assagiloi, M.D., and psychiatrist of psychosynthesis fame;

Dr. Loomis is well-known by Unity students throughout the world. Earlier this year, he co-authored with J. Sig Paulson a book which explores the physical, mental, and spiritual elements that make us the complete human being. Entitled "HEALING FOR EVERYONE, Medicine of the Whole Person," the book was published by Hawthorne Books, Inc.

Dr. Loomis' program will be open to the public, however, a special section of the Activities Center will be reserved for our Conference body.


PUBLIC RELATIONS DEPARTMENT

- 1. Gather, organize, and disseminate newsworthy items to the various news media regarding programs and activities conducted at Unity Village;
- 2. Operation of the Tour Guide Department;
- 3. Operation of the Speakers Bureau, including the processing of requests for speakers, and the establishment and maintenance of publicity files on those Unity School employees en-

gaged in this type of activity;



5. Handle requests for general information about the Unity Movement.

Bill Dale, Public Relations Director for the Association of Unity Churches, has assumed the additional responsibilities of managing and directing the public relations activities of Unity School. A REPORT FROM JACQUELINE NEAL, YOU COORDINATOR

In the next few months, the Youth of Unity will be having their "Official" Regional Y.O.U. Rallies. The hosting ministries have worked and are working diligently to have great rally programs. The enthusiasm, spirit of cooperation, and togetherness rally planning generates is a precious growth experience for those chapters so involved. We know that the 1975 Rallies will be all the good things that we expect and much more.

The "Official" Regional Rally is held once a year. A majority of chapters in the same region are present in order to conduct an official business meeting. The Regional Representative and Alternate are elected at this time. Each Regional Coordinator is present at his or her particular rally. The AUC YOU Coordinator will attend all nine of the rallies and present a report on the plans, projects, and programs evolving in Y.O.U.

PURPOSE OF RALLIES

We seek through rallies to help each individual to have a greater awareness of his divine nature, and to grow in spiritual stature. Rally programs are to be spiritually orientated, and provide for an educational experience as well as meaningful and creative expressions and fellowship.

Rallies are also designed to develop a closer contact among the chapters, to exchange ideas, to facilitate the establishment of new chapters, and to discuss and evolve plans and methods for furthering the growth of local chapters.

WHO ATTENDS RALLIES?

Any young person between the ages of fourteen and eighteen who is a member of a Y.O.U. group is eligible to attend a rally and vote.

We recognize and accept young people from non-chartered groups affiliated with the AUC as guests at rallies. Special guests from non-affiliated youth groups are also accepted. These guests fill the same registration qualifications and requirements as all delegates attending the rallies. Guests are, however, not voting members.

All young people from Y.O.U. Chapters affiliated with the AUC are the first to fill any quota to a rally.

Dates are confirmed through the AUC YOU Coordinator for "Official" rallies and through Regional Coordinators for all other types of rallies.

RESPONSIBILITY FOR RALLY

PENSACOLA, FLORIDA - Unity Church of Christ in Pensacola, where Dorothy Thomas serves as minister, was highlighted in a feature article which appeared in the February 1, 1975, edition of The Pensacola Journal. The excellent news article on Dorothy and our AUC ministry in Pensacola was printed on the cover page of a special section of the newspaper devoted to religion news. The comprehensive article discussed not only the activities and teachings of the Unity ministry in Pensacola, but also was a very positive, factual explanation of Unity Village and the entire Unity Movement. 



WHO'S WHO AT UNITY SCHOOL

One of the fastest-growing areas in Unity School is the Unity Cassette Department which is headed by Pete Rhea, who serves as director. After receiving his ordination in 1967 from the School for Ministerial and Religious Studies (SMRS), Pete served for a year as minister of Royal Oak Unity Temple in Royal Oak, Michigan, and then for more than a year at Unity Church of Fresno, California.

From his close involvement with the Unity Movement, Pete recognized a growing need for presenting the Unity message in a taped format. Many people who wanted to hear their favorite Unity author or teacher give a lecture or conduct a class were unable to visit Unity Village. Pete realized that through a well-developed cassette program, people could hear the best-loved authors, teachers, and lecturers in the Unity work

right in their own living rooms, or at classes in their Unity ministries. This idea was implemented, and the Unity Cassette Department is now located on the third floor of the Administration Building. A staff of four full-time employees operates the sophisticated recording equipment and handles all orders. Pete's wife, Terry, is in charge of production facilities, and all tape duplication and packaging is handled in this area.

