UNITY AS VIEWED BY THE SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION

The March, 1975, issue of HOME MISSIONS, a monthly publication by the Home Mission Board, Southern Baptist Convention, was devoted entirely to a review and commentary on other religious persuasions. Included in the publication was an excellent article on Unity written by A. Jase Jones, Th.D. Dr. A. Jase Jones is one of four area directors under missionary appointment by the Department of Interfaith Witness, Home Mission Board, Southern Baptist Convention. Having his headquarters in Texas, Dr. Jones serves a seven state area. The text of Dr. Jones' article on Unity has been reprinted in entirety by the AUC for distribution as an insert to this issue of CONTACT with the generous permission of Mr. Walker Knight, editor of HOME MISSIONS.

Dr. Jones and Mr. Knolan Benfield, photographer-technician with the Home Mission Board in Atlanta, Georgia, visited Unity Village in 1974 and met with and interviewed a number of executives of Unity School of Christianity and of the Association of Unity Churches. The text of Dr. Jones' article, with the exception of his conclusions, was submitted for approval by Unity School and AUC prior to publication.

Commenting on his article, Dr. Jones stated, "Thus far, the effort has been to develop an understanding of Unity's thought and practice from Unity's viewpoint. A guiding principle in this development has been the statement of a Southern Baptist theologian that one has not correctly described another person's religion until he has described it in terms the other would be willing to use as his own. The objective to this point, then, has been to present Unity as someone from Unity would present it, as far as this is possible for one outside the movement.

We bless Dr. Jones and Mr. Benfield for the fine job they did in communicating to the readership of HOME MISSIONS the essential elements of the Unity message.

REGIONAL NEWS

Jim Lewis reporting for the SOUTH CENTRAL REGION:

COLORADO SPRINGS, COLORADO — Unity in the Rockies, where Andres Lucas serves as minister, is sponsoring a rental referral service to senior citizens of the Pikes Peak area. The service which recently received considerable publicity in the Colorado Springs, Colorado, newspaper, offers free to senior citizens a large list of apartments and

other rent facilities. Andy states that only apartments that meet the agency standards will be listed and all facilities will be suited for low incomes. Currently, some 200 apartments ranging from \$47 to \$125 a month are now listed. The rental referral service also checks to see what public transportation is available as well as other facilities that might be of interest to the senior citizens. Working closely with Andy are Mr. and Mrs. Ted Jones, who are in the real estate business in the Colorado Springs area. The referral service is staffed by volunteers and is open six days a week from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Andy states, "One of the most rewarding heartfelt experiences I have had since I have been the minister of our church, is to see the Senior Citizens come in with hope in their eyes and courage in their hearts, and thrill with the prospects of finding a decent place for them to live." We bless Andy and each member and friend of Unity in the Rockies for their active dedication in meeting the needs of people in their community.

KANSAS CITY, MISSOURI — Unity on the Plaza in Kansas City, Missouri, where Ernest Wilson serves as senior minister, sponsors a very active boy scout troop. The scouts participate in a number of church activities, particularly the Christmas Candle Lighting Service and the making of palm crosses for Palm Sunday, and serve in many other functions. The scout troop which has made significant contributions of service to the ministry might be termed an ecumenical Boy Scout Troop. At their Eagle Scout recognition dinner on May 5 they will honor three new Eagle Scouts who have received their training with the Unity troop — each boy is of the Catholic faith.

As part of their special programs presented during the Easter season, Unity on the Plaza conducted a Tenebrae service on Thursday evening preceeding Easter Sunday. This tradi-

tional service which dates back to the fourth century was conducted by Gwen Norment, Program Director of U.I.C.E. at Unity Village. Also participating were the Chapel Singers, a thirty member vocal group from Unity Village directed by Verle Bell. Linda Babbish, associate minister of Unity Village Chapel, was the featured flutist, and Jack Byrns, who will enter SMRS in September, was soloist.

The ministry also conducted a special Good Friday Service in which area Unity ministers participated. Ernest, together with Lloyd E. Felter, and Gerald L. Taylor, associate ministers at Unity on the Plaza, shared the platform with Vera Dawson Tait, former Director of the Correspondence Course Department of Unity School; William L. Fischer, Director of Ministerial Education for the AUC; J. Sig Paulson, minister of Unity Village Chapel; and George E. Hilbert, minister of Christ Church Unity in Kansas City, Missouri. The special program was based upon the "seven last words of Jesus."



