

CONFERENCE HIGHLIGHTS

A motion was passed that all minutes of the Conference meetings will be printed and mailed to each minister prior to Conference next year. Therefore, this annual report in CONTACT can be brief and will touch only the highlights. Paul Barrett was elected President and Bernard Dozier was elected Vice-President. Three new people elected to the Executive Committee are Joyce Kramer, Jack Boland, and Arthur Hammons. The Conference Body elected Jack Barker and Jack Boland to the Board of Trustees and the Board elected Max Lafser, Bernard Dozier, and Doris Caldwell. Charles Neal resigned from the Board and Jim Lewis was elected to fill his unexpired term.

Notification of four important items were sent to you prior to Conference. The recommendations regarding the Regional Representatives were approved so that as we continue to move toward increased responsibility in the regions, the Regional Representatives will have specific qualifications and responsibilities. The Doctorate Program, even with revisions, was defeated. Gary Jones was appointed to fill the faculty position vacated by Ed Rabel.

Regarding the reorganization of our Association, a Committee of ten was formed and exclusively charged with the responsibility of developing specific proposals relating to the reorganization. This Committee will present specific proposals to our Conference Body in 1978. It will meet four times this coming year and their minutes and proposals will be shared directly with members of our Association. Direct feedback from all us will be solicited and encouraged. The Chairman for the Committee is Charles Roth who was elected by the Conference Body. The Board of Trustees was to elect two representatives to the Committee and they elected Jay Dishman and Miki Bowen. Also, each region will elect one representative to this Committee. The Bylaw Committee will work in concert with the Reorganizational Committee so that if Bylaw changes are necessary to implement the recommendations of this Committee we can act on them at the same time at our next Conference. The sole authority for the implementation of a reorganization will be exclusively vested in our AUC Conference Body. In other words, nothing can be implemented until after it is ratified by the general membership in 1978, notwithstanding anything in the Bylaws to the contrary.

The membership decided that for this coming year we would continue with three directors—Bill Fischer, Education Director; Stan Hampson, Field Services Coordinator; and Frank Giudici, to be Office Administrator in addition to his SMRS teaching. Since we have been aware for some time of a need for more faculty positions, it was decided to hire an additional faculty person and notification of that position has already been sent to all of our ministers. Scott Sherman will be continuing Outreach development from Chicago and was asked by the Conference Body to concentrate on liaison activities and seek to work to develop a cadre of ministers in the field specialized in this work.

A significant policy change was made by the Board of Trustees that none of their Board members would be on a committee except for Finance and Buget. The full Board will sit in session in January and June. The Executive Committee will not meet during these months unless specifically requested to do so by the Board.

The evening guest speakers were excellent and the Banquet was delightful. A great many differences of opinion were expressed during Conference on many issues and on that last day we forgave each other and expressed our appreciation of one another. The gavel was turned over to our new President and we gave plaques of appreciation to Bob Sikking, Ernest Wilson, and Viola Siemen. Our conclusion was a prayer circle where we exchanged names and agreed to send a special gift anonymously to the name drawn. Truly we were receptive to the Spirit of God mighty in the midst of us to create through us the best Conference to date and to

move us into important and wise decisions. Let us continue to give thanks to ourselves, each other, and for the greater good through for our Association that we shall unfold together.

OUTREACH DEVELOPMENT GUIDEBOOK

The AUC-produced "Outreach Development Guidebook" has been completed. The guidebook is primarily devoted to information concerning newly developing full-time ministries. However, it is of value to study group leaders as well. Copies were given to those attending the "Expanding the Field Ministry" Post Graduate course I conducted in June. Copies have also been mailed to all ministers who are presently listed as conducting study groups or satellite ministries. If you have not received a copy or would like another for study group coordinators or teachers, the initial printing of 500 copies is available for the asking until supplies are exhausted. Thereafter a nominal (.25) postage and handling fee will be charged.

OUTREACH MINISTRIES SEEK MINISTERS

Outreach-assisted ministries in Salt Lake City, Utah; Boise, Idaho; and Evansville, Indiana, are now interviewing prospective ministers to lead them. Decisions are expected by mid-August.

OUTREACH ASSISTANCE TO NEW MINISTRIES

Approval for mailings announcing speakers and the formation of new ministries has been recommended by the Outreach Development Committee and granted by the Unity School board. Ministries to be assisted are:

In addition, announcements of new Spanish-speaking ministries in New York City (Luis Perez) and Tampa, Florida (Marina Sandoval) have been approved.

LIAISON ASSISTANCE

During the forthcoming year, I will be assisting Association members in the area of field liaison as an additional reponsibility. Situations requiring help, however, will not usually mean a personal visit by me. The consensus of the Board of Trustees and Conference Body during the June meetings revealed a greater thrust toward using Regional Representatives or experienced ministers nearby the troubled ministry. This decision will save transportation costs and still provide experienced liaison assistance when it is need I see my role as coordinator of . activity so that little additional travel will be required.

