"CHARLES FILLMORE: AMERICAN MYSTIC" TO BE PREMIERED AT UNITY CELEBRATION - 1976

The first evening session of Unity Celebration — 1976, Thursday, July 15, will be devoted to the premiere showing of "Charles Fillmore: American Mystic." This documentary film produced by the Radio-Television Department of Unity School of Christianity is outstanding. Refer to page 9 of this issue of our newsletter for an article regarding the preview showing at Unity Village.

Charles R. Fillmore, President of Unity School, in commenting upon the film states: When Charles and Myrtle Fillmore began their work in 1889, they could hardly have foreseen today's world-encompassing Unity Movement. Because everything they did was founded on faith, their efforts brought growth . . . slowly at first, then with increasing momentum. Even though the early days involved only a handful of dedicated coworkers, some of Charles Fillmore's words were recorded, and later preserved on film.

"Gathering and restoring these rare historical bits and pieces has been a fascinating project, and we feel fortunate in being able to present this film, 'Charles Fillmore: American Mystic,' as Unity's contribution to our nation's bicentennial observance.

"Because the film makes it possible for us to see and hear Charles Fillmore and his co-workers exactly as they were when Unity was young, we can gain a significant perspective on his life and work. I am especially happy to realize that those who did not have the opportunity of knowing Charles Fillmore personally can now see him as I remember him: a warm, vital man whose love and humanity were the source of his wisdom and insight into Truth.

"If there is one thing that comes through in these brief glimpses, it is Charles Fillmore's unswerving faith in the Truth that Unity teaches, and his consistent receptivity to new and better ideas. There is no doubt in my mind that he thought of Unity as an open-ended approach to Truth...and that it is our privilege and responsibility to preserve this concept. To paraphrase Lincoln's words, 'it is for us the living to be dedicated to the unfinished work' that Charles and Myrtle Fillmore began...to be 'dedicated to the great task remaining before us' of making the Truth message truly universal."

AUC PRESIDENT'S LETTER


Dear Fellow Association Members,

"On Tuesday, September 30, the Post Graduate Program on Twelve Powers of Man' was presented by Catherine Knight and Jack Barker.

"The thrust of the Conference was toward meditation. Among those who spoke were: Tom Coates, Gerry Belanger, Jim Sherman, and George Stone. This was truly an original experience and one that will have value in future meditation work. As a response, all Eastern Region Unity ministers and teachers were invited to attend a biofeedback training workshop on November 3, 4, and 5, at Unity of Richmond, Virginia, where Hal Rosencrans will demonstrate the West Palm Beach way of taking advantage of this medium."

The 1976 Eastern Unity Conference will be conducted in September at Manresa, a Jesuit Retreat House near Annapolis, Maryland. John advised that the selection of the 1976 Regional Conference site follows the Region's recent trend to conduct meetings in places with significant historical background.

"This year over 700 retreatants were present for the three-day program. It was rather a unique Retreat in that meditation, the center of Unity's teaching tools, was the main discussion. By lecture, sharing, discussion groups, practice, 'in silence' training, the idea of meditation was presented. As Regional Representative, it was my privilege to serve as the keynote speaker and share ideas and personal experiences regarding meditation."

Grover Thornsberry, minister of Unity Church of Truth, Seattle, Washington, was the featured speaker for the Retreat. Grover spoke on Saturday evening and conducted the Sunday morning worship service.

Some of the discussion sessions conducted during the three-day Retreat were: "Bible References and Resources in Terms of Meditation"; "Multi-Media Presentation of Meditation Today"; "Mental Approach to Meditation"; "Setting Affirmations to Music"; "Meditation in the Orient"; "Helping Young People to Meditate"; and "Process of Mind Control." There was also time for prayer sessions on the beach both at sunrise and at sunset.

Ginny reports, "The dialogue series so captivated a program director of one of our local radio stations that he has provided a 15 minute program for us free of charge each Sunday morning utilizing Sig's and Ric's tapes. Our son, **Dick**, edits and presents the program under the radio station's educational allowance format."

