


#### **AUC PRESIDENT'S LETTER**

Dear Fellow Association Members,

This is the last time I shall have the opportunity of writing for CONTACT, as President. It has been a privilege and a blessing to serve in this capacity this past year and I would like to thank all of you for your love and blessings and encouragement.

I recently read an interesting statement from Charles Fillmore's book, The Twelve Powers of Man. I would like to share it with you since it has bearing on organization. We are and will be giving a great deal of thought to our AUC organization this coming year and Charles Fillmore's thought is quite fitting at this time.

He writes: "Right here, however, religious teachers should be on their guard in framing tenets for religious organizations. Do not dogmatize in creed, or statement of Being, as a governing rule of thought and action for those who join your organization. These things are limitations, and they often prevent the free development of the soul because of foolish insistence on consistency. The creed that you write today may not fit the viewpoint of tomorrow; hence the safe and sure religious foundation for all men is that laid down by Jesus, 'The

Spirit of truth...shall guide you into all the Truth.' A statement setting forth the teaching of a religious institution is essential, but compelling clauses should be omitted." (TP: pp. 111, 112.)

The AUC is an organization that has developed through the love and cooperation of those who are a part of it. It is a growing organization and like all things that grow there comes a time for a necessary change in order to meet the demands of the new growth. We have an

organization that has permitted much freedom of expression of the individual consciousness, more so than any other religious organization that I know of, a I would like to see it remain this way.

Whenever there is consideration being given to changing by-laws, it seems the expression "We need to put teeth into them," comes up. Since we have no judicial body to enforce action upon violations of rules we should be very careful about putting such regulations into our by-laws. By-laws are "guidelines" for cooperative group action and, if anything, we should put more "love" into them. When we work together in Principle we will not have to work against each other over rules.

Let us know that as we continue to work together in love we shall be guided by Spirit to make those changes in our by-laws that will be for the good of all. I can assure you that our Board of Trustees is open and ready to cooperate with the membership in making constructive changes.

EL CAJON, CALIFORNIA—On April 11, Palm Sunday, Christ Church Unity of El Cajon conducted groundbreaking ceremonies for the ministry's additional facilities. Arthur Hammons, founder and minister of this expanding California work, reports, "The new facilities include a 400 seat Sanctuary with a balcony, offices, classrooms, a library, restrooms, and a cry room. Offstreet parking for 82 cars will be provided. The new facilities will allow our present Chapel to become a beautiful Fellowship Hall with kitchen and restrooms. The promotion of the ministry's building program has been very well thought out and professionally executed. One of the pieces of published material utilized by the ministry to explain the program is a specially designed folder entitled "EXTRA—Look at What God Does With What I Do For Him!" The unique design of the folder allows not only ample space for a full explanation of the program but, when unfolded, becomes a 22" X 17" poster depicting the architect's rendering of the new facilities.

JN CITY, ARIZONA—On April 9 Unity Church of Sun City, Arizona, conducted dedication ceremonies for the ministry's new church property. Joining our Unity minister in Sun City, Bernice Biggers, for this important occasion in the church's unfoldment and expansion were Blaine Mays of Phoenix and J. Sig Paulson of Unity Village.

Bernice reports that the new site consists of over 4 1/2 acres of land in an excellent location. Completion of the \$250,000 facilities is scheduled for December of this year.

BATTLE CREEK, MICHIGAN—During our nation's bicentennial year many of our AUC ministries are highlighting the positive and constructive accomplishments of America. Unity of Battle Creek recently mailed to each person on the ministry's mailing list a copy of a publication distributed by the Chamber of Commerce of the United States. Amalie Frank, leader of our work in Battle Creek, advised that the publication is entitled "What's right with America," and sets forth a number of the freedoms and advantages which America offers and which we, as American citizens, may often take for granted.

DETROIT, MICHIGAN - Detroit Unity Association recently presented a special two week program by Nat Simmons, a former television and Broadway actor who is currently Director of the Student Repertory Theater in Taos, New Mexico. Nat presented three performances of a one-man poetry show and produced a one-act children's musical entitled, "Tomorrow Belongs to Us." Over 30 youths participated in the three performances of the musical. David Williamson, minister of this Detroit ministry, in commenting on Nat, stated, "He is a superb actor and director and did a magnificent job. His work with our young people had a great impact."