UNITY SCHOOL'S CONTRIBUTIONS TO AUC AND SMRS

During Charles R. Fillmore's welcoming address to the 1977 AUC Conference, he reiterated to the Conference Body Unity School's support of the field ministries. The following are exprets from his message:

"I want to take this opportunity to tell you personally what the directors of Unity School communicated to you by letter earlier this year. That is, we at Unity School feel very close to you-we share your cares and concerns, and we want the field ministries to flourish. We have always felt this way....

"You are aware of the spiritual support Unity School extends to you through our thoughts and prayers. You may not, however, be fully aware of the financial support Unity School provides the AUC.

"For the 12 months ending this April, as in past fiscal years, Unity School's contributions to the AUC were in excess of \$175,000.

"These contributions represent an average of more than \$600 for each AUC ministry.

"Our total contribution included more than \$100,000 in cash and materials; more than \$10,000 in discounts; and more than \$65,000 in office and space facilities for which there was no charge.

"Unity School this year, as we have for the past five years, made a cash contribution of \$7,500 to the AUC for ministry development.

"More than \$45,000 of our cash contribution was made for the benefit of SMRS and was expended for teachers, utilities, travel, supplies, and miscellaneous items.

"Half a million pieces of free literature were given to the AUC at a cost to Unity School of some \$48,000.

"In regard to the support of SMRS, I would like to point out that no charge is made to the AUC for the office facilities for the Director and his secretary, nor for any of the SMRS classroom areas. Unity School does receive sixty percent of the SMRS tuition, however, the amount received falls far short of covering the actual out-of-treasury expenses incurred by Unity School for this area. Unity School absorbs more than \$50,000 annually in costs for SMRS

"The discounts I mentioned previously were granted to AUC employees and SMRS students at the Country Club and the Unity Inn. All AUC employees and ministerial students are granted the same discounts available to full-time Unity School workers.

"Unity School provides some five thousand square feet of office facilities for the AUC executive offices and shipping department. The AUC is charged .15 per square foot per month for this office space. This charge barely covers the actual out-of-treasury expense which Unity School pays to Missouri Public Service Company and the Gas Service Company for utilities to serve that area. Practically no charge is made to the AUC for actual use of the space. Based upon a most conservative figure for rent per square foot for office facilities, Unity School's obsorption of costs in this area amounts to more than \$45,000 annually.

"In addition, and this will come, I trust, as a pleasant surprise especially to your Finance and Budget Committee, the School will extend as a special love offering to the AUC the free use of the Activities Center during this year's Conference.

"I know that I have related a number of figures to you this horning, but I have done so in an effort to communicate to you a sincere and earnest desire on the part of Unity School to support your efforts in the field ministries. . ."

WHO'S WHO AT UNITY SCHOOL



Jo Beougher, Principal of Wee Wisdom School

The time between the end of the regular school year and the beginning of the summer session of Wee Wisdom School is a good time to visit with **Jo Beougher**, Principal. For this brief period, at least, there is quiet while plans are being made for a new term.

Jo is an attractive woman whose face lights with animation when she speaks of the children and the role she feels Wee Wisdom School plays in their lives. Her background is in education and she has a degree from Kansas State College in Pittsburg. She has taught in high school, but she says early childhood education is her great love.

Wee Wisdom School was begun in 1952, and is a department of Unity School of Christianity. The basic Unity philosophy of encouraging the discovery and development of one's own inner potential is exemplified by Wee Wisdom School. Jo says, "Children are encouraged to develop their maximum powers-emotional, mental, social, and physical. There is special emphasis on helping them to learn to reason and gain information-rather than confining them to a defined curriculum. We believe children need a pleasant atmosphere where they can feel successful and valued; a program that responds to individual needs; a faculty concerned with developing the finest in children; and we feel children need reassurance--not over-protection; guidance--not interference. This is the school's fundamental approach."

Regular classes are from September through May with between 75 to 110 children attending. Wee Wisdom serves preschoolers from age three through kindergarten. Enrollment is restricted to keep classes small, permitting teachers and students to cultivate close personal relationships. Highly individualized attention is provided for each child. Wee Wisdom School utilizes the integrative approach, combining Montessori and other current educational methods. Classrooms are bright, airy, and spacious, and contain colorful and intriguing equipment for activities that stimulate sequential, logical, and creative thinking in children.

Wee Wisdom School also has a summer enrichment programthe summer session-which runs from late June through July. The location of the school on the beautiful Unity grounds gives easy access to hundreds of acres of woodland which provide natural art forms and materials. Here the children can discover the joys of nature in a supervised setting. Swimming lessons and nature walks give vital physical activity while providing new learning (continued on page 7)

opportunities within a context of having fun. The summer session also has classes in art, music, dancing, science, and reading readiness. Video tape equipment is used in creative dramatics and realistic self-image development is part of the regular school session.