Unity of Tucson, where Larry and Mary Ellen Swartz serves as ministers, recently installed a new leaded stained glass window behind their pulpit. Larry has shared a photograph (shown at right) of this project and the following comments: "The enclosed picture speaks for itself--we think we have a beautiful and unique application of the Unity Wings. We didn't get the idea ourselves, but took the basic concept of the folded

wings from Philip Nicola's bulletin in Santa Ana. Just finishing with the rest of the church building, we gave this basic idea to the man who created our other stained glass and he came up with what is now directly behind the pulpit. It is illuminated from behind with a series of light bulbs and it is on a dimmer switch so we can control light level for various portions of our morning service.

"To give some idea of size, the center portion is about 4½ feet high by close to 5 feet wide--rather a large piece for a single unit. It cost close to \$1200.00 all of which was given by our congregation as special gifts for this purpose--in fact, all of our stained glass was installed in a like manner. You will see by the picture that we have the fleur-de-lis in the center of the white center. This has metaphysical meaning and tells of the threefold natures of God and Man, as well as other more mystical meanings. I have told our people that the wings being folded is symbolic of the fact that no one but the self can unfold the wings of spirit and utilize them to grow spiritually."

Larry and Mary Ellen have also shared the wonderful news of an addition to their family. Tran Thi Le Thu, age six months, is being adopted as their daughter and will hereafter be known as Felicia Marie Swartz. We rejoice with Larry and Mary Ellen and their son, Timothy, and lovingly add our welcome to Felicia. We know that God is blessing each member of the Swartz family now and always.

chief duties are to preside at the meetings, to also preside at any joint community functions, one of which was the Easter Sunrise Service on March 30. The funds from this offering and also the Community Thanksgiving Service offering go toward assisting people in difficulty, as they come through the Delray Beach area. The transients are given lodging and meals until they get on their feet again. Right now we are investigating the possibility of assisting the city in its new recreational program for young people. This may be the project for the year."

The subject of an extensive feature article in a recent edition of the Delray Beach News-Journal, Mary was quoted as saying, "We don't need to be another philanthropic organization, but to get together regularly with ministers of other denominations and to feel the happiness of quiet fellowship. This gives all of us a sense of strength and unity of purpose. When we return to our own work, we are aware that we are not alone in our efforts." The Southeastern Region of the AUC is very proud of Mary and David Travis, associate minister of Unity of Delray Beach who serves as Treasurer of the Clergy Association. We bless them and each member and friend of the Delray Beach Clergy Association in their unity of purpose of serving the spiritual needs of the people in their community.

MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE — A second Southeastern Sub-Regional Board/Minister meeting was held March 1 at Unity Church of Christianity in Memphis, to explore with Bob Sikking the subject, "What does the AUC do for me and what can I do for the AUC?" Six ministries were represented: Unity of Jackson, Mississippi; Unity of Birmingham, Alabama; First Church Unity, Nashville, Tennessee; and from Memphis, Unity Center of Memphis, Whitehaven Unity Church, and Unity Church of Christianity, the host ministry. PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA — The February 3, 1975, edition of the Philadelphia Inquirer carried an extensive feature article on the power of prayer and meditation to heal cancer. Written by Darrell Sifford of Knight News Service, the article reported on the healing experience of Bob Gilley, a Charlotte, North Carolina, insurance executive. Mr Gilley is quoted in the article as saying, "I was in a hospital in Texas-I'd had 12 or 14 treatments by then-and I was reading Unity magazine and this story jumped out at me-a story about a young radiologist who was into a six-year study on the power of the mind over cancer. I'd always believed this was possible, that a person had the power to get well or stay well, but I didn't know how.