LIVONIA, MICHIGAN - Unity of Livonia has developed a program to provide a Truth story service for children over the telephone, Entitled "JOYLINE," the program is under the guidance and direction of Milly Collins, who has researched and developed enough appropriate stories for a year's use. Eugene Sorensen, minister of Unity of Livonia, reports that 100 stories have been selected. The stories are recorded on cassettes and available to listeners through dialing a special telephone number. The stories do not exceed three minutes in length and are changed three times a week with a special story for the weekend which has a tag line inviting children to Sunday School at Unity of Livonia.

Gene reports, "The stories are interesting, full of fun, and right on the button with a Unity message for children ages 5 to 10. But we find that adults love it, too. Since it has been in operation (about the last week in March), we have had over 2,600 calls and nothing but compliments all around for it."

# GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY CONDUCTED AT UNITY VILLAGE

The Lowell Fillmore Memorial Garden at Unity Village, Misouri, has been planned and designed as a fitting tribute to the Unity leader and avid gardner for whom it is named. Lowell Page Fillmore, eldest son of Charles and Myrtle Fillmore, served as President of Unity School of Christianity from 1948 to 1972 when he was named President Emeritus. Until shortly before his passing in March, 1975, he came to his office every workday, devoting a total of 75 years to the Unity Movement.

A groundbreaking ceremony was held May 21, 1976, for the half-acre garden. The Lowell Fillmore Memorial Garden is located to the east of the Unity Village building complex, directly across from the Unity World Headquarters Activities Center.

Alice Fillmore, widow of Lowell Fillmore, was the guest of honor for the groundbreaking ceremony and turned the first spade of earth. Participating in the ceremony were the members of the Board of Directors of Unity School: Charles R. Fillmore, James Dillet Freeman, and Otto J. Arni. Rosemary Fillmore Rhea, co-director of the Radio and Television Department of Unity School, and niece of Lowell, also participated in the ground-breaking.

Also attending the ceremony were other members of the Fillmore family; the members of the Executive Committee of Unity School; and Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director of the AUC.

Charles R. Fillmore, President of Unity School, stated, "Lowell Fillmore's entire being was dedicated to God through service to his fellow men. He had an appreciation for life in all its expressions, especially as it blooms forth in nature. He was an enthusiastic gardner; tending his beautiful flowers, shrubs, and trees was his cherished recreation. It is fitting that Lowell's zest for God's gift of life be memorialized as a garden. Lowell's dauntless spirit and faith in God's limitless love will be with all who enter here to meditate and pray."

The development of the garden will be under the supervision of **David Ackerman**, landscape architect for Unity School, who designed the garden. With a total land area of a half-acre, the garden will feature a reflecting pool, benches for visitors, a sundial, memorial piece, and over 5,200 plants, flowering shrubs, and trees. The landscaped area will be in an oval design covering approximately one-fourth acre of ground.

Completion of the garden is scheduled for June, 1977, with a special dedication service planned for that time.

Behind a blue drape in my office, there is a white board instead of a blackboard that I use from time to time. At this time of the year, it is a very busy board. It is the means by which we're able to objectify the placement situation in our Movement just prior to graduation and ordination. Of course, when you read this, much of the placement that appears on my board will have been accomplished. At this moment, there are thirty-seven communities involved in the possibility of a change. These include communities where there are ministers functioning full-time, but who have expressed their desire for a possible change. Eighteen of those are ministries who are or will be seeking a senior minister. In addition, with the influx of the second largest graduating class in the history of SMRS, we will be placing at least thirteen ministers in a position as associate or assistant minister in an established ministry.