Wee Wisdom has a qualified, loving staff which has a demonstrated competency in working with children. Teachers include Wanda Bass, Helen Brotemarkle, Barbara Criswell, Judy Gehrlein, Gretchen Leftwich, Martha Weddington, and Margaret Whaley.

Jo says of Wee Wisdom School: "It is a place designed to prepare children for future successful learning experiences by promoting open, inquiring, and curious minds, and the self-assurance that they can be successful!"

Joe Beougher's direct involvement with Wee Wisdom School came in 1966, when she had all three of her sons (Von, Vern, and Kevin) enrolled in the school at the same time. She began as a classroom assistant and the following year returned to teach her own class. In 1970, she became principal of Wee Wisdom School. Jo and her husband, Dr. Loren Beougher, live in nearby Raytown with their sons.

We at AUC bless these dedicated people at Wee Wisdom School for their work in offering to children, and thus to the community, a very special place where Unity principles can be seen in the faces of involved, expressive, and happy children.

FALL MATERIAL READY! - Report from Lani Jones

New Sunday School materials for use this fall, September through November, are now available in the AUC office. The new unit is Year I, Quarter I, and is based on a general unit theme: "The Nature of God."

Each age level will study "The Nature of God" at the area of understanding most appropriate to the developmental needs of the children.

Please advise your Youth Education staff that Part 12 is a Thanksgiving lesson to be used the Sunday before Thanksgiving. If your Sunday School program does not begin the first week in September, or for some reason skips a Sunday of regular lessons, the Thanksgiving lesson will have to be used out of sequence. Please alert your staff members to evaluate their Sunday School calendar at the beginning of the quarter, and then place the Thanksgiving Lesson, Part 12, in the correct place in the lesson sequence for use the Sunday before Thanksgiving.

Please remind your Youth Education Coordinator (or whoever orders Sunday School Materials) that new materials must be ordered each quarter. Because the size of classes varies from quarter to quarter, it is no longer practical to order Sunday School materials on a subscription basis for an entire year. No standing orders are maintained in the AUC office, so materials must be reordered for each quarter.

The new price for Youth Education materials (due to an increase in production costs) is \$5.00 per teacher's guide and \$1.50 per set of Take-Home Lessons.

TO MOVE OR NOT TO MOVE

The following is part of an article found in the May 1977 issue of Mainliner, which we thought you might enjoy:

"A move every few years for people between eighteen and thirty undoubtedly is constructive. Such moves broaden perspective, add zest to life, help one escape frustrating situations, create challenges of adaptation, enhance job opportunities. And a move every several years during one's thirties can often help one's career and, for some, add stimulation to life. Moves after forty, however, if made at all, should be well-spaced. Children of corporate nomads--especially teenagers-often bitterly resent being uprooted from their friends. School grades often are affected. Children subjected to frequent moves over a period of years tend to become either recluses, mavericks, or supercool youngsters.

"And after thirty-five or forty years of ge, wives of chronic movers start feeling the wear and tear of constant reestablishment in strange surroundings. Just when

they are getting deeply involved in community programs they are told it is moving time. Breadwinning husbands, too, after they have made five or six moves, often find themselves yearning to settle down.

"A community whose most talented residents move in and out every two or three years perhaps suffers most. It has a hard time getting good leaders on town boards, raising funds for long-term projects such as YMCAs, and keeping sustained programs going.

"Our organizations, business and governmental, need to give more thought to personal problems created by a highly mobile life-style often imposed on employees. Corporations that have a pattern of frequently moving their managers and professionals should take the responsibility, as good corporate citizens, of easing transfer problems of its personnel.

"And the companies should, as some companies such as IBM are doing, reexamine transfer policies. They should let the employee and his family decide whether they want to make the move or not, give them a chance to inspect the new location and give them plenty of time to decide, with assurance that a negative decision will not adversely affect the company's attitude toward the employee.

"Movement can be fun and stimulating. But chronic movement deprives people of emotional satisfactions that can only come with a chance to get to know people well. According to a Harvard psychiatrist, people without roots have a hard time developing four kinds of relationships needed for a sense of well being.

- 1. Having a few close friends they can see frequently.
- 2. Having shared concerns with a number of people they know.
- Having people know them well enough to recognize and appreciate their special competencies.
- 4. Having a few people they can depend on in a pinch.

"In a fast-moving world, most people still need to have a sense of continuity and a sense of community."



Book Rack

"How To Break The Ten Commandments" by Eric Butterworth—Harper & Row, \$5.95.

In keeping with Unity's tradition, this novel and very revealing approach to an age-old subject breaks through the clicheridden surface treatment of the Ten Commandments to outline ten very significant steps in personal unfoldment in Truth.

The book has already had wide distribution. A Jewish Rabbi writes that he sees this as a superlative treatment of the decalogue and the finest Christian-oriented book he has come across. A New York psychiatrist has written that he is giving this book to some of his patients. He says that it presents the most balanced Godconcept he has found, which, he says, is a needed therapy for many confused people.

"It is more than a study of the Commandments. It is one of the best textbooks on metaphysics I have come across."