As a result of the renewal of numerous personal contacts made by Ginny during her extensive preparations for publicizing Sig's and Ric's appearance on the university campus, she has been invited to serve as a counselor-adviser for the Assistant Dean of Student Affairs for the University of Cincinnati. In this capacity she will sit in on rap sessions of student counselors who are learning by counseling with other students on campus who are being challenged with emotional and/or psychological problems of many descriptions. Ginny states, "My part in this activity is sure to make our student group, 'Community in Unity,' better known since those I contact will no doubt hear about us and use our rap session program for helping other students who are in need of love and a home-like atmosphere ... and Unity."

CLEVELAND, OHIO — Unity Center of Cleveland, served by ministers **George** and **Winifred Hausmann**, conducted a highly successful one-day workshop on prosperity, October 4. Winifred and Bud report, "We had a capacity crowd for our first all day workshop at Mont Chalet Ski Lodge, just outside Cleveland. There was lots of enthusiasm, and people came from as far away as Akron and Cuyahoga Falls and the far west side of Cleveland. As a matter of fact, the response has been so good that we have scheduled a future workshop, this one on health and healing, for the same place."

DETROIT, MICHIGAN - "Human Potentials - 1975" sponsored by the Unity ministries of the Metropolitan Detroit Area was presented October 11, 1975, in Cobo Hall, in Detroit. The one-day program was designed to quicken and reinforce an awareness of man's limitless inner-potential. Featured speakers included Phillip and Dorothy Pierson of Christ Unity Church in Sacramento, California; Dr. Elmer and Alyce Green of the Menninger Foundation in Topeka, Kansas; Dr. Carl and Stephanie Simonton of Oncology Associates, Ft. Worth, Texas; Dr. Evarts G. Loomis, of Friendly Hills Fellowship, Hemet, California; and Jack Schwarz of the "Alethia" Psycho-Physical Foundation, Selma, Oregon. Charles King, a long-time Unity friend, and Joan Engle, pianist and organist from Sacramento, California, provided a fantastic musical aspect to the program.

Reporting on the event, Phil Pierson stated, "From all views our meeting in Detroit was a success, I am happy to say! At our afternoon meeting we had some 2,000 people in attendance and around 1,800 the remainder of the time. This made the Ballroom at Cobo Hall almost completely filled and it was an impressive sight from the speaker's platform and for the people in attendance also I'm sure. The good turn out was a testimony to what our Unity centers can do when they work together. I feel the ministers of the greater Detroit area are to be congratulated for their vision and great effort to make this program a success. I am sure that they know they can do even a bigger program if they desire in the future."

Phil continued by stating, "The blend of people in attendance was especially gratifying. We had a high percentage of men and perhaps 15% were from outside Unity. I base this on talking to people and on our ticket sales at the door which ran about 12% of total sales. Several doctors made themselves known to me.

"I am most happy to report that we showed a profit of almost \$9,000--50% of this amount was divided among the participating centers according to their percentage of ticket sales. The other 50% has been placed in a fund for the development of further programs of this nature.

"The speakers were good as always with a real sense of being one with us in

Unity. The peoples' interest was testified to by their continued attendance at the evening meeting and a standing ovation for our evening speaker, Jack Schwarz. Charles King as always was a great contributor and worked with Dorothy Pierson in intervals of song and meditation.

"We received good coverage in the city on radio and TV talk shows — the best we have ever had. Our success in this department is due largely to the work of Catherine Knight's staff of helpers. Phyllis Warren was responsible for getting both Jack Boland and myself on TV interviews. I was on the CBS station local news at 12 noon and this really helped.

"The Detroit Unity Association is especially to be commended for their part. Glenn Mosley for his original vision of the project and then Catherine Knight for her leadership in organizing the Detroit Centers and helping with all the details of the show's production.

"An interesting sidelight to our program is that President Gerald Ford was in town the day before our meeting. The night he was there the front of Cobo Hall was mobbed with people, police, pickets, news media people, etc. And right above their heads in the middle of the whole scene was the Cobo Hall marquee with the announcement 'Unity Centers Seminar.' So we really got national coverage there for a while anyway."

SPRINGFIELD, OHIO — Unity Center of Truth, Springfield, Ohio, held its first retreat in a lovely wooded area near New Carlisle, Ohio, on September 5th and 6th. The retreat was led by Florence Kellogg, our minister in Springfield.

Florence reports, "Friday night was the 'gathering together' time for camping, fellowship, and a campfire sing-a-long. 'The Loom of Nature' was the theme used for the program on Saturday. Twentynine people attended the retreat spending the day loving, caring, and sharing God in all things. Highlights of the evening session included a songfest around the campfire; an inspirational message; and reflections on the day. A candlelighting service and meditation left the participants with a true feeling of God moving in and through all creation. Everyone agreed this retreat was such a success it had to be the first of many more."