"I read the story over and over and said: 'Yeah, that's it.' I dictated a letter to that doctor--Carl Simonton in Fort Worth--and told him that I was happy to find somebody with medical credentials who believed what I believed--and not some mystic who was bucking the medical fraternity." Through meditation Mr. Gilley realized a complete healing of a condition which had been diagnosed as terminal. As a service to our members, the AUC has reproduced this excellent article. VALLEY STREAM, NEW YORK — Unity Church of Christianity in Valley Stream, New York, celebrated its 25th ANNIVERSARY with a banquet on Friday evening, February 28, and conducted a special devotional service on Sunday, March 2. Participating in the program with Pat Filiault, minister of Valley Stream, and giving the keynote talk at the banquet was Eric Butterworth, minister of Unity Center of Practical Christianity in New York City. Entitled "Psycho-Cybernetics for Businessmen and Women," Joyce's program is presented by the Adult Institute for Marketing and sponsored by the Chesapeake Chamber of Commerce and the Adult Distributive Education Department of Chesapeake Public Schools. A successful public school teacher prior to entering the ministry and having both a Bachelor's and a Master's degree, Joyce is recognized and accepted by the public school system as a professional educator. Commenting on her six-weeks course, Joyce stated, "It is designed to help business people experience a more successful and dynamic way of life by learning to use their minds effectively. By applying the techniques of 'Psycho-Cybernetics' the student will be adept for the business world of today and the future." DAYTON, OHIO — On Saturday, April 5, Unity of Dayton conducted two special programs which proved to be very well received and an inspiration to all who attended. The workshop was entitled "Christian Healing and Vibratory Forces" and was based on unique points found in Charles Fillmore's book Christian Healing. Basic information from other Unity books was also incorporated in the program. The workshop also included an excellent audio-visual presentation dealing with such subjects as: Man as a Threefold Being; The Three Phases of Mind in Man; Race Consciousness; Personality and Individuality; and Omnipotence as a Vibratory Force. In the evening, Ella LeMieux and Stahr Pope from Unity Village presented their latest adventure entitled "Visit To The Trapp Family Lodge." This program, photographed at the Trapp Family Lodge in Vermont, included the beautiful fall foliage through the New England states, and much information about Maria Trapp and the Trapp Family. On Sunday morning, April 20, during the regular Worship Service, Betty Pellegrino and Bob Ingram not only interpreted the Meditation and the Lesson in Sign Language, but the Music as well. Betty, a member of the Royal Oak congregation before accepting her new career position in Connecticut, now serves as Interpreter-Coordinator of the Connecticut Commission of the Deaf & Hearing Impaired. Bob, a member of Royal Oak Unity Temple, serves as Deaf Placement Consultant to the Michigan Employment Security Commission. While in Royal Oak, Betty was the Interpreter for the News Sign program on a local television station. Onita is very enthusiastic about this additional aspect of service and advises that the ministry has a number of people who are working with the deaf in some way. One such person is a local television Producer-Director who was instrumental in getting the popular News Sign program for the deaf on television.

SPRINGFIELD, ILLINOIS — Unity Church of Practical Christianity in Springfield, Illinois, where Margaret Cain serves as minister, conducted a "Mini Retreat" at Unity Village April 4—6. Margaret who organized and led the thirty-one member group stated that she wanted to introduce people to Unity Village who had never before had the opportunity. Included in the group were representatives from not only Springfield but from Arthur, Decatur, Peoria, and Troy. The Illinois group was present at all of the special Dedication Services conducted that weekend by Unity School and the Kansas City Metropolitan Area Unity ministers for the Unity World Headquarters Activities Center. Senior ministerial student Midge Berkman functioned as hostess for the group while they were at Unity Village and conducted a special service for them on the last evening of the Retreat.

ST. LOUIS, MISSOURI - Jack Dolen, minister of First Unity Church of St. Louis, has since last September been holding religious services for the guests of the Masonic Home of Missouri in St. Louis on the afternoons of the second and fourth Sunday of each month. Commenting on this additional expression of service, Jack added, "This has been a source of satisfaction for our church since many of these people do not have anyone to visit them and we feel we are performing a needed and appreciated function." Indicative of the support and appreciation shown to Jack by the Masonic organization is this quote from a letter Jack received from Mr. Max E. Wood, Administrator for the Masonic Home of Missouri: "Dear Jack. . . I am very pleased about these services you are making available to our guests and know that the reward will be great for all of us. . . It will be a pleasure to work with you Jack and to assist in any way that you want me to." The ministry provides at no cost to the participant at the Home a subscription to DAILY WORD or UNITY MAGAZINE or both. The ministry also takes copies of both of these Unity publications in addition to WEE WISDOM to the Masonic Home on a regular basis. Several people at the Home have been Unity students for many years. We bless Jack for his ability and dedication to reach out in service to others and bless Carolyn Lee George for her willingness to share her time and musical talents with the guests at the Masonic Home.



