



AUC PRESIDENT'S LETTER

In place of the usual President's report, we share with you this letter from our President to each Unity minister:

Dear Friends,

As an outgrowth of recommendations from the Barton Survey, the Association of Unity Churches' Conference Body decided during its regular meetings in July, 1976, to establish a Review Committee whose purpose was to examine the structure, procedures, and operations of the Executive Office. The following members were appointed: Phillip Pierson, Chairman; Thomas Coates; Robert Means; Marguerite Meyer; Robert Stevens; and Grover Thornsberry.

This Committee met during the week of February 28. After receiving information in the form of letters and telephone calls from the field, interviews with members of the AUC staff, input from officials of Unity School, and after thorough discussion and prayerful consideration, the Committee unanimously recommended that action be taken immediately to restructure the Executive Office.

Since its establishment eleven years ago, the basic structure has not changed. During this time the scope of the Association of Unity Churches operations expanded without the corresponding restructuring of management responsibilities and accountability to the Board and the membership. The review revealed that a structure and mode of operation had evolved in the functioning of the AUC Office which was not beneficial to the progress of the Association or the Unity Movement as a whole. There was a long-term concern regarding the sense of separation between the AUC Office and the ministers and between the Association and Unity School. The Committee felt the need for immediate action to prevent any divisiveness in our Movement once a decision was reached.

After a telephone conference call of this Committee with the Executive Committee, action was taken by the Executive Committee on Friday, March 4, to proceed immediately with the restructuring of the Executive Office.

This action resulted in the termination of the services of Robert P. Sikking, Executive Director. Our gratitude is extended to Bob for the many ways in which he has been helpful to our Movement in its growth. We know that the Father has a perfect plan for him to continue to share and to give out of the Truth that we all love.

It was unanimously decided that the Executive Office be restructured into three distinct departments, each to report directly to the Board of Trustees: Office Administration, Field Services, and Education. This restructuring will provide simplification of operations and more effective control and management of each department, while also providing greater service and easier communication to and from the field ministries. Overhead will be reduced and authority decentralized.

Details have not been worked out and there is much to be done in this interim period. We will do all that we can to fulfill your needs, but due to reduced office staff things may be slowed down for a while. Your patience, understanding, prayer and support will be appreciated. The need for leadership in the office during the period of reorganization will be met by members of the Board of Trustees and staff members such as Stan Hampson, Bill Fischer, and Frank and Martha Giudici. In addition, Scott Sherman has been asked to assist with office administration during the transition period.

There are many ways that we could react to this news, but as Unity ministers we have a responsibility and an opportunity to respond with love and faith that the Spirit of Truth is guiding us. Together we can insure this change is a step forward for the good of our entire Movement. Please feel free to contact me or other members of the Executive Committee if there are unanswered questions, or if there is any way that we can be of service to you.

WANTED: LICENSED TEACHERS

The idea has been expressed repeatedly that licensed teachers and/or retired ministers who desire to do expansion work of smaller ministries could serve a valuable function for the Unity Movement by developing these smaller works as satellite activities of established ministries. A retired minister, by virtue of being ordained, would have more flexibility by being independent. A licensed teacher can maintain status only by being affiliated with an established ministry. If such individuals were willing to move, had a trade that could support them while the ministry is developing, they could respond to the needs of smaller ministries in areas some distance from an established church and do development in outreach work. Planning Ahead

This is the third article in a series written especially for CONTACT by several retired Unity ministers. The authors have met this experience in life with particular dignity and love. Their comments offer valuable food for thought and inspiration to us all. Through this series we shall hear from Marion Brown, Eleonore Krafft, Georgianna Tree West, Mabel Donaldson, Millie Leslie, Marie Handley, and Ernest C. Wilson. Additional authors are invited. This month we welcome Mabel Donaldson from Grand Junction, Colorado.

When contemplating any change there are various factors to be considered; but when we as ministers contemplate retirement from center ministry it takes a bit more doing, especially if we were the founding or long-time minister of that congregation.

We are ministers because we love people, and because we want to serve God by ministering to the spiritual needs of people.

For many of us being a Unity minister is the most rewarding, enjoyable, all-absorbing, and time consuming work in the world-then suddenly we are aware that (perhaps?) we should make a change.

We may have an increasing desire to travel, to write, or it may

be we become aware of a decreased ability to hold our congregation, or we ourselves may feel the need of a change. Many other signals that we should make a change may be given to us.

Then why do we hesitate or put it off? Fear is sometimes involved. Fear: that our retirement income will not suffice; fear that the new minister will not be effective, considerate, or dedicated to Truth; fear that the work, time, and effort we have put into this ministry will go down the drain.

If any of these or similar thoughts pass through our mind, we should know they are false. Let them pass into the nothingness from whence they came. Let them pass to return no more.

We may have acquired an overly protective feeling for our congregation, a feeling that they are our children, because they have been our spiritual children and we want to protect them from hurts, yet we know with Kahlil Gibran, "Your children are not your children. They are the sons and daughters of Life's longing for itself."

The entire object of our work (our teachings, our lessons) has been to help each individual turn to God, knowing that wherever they are God is. They are safe and secure in His Perfect Love, ever with them.

I was told, by my inner guidance, that I had perhaps over-

protected "my" dear ones -- but that I had also taught them well, that they would continue to develop spiritual strength as they adjusted to new ministerial leadership.

Now, I am happy about the way they are expressing leadership, self-discipline and spiritual unfoldment. Yes, God and they have done very well without me and they have entered a time of new growth. True, they have suffered some hurts and they have a few scars. They have had times of standing still and then times of going forward -- but isn't that the way of life?