THINK EXPANSIVELY

"The first ministry created by our Outreach Program is now holding regular Sunday services, classes and a full youth education program."

How easily these words roll out of the typewriter and how much they understate the work that has gone into our first "off-spring." While I am the strongest believer in the activity of Spirit making "easy and successful our way," it still requires old-fashioned hard-work to create the environment for Spirit to flow.

How does it work? It seems that there is a formula evolving for pioneering new works that is very similar to achieving success in any new venture. The elements of the formula so far revealed are:

PREPARATION: Do your homework before you take an actual step forward. If you have a question do your best to know ahead of time. This will still not avoid every pitfall, but reduces your chances of error. For example, Jim Freeman's lecture in Elmhurst met with a severe parking problem which we were led to believe would not exist. However, since we were prepared with parking lot ushers armed with flashlights, some of the problem was avoided.

COMMITMENT: Know what your goals are and create an environment that leads to those goals. In our first ministry, Unity-in-the-Valley about 40 miles due west of Chicago's Loop, we knew there were families strongly interested in youth education and Y.O.U. programs. Therefore, from the very start we committed ourselves to these programs. There are already over forty young people on our rolls and we plan for more.

PERSONAL CONTACT: Frequent telephone and mail contact with those interested brings results. It often amazes me that we ministers expect people to see a two inch ad in the papers and seek us and our ministry. There are also opportunities to speak in every community before service, business or women's groups. I'm convinced that every "outside" activity results in at least one new family seeking Unity's help thereafter.

PROFESSIONALISM: Even though we are just beginning, we try to present the message, prepare our literature, provide our services as well as we possibly can. Most of us enjoy the freedom and relaxed feeling that is the Unity way, but we can still "do it right without getting up-tight."

What's ahead?

As our work in the Fox River Valley becomes ready for its full-time minister, we are looking toward activities in the "Unity West" area of Chicagoland. We have learned there is quite a cluster of Unity students in the Downers Grove, Hinsdale, Lombard, Elmhurts area of the suburbs.

There is also interest in <u>Joliet</u>, and the "near north side," an apartment community a few miles north of Chicago's Loop.

OVERSEAS REPORT

Foster C. McClellan, Director of Overseas and Retreats for Unity School, has shared the following report regarding the fine Unity work in South Africa. Foster states, "Our Unity work in South Africa is headed up by True van Staden Smit, who also translates Daily Word into a form of the Dutch language and publishes it under the title "Daelikse Woord." In a letter recently received from True, she advisesd us that she was married on July 15, 1975, to the Chief Language Officer of the Transvaal, who helps her tremendously in getting each Daelikse Woord as near perfect as possible.

"The following is a portion of True's letter which I know will please each person active in the Unity Movement: 'First of all let me thank you for the Daily Words sent to me so regularly each month, and also for the most beautiful colour separations which make our books so attractive. For all your love and willingness to work with us--thank you again and again! The work here is growing beyond our expectations, and we find that so many young people are anxious to join us. We printed a total of 17,500 December booklets, 15,000 going out to regular subscribers, and the rest for new members and booklets sent to friends of the subscribers'."

True also reported that although they have an increase of about 500-600 new readers monthly, the total increase, due to subscribers not renewing their subscriptions, is about 250 a month.

In giving thanks for and blessing the fine work done by True and her staff in South Africa, Foster remarked, "It is encouraging to see the Daily Word spreading its message of Truth in so many countries, as well as our own."

WHO'S WHO AT UNITY SCHOOL



Zelma Cook, Director, Promotion Dept.

Following a job through the Promotion Department is probably one of the best ways to get an idea of the scope of the activities coordinated by the department's director, Zelma Cook. A seasonal greeting booklet is a good example. As is the case with much of the other work in the department, greeting booklets are scheduled a year in advance. Once deadlines have been established for the completed project, a reverse timetable is drawn up, so that job assignments can be made. A copywriter is given a work order, she begins selecting the material to be contained in the booklet, and doing the additional writing that is necessary. The copywriter selects a theme for the booklet, and discusses this theme with Art Director Anna Finfrock. Anna selects the paper to be used for the booklet, and as the copy for the booklet is solidified, some photos or drawings to be used to illustrate the booklet are chosen. When the copy is finalized, the layout of the booklet and final selection of the illustrations and cover artwork is made. When all components of the booklet are completed, type is set, the booklet keylined, and the art director supervises the printing of the booklet.