On the board at this present time, serious placement consideration is being given to eight communities where there are very active study groups ready to evolve into full-time ministries. As you know, it is a general policy of AUC to encourage graduating ordinands to go into established ministries or function as assistant or associate ministers where possible. This year, however, there will undoubtedly be a number of newly ordained ministers who will move into the developmental stages of new ministries in our Movement. I think that it's safe to say that before the year is out, we will have at least eight new ministries in our Movement.

Do you remember when you first went out in the field? I sure remember when I did. Those first months were an exciting, staggering combination of anticipation and fear, of frustration, joy, and misery. I felt self-confident and totally inadequate.

I hoped and prayed that I would be approved of and accepted and I was terrified that I might not be. I walked into the presence of my peers desperate hoping someone would make me feel welcome and a part of what was going on.

In your area, there will undoubtedly be members of the graduating class of 1976 either functioning as an assistant or associate in a ministry, as the senior minister in one of our established works, or involved in the development of one of our study groups into a full-time ministry. I am convinced that a note or a call or a visit would be of inestimable value. If you can stretch forth the hand of welcome and help make these fine Unity ministers feel a part of what's going on, you will bless in ways that are difficult to calculate. Please do take the time to offer your assistance. It may very well not be needed, but the fact that it is offered will be a source of strength and blessing to the ministers concerned. The more we function with the sense of sharing in the ministry, the stronger we, as individuals, are going to be, and the greater our Movement will be.

This city of about 50,000 on the Mississippi River has supported an informal Unity Study group for over three years. Its leader, Lee Anthony, has studied Unity for over 40 years. #### OVERSEAS REPORT by Foster C. McClellan

The Overseas Department of Unity School of Christianity administers to the needs of Unity followers in those parts of the world beyond the United States and Canada. The work performed by the Overseas Department is primarily an administration function. It is not the intention of Unity School to take an active role in the organization, direction, and leadership of groups in overseas countries but to help them in every possible way short of this. With followers in so many countries throughout the world you can see that this is the only feasible course to take, for Unity School would not have the personnel or the capability for doing an effective job in any other capacity.

This policy is readily accepted by our friends overseas. Each country has its own culture, language, and tradition and it is only natural for them to feel that they are in the best position to provide for their own leadership and the organization that best meets their needs. Hence we find that in many countries there are study groups and classes, while in others there are more formal churches. In several countries there are Unity Headquarters for the distribution of Daily Word and Unity literature and for the conduct of prayer help similar to the ministry provided by Silent Unity. They all work directly with the Overseas Department as their contact with Unity School, Where formal churches are formed they also work directly with the AUC. So

in a very real way the Overseas Department and the AUC work hand-in-hand in this vital outreach of the Unity work throughout the world.

Many countries publish their own edition of Daily Word and Unity School provides the galley proofs and in some cases the covers for each edition. The high cost of postage and the time delay in shipping makes this the most practical approach. More than anything else Daily Word is the great common bond that unites Unity people everywhere. And it is good to know that the Unity Movement is growing rapidly in so many countries in Europe, Africa, Australia, New Zealand, India, and the Caribbean, In fact, Unity has spread to people in practically every country outside the Iron Curtain and there are groups even behind the Iron Curtain.

Above all Unity is interested in the individual. It is dedicated to helping people everywhere discover more of their own potential, their own true identity. When people want to form organizations we are happy and we give them what support we can, but the great purpose of Unity, both through Unity School and the AUC, is to help people find the Truth so that they can help themselves and thus set them free from every form of limitation. In so doing we pray that we are doing our best to make this world a better place in which to live. This is a noble purpose and we know that everyone who reads CONTACT is dedicated to that cause.

#### LIGHT FOR OUR AGE BY ROBERT P. SIKKING

Unity School of Christianity has just published <u>Light For Our Age</u> by Robert P. Sikking. Hugh R. Horne has reviewed the book and reports: "This excellent book is a further extension of the influential ministry of a man well known to the Unity Movement.

"We then can understand that death is a natural part of life. Our knowing will set us free from its fear, since it is not possible for us to be separated from God, His wisdom, life, love, and power.

"This is a profound book, and should be read and studied by all who are interested in a better understanding of the great principles of Truth."

Marlowe Kline Eastern Region