When I had doubts about my retiring I reminded myself that God was in charge of this ministry. Discord, anger, fear, hurts are

untruths, they had no strength of their own. They existed only as long as we believed them possible.

ME? How have I adjusted to the change? I served as interim minister for AUC for an enjoyable period of time. I have more time for writing and two years ago I took the Colorado State Real Estate examination and I am a licensed Real Estate salesman and a member of the National Association of Realtors.

We ministers, no longer involved in center ministry, now have time to raise our consciousness and minister to a larger congregation (a global congregation). "We can now joyously reconsecrate and rededicate ourselves to the will and the

work of Jesus Christ." We have a vital part to play in Unity and world affairs; to know the Truth — to believe and to practice Truth.

I still minister to people in every contact I make — in business as well as in my social life. I love people and my covenant with God will always hold. "Here am I, Lord, use Thou me." (and he does keep me busy!)

God always has need of us wherever we are or whatever we ar doing.

THINKING EXPANSIVELY

As we continue to work with newly developing ministries, certain procedures that are more effective for building a group consciousness seem to emerge. I would like to discuss just two of these

this month.

First, the formation of a Steering Committee early in the development of a group seems to be very important. A Steering Committee would be made up of six to twenty persons (usually about ten) who help to create a consciousness of group leadership at the outset. The minister or liscensed teacher responsible for developing the new group can then choose individuals that he or she feels would be most helpful in creating a climate of unity and supportiveness within the group. In addition, some professional qualifications and skills, such as legal or publicity are often helpful. As the group forms and becomes a full-time chartered Unity ministry, there is then

a core of trained leaders available to serve as potential Board members.

Secondly, development of a "Project Unity" Fund seems to create a commitment to a full-time ministry, and provides a nest egg for the group as it moves forward towards full time status. This concept has been used in several new areas, but especially effective in two new ministries as suggested by Charles Roth. We suggest using a separate account and encouraging members to use it for special offerings to help pave the way for their Unity church. Such funds can be used for minister's moving expenses, their own special Outreach Projects, or even the down payment on a new church.




James Sherman

LETTER FROM BOB SIKKING

CONTACT asked Bob Sikking to write a letter in place of his niliar PERSON TO PERSON.

I am grateful to respond to the invitation to talk with you once more as I have so often in PERSON TO PERSON. One of the most satisfying functions that I have had as your Executive Director has been this time with you individually. I am particularly appreciative of the opportunity to meet with you in this fashion.

It seems to me that it is important to assume that the individual motivation is directed toward the highest good of our Movement. I don't ever want to believe that Unity ministers would consciously want to take any step that could not be seen to be directed toward a greater goal for the good of our Movement. I choose, after considerable reflection, to see this whole experience as an exciting good step that can strengthen this work that you and I love. I am certainly willing to go with the result as a situation that can lead us to strength and growth collectively.

I have loved these eleven years and I have loved the great people it has been my privilege to know and work with. This growth and continuity will demonstrate themselves because of the love, dedication, and efficiency of our AUC staff.

I have faith in Spirit to accomplish the greater purpose of our Movement and to all of you I say "thank you and God bless you—you are the backbone of this work we love. Please don't abandon it—it is bigger, better and more important than any of us individually or all of us collectively." It is going to be exciting and fascinating to see how Spirit uses this changing time to bless us and strengthen us—personally and collectively. 


EASTER'S AWAKENING

The Reservation Office is often the first point of contact with Unity School for people coming to attend a retreat or UICE session. Behind the easy atmosphere and friendly welcome of this initial contact are the dedication and hard work of the Reservations Office and Housekeeping Department staffs.

Frank Ketchum has been manager of the Reservations Office since 1969. His job incorporates the same duties that would be performed in a reservations office of any motel—reserving rooms; registering guests; arranging transportation to and from Unity Village, the airport, or bus station; and handling telephone messages and mail. Frank and his staff members Carol Holbert and Judy Metcalf provide a relaxed, family feeling even though as many as 240 persons may be attending a retreat.

Working in close conjunction with Frank is Jean Chambers, supervisor of the houskeeping staff. Jean and her workers Betty Lou McCarty, Carol Keck, Brian Eenigenburg, and Bob Craig are responsible for the cleanliness and orderliness of the thirty-five motel and eighty cottage rooms. Often there is only a day or two between groups of visitors, and all the cleaning and changing of linens must be done at top speed.

The housekeeping staff is also responsible for the care of the eleven rooms which are rented to student ministers and Unity employees, the Reservations Office, Fellowship Lounge, Wee Wisdom School, and the laundry. The laundry, a spacious, clean, sunny room, handles the large volume of linens required for the rooms. Adjacent to the laundry is a staff lounge which also contains the equipment needed for the mending of linens.

The biggest challenge each year for Frank and Jean is the handling of the Youth of Unity conference in August. The group, comprised of some 350 young persons and their sponsors, is housed on the Unity grounds. Frank and Jean appear to be totally unflappable, and even this number of young persons does not seem to present any real problems.

Frank and his wife, Bernice, an ordained Unity minister who is now working in the telephone prayer room of Silent Unity, have three children: Nancy, Frank, and Robert.

Jean Chambers came to Unity School four and a half years ago from San Jose, California. Her daughter, Pamela, and two grandchildren reside in Lee's Summit.

We at AUC bless the work of these two people and their staffs, especially for providing an environment of warmth and caring that helps make the attendance at AUC conference and committee meetings memorable experiences.
