### AUC President's Letter

Dear Friends,

I would like to have you think with me about Committee service. Specifically, I have in mind the following:

#### Project '82

First of all, there are still opportunities for service on the Project '82 Committee. This important committee will be working under chairman Jim Lewis to draft a five-year growth plan for our Association. I have asked Jim to expand the scope of this committee to include a master growth plan for the next two decades, which will bring us up to the 21st century.

#### **Hymn Book Committee**

In June, Paul Barrett appointed a small Hymn Book Committee to coordinate with Unity School. As we come closer to developing a joint hymnal, we may need to enlarge this committee. We may also need advisors to the committee. If you have expertise in the area of musical composition - words and music or in judging hymns suitable for Unity congregations, or if you have outstanding lay people in your church whose musical knowledge would be useful, please let me know. It would also be very helpful if you would send me, for my file, a brief resume of the person with the musical experience.

#### **Group Services Committee**

Also in June, Paul appointed a Board Committee (Joyce Kramer, RobertWasner, and David McClure) to investigate hospital and medical plans other than Blue Cross/Blue Shield. Subsequently, in a conversation with Stan, he suggested having a standing committee for Group Services for the purpose of reviewing hospital, medical and dental insurance; retirement plans; investment plans, etc. Should your interests lie in this area, please let me hear from you regarding your willingness to serve on this committee.

#### Guidelines for Committees

three points which will, hopefully, clarify the relationship between the Board and Board Committees. Through the years we have all heard complaints from committee members that their committee lacks authority, that they cannot do anything, that they feel frustrated by lack of accomplishment.

According to Robert's Rules of Order:

- Committees are extensions of the Board.
   Committees are not autonomous bodies with power of decision and action.
- 2. Board Committees report to the appointing body, i.e., the Board of Directors.

In keeping with this procedure, committee reports will no longer be presented to the conference body by committee chairpersons. Instead, we will follow the parliamentary procedure which calls for action taken on committee reports to be presented by the President in his Board report to the conference body. Copies of each committee report will, however, be available upon request by any voting member of the committee.

3. Reports of Committees will be the property of the Board.

In the past, when the Board has made certain alterations in committee reports there have been some who have felt that the Board was trying to squelch or ride rough-shod over the committee. Again, may I remind you that our committees are extensions of the Board, and we should never get into a position where the tail wags the dog. Every member of every committee should be aware that, when a committee report is given to the Board, the Board may either modify or delete any portion thereof. It may agree or disagree, accept or reject, act or take no action.

Awareness of these points can prevent misunderstanding about the way that a committee functions.


#### Committee Reports

The Board of Trustees, immediately following its June meetings, asked me to accept the position which is now called Field Services Coordinator. It is a function which is, basically, divided into three parts. I would like to take this first opportunity to share with you how each of these functions will serve you and our Association.

#### **OUTREACH:**

The commitment of the Association to the development of new ministries and study groups will continue under our new organizational structure. However, rather than being directly involved in the day-to-day development of individual ministries, I will have the responsibility of working with the host ministries who are establishing satellites, regional groups working with new ministries, and, occasionally, through our own efforts here at headquarters, helping to develop groups where local help is not immediately available. To do this we will, of course, be relying to a greater and greater degree on our regionally-appointed Outreach Development Representatives and our Regional Representatives.

We will continue to work with several groups in the upper Great Lakes area (from within our original cluster), but have expanded activities to include centers from Florida to Oregon and from Texas to Canada. If you recognize the possibilities in an area which you feel needs developmental assistance, please do not hesitate to call and I and the ten members of the Outreach Development Committee will do our best to be of service to you. The Chairman of this Committee is Dorothy Pierson, Sacramento, California.

#### LIAISON:

Also during the June meetings, a plan was formulated for developing several trained, skilled individuals in liaison work

for each Region. Training programs to help experienced ministers prepare themselves for liaison services in nearby ministries are already planned. A letter has gone out to each Regional Representative asking him or her to nominate five or six experienced ministers from their region for possible appointment by the Board for liaison duty and for training which will begin later this fall. The initial selection process was begun at our Executive Committee meeting at the end of September. Even though none of us wishes disharmony in any of our centers' operations, it does sometimes occur. I have had the opportunity to work with nearly thirty ministries in the last thirteen months on liaison matters. Some of these have been simple challenges that could be handled by a letter or a telephone call. Others have required numerous visits and countless telephone contacts to help unfold the healing process.