The Cassette Department has experienced tremendous growth since its inception in 1970. New modern equipment was purchased in 1973. This fine equipment insures quality of sound, while producing tapes at rapid speed. In fact, the Cassette Department can now produce an average of 35 individual cassettes from one large reel of tape in 20 minutes.

In 1974, the Cassette Department's production almost doubled over the previous year's, with 75,520 cassettes being produced here. Another 15,000 Christmas cassettes were produced by Liberty United Artist Recording Company.

An average of four new programs are released each year, and new ideas and suggestions for interesting and informative programs are always welcome. Pete works at preparing these cassette programs with people like May Rowland, Marcus Bach, Edward Rabel, James Dillet Freeman, and other creative and respected personalities involved in the Unity Movement. Pete also records various programs presented at Unity retreats, so that people who wish to have a special remembrance of their visit to Unity may purchase a tape. Cassette programs which consist of a series of tapes are offered in conveniently packaged storage albums.

A special cassette order form providing brief descriptions of available programs and prices is available for convenience in placing orders. Use of this form expedites orders and makes it possible for the Cassette Department to provide more efficient service.

In addition to his duties as director of the Cassette Department, Pete also serves on the Unity School Executive Committee and the Promotion Committee. His leisure time is usually spent coaching his son Mike's baseball and basketball teams.

The selections offered in the cassette programs are carefully chosen. Your needs—your requests—are the primary factors determining the selections made. As in all phases of the Unity Movement, the Cassette Department desires to develop and provide ways of communication that will be helpful. We sincerely feel that these tapes increase one's enthusiasm for learning more about Truth.

The members of the AUC join Unity School in expressing appreciation for the excellent job being accomplished by Pete and his efficient staff in offering people a new dimension in studying Truth principles.





A PENDANT SYMBOLIZING "UNITY-THE WAY UP"

Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road in Cincinnati, Ohio, where **Ginny Hinners** serves as minister, has

designed and produced a pendant which has a very special meaning for this unique ministry. The pendant is made of baked ceramic clay in earth colors of terra-cotta, brown, cream, and green.

Ginny writes, "When Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road became the third Unity ministry in the Cincinnati area in 1973, the Unity Movement was planning the 1973 Convention and the slogan was 'UNITY-THE WAY UP." Because Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road is a ministry-at-large meeting in many small study groups rather than under one roof, it was conceived that a symbol, a corporate seal, ought to define this unique kind of work on the occasion of becoming a full member of the Association of Unity Churches.

"The drawing (shown at right) tells a double story. We meet in simple ways - in homes, in parks, in the out-of-doors, but we have one goal: TO WALK TOGETHER ON THE SPIRITUAL PATH THAT LEADS TO THE HIGHER AWARE-NESS OF TRUTH AND LIGHT. This thought inspired the pendant which is worn by all ages of the members of Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road, and which is also the identifying symbol of 'A Community in Unity,' the student group (sponsored by Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road) for Unity students on the Campus of the

University of Cincinnati. The double meaning is obvious. Note how the roof top of the house by the side of the road is an arrow pointing up (UNITY—THE WAY UP!). The groups come together in what they refer to as our Spiritual Family Reunions for Easter, Christmas, an Autumn Retreat, and a Spring Retreat, and for 2 Covered dish suppers following our semi-annual membership meetings. Formal Services are conducted at least six times yearly.

"The Ministry has seven active Study Groups at this time and it has a membership of 125 formal members and about as many more who are not 'Joiners' and who consequently like this unstructured informal WAY because of their desire to remain FREE. Unity-by-the-Side-of-the-Road is 2 years old as a full member of the A.U.C."

TREASURE MAP PRAYER LIST Fannie R. Winchell, one of our licensed teachers who serves the Unity Study group in Inverness, Florida, has shared an idea which she has found most helpful in her prayer activity. She utilizes a

version of treasure mapping as her prayer list. Fannie writes, "On a large flannel board I placed a print of Sallman's 'Head of Christ' underneath a picture of the Madonna and Child. Surrounding these two, and appropriately placed, are small photographs in color of those who are particularly in need of my prayers. This method has been effective and has helped me tremendously."

Unity-in-the-rockies, our AUC member ministry in Colorado Springs, Colorado, where Andres Lucas serves as minister, has been utilizing newspaper advertisements in the format shown to the right. Andy reports, "We have been running advertisements similar to this in the Gazette Telegraph, a daily Colorado Springs newspaper which has a circulation of approximately 165,000 per day. We run this type of advertisement each Wednesday, utilizing a script from 'The WORD.' We have had wonderful results. Our membership has increased 27% and we contribute some of this increase directly to this type of advertisement.'