In regard to the production of any piece of material that is going to be used by Unity School, Zelma says: "We try to be forward looking, to keep up with graphic changes, and new techniques. We don't want to be trendy, but we do want our material to look and be up-to-date." She continued: "The Promotion Depart-

ment produces much of the material that is responsible for Unity's image in the outside world; we are part of the process that lets people know what is going on here. Each item that we produce is, in a way, the Unity missionary message. That is why each time we do something, we try to do our best."

Zelma is a dynamic woman whose enthusiasm for her work is apparent after only a few moments visiting. Her job largely involves the organization and coordination of many parts--the art department, photography, copywriting, and printing.

The Promotion Department either directly or partially produces the whole range of printed materials used by Unity School. This includes such diverse items as direct mail components (promoting such things as magazine subscriptions, for example), fliers, posters, brochures, greeting booklets, the Lenten Study Booklet, the Calendar Housebook, to name just a few. Of these various projects, Zelma says: "For each project we seek to improve. We are never satisfied with what we have done--we're always looking for ways to get better. When we hear from Truth students, 'Last year's booklet was so beautiful, I didn't think it could be better, but this year's is even more beautiful,' then we know we are accomplishing what we are trying to do."

Zelma has been director of the department for three years. She was born and educated in Kansas City. After completing high school, she came to work at Unity at the (then) headquarters at 917 Tracy. She left to marry Scott Cook, and for nineteen years to be a housewife. Zelma has two children, Jay Cook and Mrs. Pat Smith, and three grandchildren, Joe Cook, Chris, and Shay Smith. When Zelma's son started school, she returned to work at Unity in the Personnel Department. She later worked in the Editorial Department, and was Managing Editor for NEW Magazine, When NEW was incorporated into UNITY Magazine, Zelma moved to her present department then called Advertising and Promotion.

Zelma attributes the quality of the work and the success of the department to her staff. "In this field, teamwork is essential. We work together well and have a great deal of enthusiasm and excitement about the projects we work on," she states.

The staff of the Promotion Department includes Art Director Anna Finfrock; secretary Marsha Watts; copywriters Elvira Hicken, Virginia Baker, and Rebecca Miller (an SMRS student); artist Ann Bregach; and photographer, Tony LaTona.

DOCUMENTARY FILM ON CHARLES FILLMORE

A preview showing of a documentary film on Charles Fillmore, co-founder of the Unity Movement, was held in the evening of October 19 in the Activities Center at Unity Village. Entitled "Charles Fillmore: American Mystic," the film was written and directed by S. Rickert Grace of the Radio-Television Department of Unity School.

The film is a delightful, loving, and beautifully produced work of art--a film that lets the viewer experience the events, works, and thoughts of Charles Fillmore. The Activities Center was filled to capacity for the film's preview with people from throughout the Metropolitan Kansas City Area. Distributed that evening to each person attending the preview was a very beautiful and appropriately prepared commemorative brochure. The (continued on page 10)

brochure, produced by the Promotion Department of Unity School especially for the documentary film, will also be distributed during the film's premiere at Unity Celebration – 1976 in Philadelphia this next July.

The showing of the film was preceded by a dialogue between Charles Rickert Fillmore and Rosemary Fillmore Rhea. In the dialogue, Charles and Rosemary shared with the audience intimate glimpses and insights into their growing up with their grandfather. The program was enthusiastically received by Truth students and the general public alike. This preview viewing will be the only public showing prior to the film's premiere at Unity Celebration - 1976. The first evening program of Unity Celebration - 1976 has been reserved for Charles and Rosemary to present to those attending this important assemblage their dialogue and introduce the documentary film.