BERNARD HALDANE TO PRESENT WORKSHOP AT 1975 CONFERENCE

Bernard Haldane is a social inventor, best-selling author, and a teacher. On Tuesday afternoon, June 17, Mr. Haldane will conduct his "Everyone Can Win" workshop. Thoroughly conversant with the teachings of Unity, Mr. Haldane formerly served on the Board of Unity Center of Practical Christianity in New York City, and has led seminars and presented talks at several Unity ministries. He created the Virginia Seminary (Episcopal) Clergy mid-Career Renewal and Motivation workshops, and has led Job Finding, Career Planning and Development workshops throughout the country and abroad.

All church-sponsored career counseling centers use his basic systems, as do the Peace Corps, the Atomic Energy Com-

mission, Exxon, Union Carbide Corporation, and numerous other institutions including Harvard Business School and Columbia University.

His work has been praised and quoted by Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, Vance Packard, Richard Bolles, Auren Uris, and other noted authors, as well as by Presidents Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Johnson. Reader's Digest, Christian Science Monitor, Wall Street Journal, Personnel, New York Times, and Kansas City Star are among the major publications that have reported on his work.

He founded Bernard Haldane Associates, Inc., now the largest consulting firm in the career counseling field he pioneered in 1947; it now has twelve offices in major cities across the country. He serves as Chairman of the Board, aiding in staff training but primarily concerned with spreading knowledge of his techniques that upgrade individual personhood.

His books include <u>How To Make A Habit Of Success</u>, <u>Career Satisfaction and Success</u>, <u>Young Adult Career Planning</u>, <u>Management Motivation Kit</u>. Career Satisfaction has remained on the American Management Association's best seller list for more than a year. Habit of Success, which was paperbacked by Unity in 1966, has just been published in a new edition by Acropolis Books of Washington, D.C.



HOW TO LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR BY J. SIG PAULSON How To Love Your Neighbor by J. Sig Paulson is published by Doubleday & Company. The following are excerpts from the review of this

book by Hugh R. Horne which appeared in the March 1975 issue of UNITY Magazine.

"The popular minister of Unity Village Chapel has written many good and practical books that have blessed thousands of readers. This is one of his best. Many books have been written and thousands of words have been spoken on the magnificent subject of love; however, words are meaningless unless we recognize their significance, accept what they attempt to express, and put into practice the truths they set forth. The author has approached the subject of love sensibly and as a result has produced one of the best books on this theme that has come to the attention of this reviewer.

"To love our neighbor, to love ourself, we must begin with the basic premise, the great overall, underlying fact that God is love. It should not be difficult to believe that God is love, the author says, because we should want to believe it; we should want a lovable God; we should desire a healthy God and a healthy, whole humanity; we should want to be happy and we should desire happiness for everyone. 'This desire for joy and happiness must have a source, and only the God of love would give it to man.'

"Without the acceptance of the belief that God is love, we cannot comprehend the true meaning of love. It may become 'a many-splintered thing' instead of a 'many-splendored thing'; or 'a sweet misery of life' instead of a 'sweet mystery of life.' The great fact that 'God is love' gives meaning to mother love, family love, friendly love, human affection, the love of beauty, the love of work, and so on.

"While love is difficult to define, it can be experienced, the author says, by anyone who is willing to open his mind and heart and being to it. When we see God in the new light of love, we will see ourself in a new light and our neighbor in a new light.

"The author sets forth the necessary steps we can take to find love; and these come to us through our right understanding of God, through meditation and prayer, and through the use of practical and comprehensive affirmations (he offers many good ones in this book) which, if believed and practiced diligently, will do much in helping us in attaining our goal of loving our neighbor as ourself.