#### **ASSOCIATION MANAGEMENT:**

The third responsibility of this position is that of supervising the management of our office activities here. We have recently appointed a new office manager, a delightful woman with strong business experience, Sunny Fish, to manage the day-to-day operations of the Association offices. Her function is to supervise and manage these activities to insure that our Association is administered properly, the funds are handled well, and that our personnel are efficient and effective. I am pleased to say that, in this area, for the first time in more than twenty months, the Association is at its full staff level. It is hard to realize that for nearly two years the Association offices have been managed with sometimes less than two-thirds of the authorized personnel assigned. Those who have gone through this period are to be commended, and I have appreciated the numerous comments that we have received from you in the field, expressing your appreciation to those of us who have been involved during this challenging time.

I am both enthusiastic and encouraged about the work that is now being done and our plans for the future. These I will be presenting to you, in this column, each month so that you may know about the things that lie ahead. Among them is a Field Lectureship Bureau, which will provide you with the names of both Unity and recommended non-Unity lecturers available in your Region. It is our hope that we may be able to establish a "circuit" so that they may come to you at a much more reasonable cost than would be incurred should you have to make contact with any of them on an individual basis.

Our commitment here is to serve our member ministries better and better each day.

#### IS IT LATER THAN WE THINK?

The purpose of our group is, of course, growth. But more than that, its purpose is that of support, involvement, and development of our own


potential.



The membership of my new ministry numbers sixty-four.

Yes, I said "my new ministry." To me, SMRS is as much a ministry as any other. It was in



knowing this that I was able to leave the pulpit ministry and assume my new position. SMRS is a unique ministry in that its membership is comprised of sixtyfour ministers.

Yes, I said, "sixty-four ministers." From a faculty perspective, we feel that we are working more with ministers than we are with students per se. Whatever the call was that brought them to SMRS. whenever each individual received and answered it, his or her ministry began. Spirit had ordained them to serve others in the Jesus Christ way of Truth. Our work now is to help them evolve their ministerial capacities of service. seek to help them deepen their vision of themselves as ministers, that vision not to begin when they graduate from SMRS, but with their entrance into the ministerial training program.

To our Ministers in Training we as a faculty say: "We are here to help you succeed. As such, you will be looked upon and treated as ministers, fully equal with ourselves. We respect you for what you are, and we expect of you that which is expected of all who are spiritually committed to serve as Unity ministers."

I invite all of you in our field service of ministry to hold the same high vision for the sixty-four Ministers in Training as do we of the faculty of SMRS.

#### SPARKPLUGS-A Summary of a Story from UNITY Magazine

Adults generally accept Halloween as an evening set aside for youngsters to dress in costume, travel from house to house, and beg treats or threaten possible tricks. However, Halloween has metaphysical implications for adults, believes Margaret Pounders, who wrote "Trick or Treat!" which appears in the October issue of UNITY Magazine.

Field ministers may want to incorporate some of her ideas regarding the symbolism of Halloween and its meaning and uses into the Sunday service or sermon closest to Halloween.

The author describes three costumed children, a witch, a ghost, and a monster, who come to her door one dark Halloween night. She considers what these characterizations could mean in our lives. The witch could symbolize fears regarding powers or forces outside ourselves; the goast, guilts, regrets, and tendencies to hold on to things of the past; and the monster, anxieties we feel concerning the future, the unknown, or the unexpected.

Margaret Pounders illustrates her ideas further as she describes a personal illness experience. She countered the illness (a monster of her own mental making) by using affirmations.

She describes several more ways people can deal with monsters conjured out of their minds by using Truth principles. She believes Truth students can "treat" (a "treatment" being a raising of spiritual consciousness to accomplish healing) the goblins, ghosts, and witches of their minds rather than permit the goblins to "trick" them.

When we "treat" the apparitions of our minds we increase the abundance of life, she says, but when we allow ourselves to be "tricked" our joy is lessened. Monsters, she believes, grow on our negative thought.