The preview showing in the Activities Center captured the interest of the local Kansas City Metropolitan Area news media and received excellent reviews and coverage in all area newspapers. Indicative of the type of enthusiastic and positive responses by the news media are the following quotes from a comprehensive review written by Tim Hughes, a staff writer for THE EXAMINER: "'Charles Fillmore: American Mystic' is the type of documentary film that leaves the audience asking for more. As presented by the Unity School of Christianity, 'Charles Fillmore . . .' brings to life all the warmth. wit, and wisdom of the founder of the Unity Movement and Unity Village. The documentary, only 28 minutes, is the combination of actual film footage and sound recordings of the life and time of Fillmore. Written and directed by S. Rickert Grace, who is the greatgrandson of Fillmore, the film poetically allows the viewer to experience the events, works, and thoughts of the metaphysician.

"Richard Caram narrates the film and is able to blend Grace's script around the director's artistic visual scenes. Caram is a poet and English professor at Stephens College in Columbia, Missouri.

"From the time that Fillmore was a child of the frontier—born on a Chippewa reservation at St. Cloud, Minnesota, in

1854—through the time that he made the decision to give up his real estate business and devote full-time to the study and mastery of the spiritual principles which he came to believe is the principal theme of the film. But Grace analyzes his great-grandfather. He captures intimate glimpses and insights of Fillmore through still photographs that date back to 1870 and film footage that dates back to 1920.

"Grace depicts the inquiring mind and interest of Fillmore by showing his great-grandfather's dedication to the formulation of a philosophy, based on the teachings of Jesus Christ, which became the foundation of the Unity Movement."

Rick Grace states that the voice of Charles Fillmore utilized in the film was from a recording made in 1946. The film voice of Myrtle Fillmore is that of Rosemary Fillmore Rhea.

Rick is a graduate of the University of Missouri at Kansas City where he received a Bachelor of Arts in English. Commenting on the production of the film, Rick stated, "We started thinking about doing the film in the fall of 1974 when we discovered some old film footage of Charles Fillmore. Production of the film commenced in January of this year and was technically completed in July." Rick added, "Information for the film was gathered not only from our own Unity archives but also from various museums and libraries."

Following the film's premiere showing at Unity Celebration — 1976 it will be made available through the AUC office for use by the Association's member ministries throughout the world.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON PEACE SONG

In the November issue of our Association's newsletter we shared some information on the history of the "Peace Song," which we had received from Unity Church of Dallas, Texas.

The article brought remembrances on the early usage of the statement 'Let there be peace and let it begin with me' by Unity from James Dillet Freeman, Director of Silent Unity.

Jim recalls: "During World War II, we in Silent Unity were always looking for new peace prayers to offer hope, comfort, and courage to the listeners of the radio program 'Unity Viewpoint.' We also included these prayers in our peace letters asking people to pray with Silent Unity for an end to world strife. We sent hundreds of thousands of copies of the prayers for peace that we were using to people all over the world."

Jim continued, "One day, a letter was received by Silent Unity from a woman in New Zealand--I no longer recall her name. But included with the letter was a prayer: 'Almighty Father, let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me. We all realized immediately that this was just the kind of thought that we wished to be sending out. It was the greatest prayer for peace we had ever seen. In fact, this line was used every day at the 12 o'clock noon peace prayer service at Unity headquarters at 9th and Tracy Streets in Kansas City."

GERMAN LANGUAGE RETREAT AT UNITY VILLAGE

Another first for Unity manifested during October 30 to November 15, when 184 of our German speaking Unity friends from West Germany, Switzerland, Austria, and France visited Unity Village. Their joyous and wonderful visit was very significant to Unity for two reasons. First, in the number of visitors from other countries. Second, the Liebe Freunde Retreat was the first retreat conducted at Unity Village entirely in a language other than English.

Peter Wenzel, minister of Berliner Unity Freunde e.V., our AUC member ministry in West Berlin, Germany, had worked closely for over 18 months with various members of the Unity School and AUC staffs in planning this event.

On October 30, our Unity friends from Europe arrived at the Kansas City International Airport via chartered airliner from Frankfurt, Germany. For the first two nights, the tour group stayed at a luxury hotel near the airport and during the day toured a newly constructed giant shopping mall in order to become better acquainted with some of the American way of life.

From November 2 through November 7 the group's activities were under the direction and guidance of Peter Wenzel who conducted a special pre-retreat program. Each morning Peter led the group in Psycho-gymnastics before breakfast. In addition to times of prayer, lecture, song, meditation, and walks about the Unity Village grounds, special bus tours were taken to local cultural and historic sites. The SMRS students provided a very well received and enjoyable musical variety program during one of the evening sessions.

On November 8, the Liebe Freunde Retreat conducted by Unity School officially began. Planned by Foster C. and Paula McClellan and Mary Rexroth of the Retreat Department of Unity School, the (continued on page 12)

retreat was conducted entirely in the German language through the able and dedicated assistance of Rolf Rieber of Sindelfingen, Germany, who served as official interpreter. Rolf did an outstanding job of simultaneous translation.

James Dillet Freeman presented his program "Unity Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow" to our Unity friends from Europe on the evening of November 11. Jim made special preparation for this presentation, and presented it in German. With the exception of several Daily Word meditations led by Unity School staff members Irene Homan and Maya Grace, Jim's program was the only one presented in the German language without having to utilize the services of an interpreter.

During the candlelight banquet held in the Unity Inn on the evening of November 14, Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director of the AUC, presented Peter Wenzel with the AUC membership plague for Berliner Unity Freunde e.V.

Throughout their entire visit, the retreatants demonstrated an extremely joyous and enthusiastic attitude. Commenting on the visit, Peter Wenzel stated, "We enjoyed the rose garden in bloom, the water fountains, the newly built, beautiful Activities Center, and the deeply felt meetings with Silent Unity. In retrospect we can say: Expectations were surpassed, long hopedfor meaningful experiences were found, and precious friendships were made. A wave of love, truth, and joy was flowing through this retreat, and everyone could fill heart and soul to overflowing. In a wonderful way we experienced the light of love, truth, and life during these two weeks, and we feel the blessing of being filled with the freeing truth."

Five metropolitan Kansas City Area newspapers with a combined circulation of over 550,000 reported on the group's visit in articles of up to four columns in width together with photographs. The most popular headline was "Dreams Come True," which relfected the view of the majority of the tour group who felt that their visit to Unity was the fulfillment of their dreams to actually experience the consciousness and beauty of Unity Village. Members of the group often referred to their visit as a "pilgrimage."

BOOK RACK

EXPLORING THE CRACK IN THE COSMIC EGG

Our AUC Book Review Committee has recommended to our membership **Exploring the Crack in the Cosmic Egg by Joseph Chilton Pearce**.

One of the Book Committee members writes: "In essence this book affirms that as we come into the world we are still in communion with Spirit: the divine Reality. Then, through our associations and education we are gradually conditioned to the existing culture. As a result, fears and phobias are instilled that separate us from our inherent divinity: our eternal identity in God and oneness with all life. It is only as we return 'by a childlike acceptance of the given (we would name It the Truth of our Being) without question' that we are able to regain our oneness with Spirit within . . . discard our fears, of which the most basic is our fear of death; and with openness of mind and heart, begin to more with the Flow of ever expanding . . . Life . . . eternal, awake to what we always have been and always will be: a part of the living flow that God is: life omnipresent, everlasting, unendingly unfolding!

"To the one who is interested in an indepth study of the 'why and the wherefore' of our thinking and viewpoints and the 'how to' of our becoming once more one with our Father, this book is both revealing and clarifying. Be ready, however, to have a dictionary at hand to define the many technical terms."

Another reviewer states: "The author traces the development of cultural concepts in the individual and shows how we build a 'semantic universe' which too often determines how we look at ourselves in relation to other people and our world as we see it. He proposes that we are taught to organize our body senses to keep a 'stable sameness'. Utilizing both developmental physiology and psychology he gives an explanation of how men outgrow the simplicity and clarity of a child's understanding.

"The author uses his association with Carlos Castaneda and don Juan the Yaqui 'man of knowledge' to illustrate how the primitive mystic has an entirely different way of looking at nature and himself as compared with 'modern man'. The first half of the book may be said to show how we have built the shell around us. The second half of the book gives examples of seeing beyond this shell with many of the examples taken from experiences of primitive man in various parts of the world.

"The book has in my opinion, expressed some very pertinent psychological concepts. However it is very difficult to read mainly because of the psychological jargon used by the author. He seems to always use technical words and terms and never in a simple easy-to-follow manner. Perhaps this may cause the reader to slow down and do a little more thinking as he reads! There are some delightful bits of humor scattered throughout which do brighten the otherwise difficult reading.

"Reading this book as a Unity minister, I found little to disturb me, much food for thought, and a general feeling of the worthwhileness of the publication.

"I believe some of our ministers would be turned off by the book, but those who lean this way will want to purchase it."