Halloween reminds us to use the power of denial to free ourselves of erroneous beliefs; the witches, ghosts, and monsters of the mind. By using denial we will triumph over the phantoms of Halloween. By using affirmations we will arise to the day following Halloween, All Saints Day, a day when holy persons are recognized. She believes Truth students are to be counted among the saints.

Her closing thought--"...do not let those personal goblins trick you. Give them a special treat--the Truth!"

Youth of Unity Report-Your enthusiastic YOU'ers have recently returned from Conference, but it is not too soon to be thinking about who will be sent next year. Many ministers wish to have a say in who gets to go, for the YOU'ers truly represent their center at Unity Village.

Being a YOU delegate is an earned privilege, not a right. Although a minister may wish to have veto power over the selection, many choose a point-system as an objective means of determining who most deserves this privilege.

Here is a sample point-system:

20 (offer opportunities to volunteer-in the nursery, helping elderly members, ushering, weeding, etc.)

Hold a YOU Office:

10 (chapter, regional, or in-

ternational)

Sponsor Evaluation:

20 (subjective)

100 (total points possible)

Each YOU'er who is selected for Conference should have attended at least one regional rally. This prepares the YOU'er for the intense Conference experience and gives the sponsor an opportunity to observe how the YOU'er handles a collective YOU activity away from home. This is vital.

Also, YOU Conference is for youths with whole personalities to learn growth. It is not the place to send disturbed youths. Please understand how strong the emotional currents are during that week. They are currents of good, but teenagers with emotional difficulties sometimes feel alienated because they cannot share the feelings of love. As much as we would like to help them, we lack the training for it and it is not fair to subject the other YOU'ers to having to deal with the problems that these individuals generate.

We know that divine wisdom guides the right YOU'ers to Conference.

Written communication is an important part of the work of Silent Unity. People write by the thousands each day asking for prayer, to order periodicals, to support Unity outreach programs, and simply to express thanks. In turn, Silent Unity replies by letter to its many correspondents. In related departments of the written communications areas of Silent Unity, three women share a common bond; Pearl Post and Ruth Mullins in Mail Opening and Helen Jantsch in Finishing. They share an even stronger tie than simply related departmental functions or a deep commitment to the spiritual work of Silent Unity -- their special bond is sisterhood.

Pearl Post, youngest of the trio, directs the activities of workers in Mail Opening. "As the name implies, mail comes here first for opening. Between 3,000 and 39,000 letters a day are read and those to be answered personally are forwarded to the letter analysts. We also keep a tally of donations and payment for publications we receive in the mail and enter these directly into the computer through department codes so part of our activity is for the accounting department," states Pearl.

Pearl came to work at Unity in 1942 and has been associated with Mail Opening since 1968. She and her husband, LeRoy, (he works in shipping) live in Raytown. She enjoys her home and grows beautiful flowers in her yard in her spare time.

Ruth Mullins, the middle sister, works at an adjoining desk in Mail Opening. Ruth is experienced on every job in the department and is often called upon for training new workers and filling in during workers' absences. Ruth and her husband, Chester, also live in Raytown. Their married son is training to be a pharmacist. Ruth says work is her favorite activity during the week but on weedends she is an outdoor person. Other than swimming she likes to work in her yard and enjoys the vegetables she and Chester grow in their large garden.

Helen Jantsch, the senior sister, has worked for Silent Unity since January 2, 1940. Helen and her husband, Harry, live in south Kansas City with their poodle, "J.J." Helen is proud of her ten grandchildren and is fond of needlework so she is making each an original hand-sewn quilt.

Helen directs the operations of the Finishing department. This area finishes, by actually writing, letters composed by the letter analysts. "We can actually write about 18,000 a day," she says. "Our work is very specialized. For example, address problems are corrected here, the order desk fills orders for publications, and we answer pricing and research questions. We are able to answer letters in four languages; English, Spanish, German, and French and we select appropriate pamphlets for inclusion in the letters we send. Most retreat, U.I.C.E., and Unity Village Chapel letters are written here, too. What leaves this area is a finished letter, hence the name."

These sisters, all dedicated to their work, help make possible the rapid flow of personal communication between Silent Unity and the public. They perform a vital service both to their departments and to the many people who correspond with Unity School.
