

INTRODUCTION:

Jesus used four major teaching methods: Precepts, parables, **miracles**, and actions. What is a miracle?

*“All true action is governed by law. Nothing just happens. **There are no miracles**. There is no such thing as lack. Nothing comes by chance. All happenings are the result of cause and can be explained under the law of cause and effect. This is a teaching that appeals to the innate logic of our mind, yet we sometimes feel like doubting it when we see things happen that have no apparent cause. These happenings that seem miraculous are controlled by laws that we have not yet learned and result from causes that we have not been able to understand.”--Charles Fillmore, *Prosperity*, p. 58.*

The miracles of Jesus that we will be studying in this class are those found in the gospel of *John*. These 7 miracles which include the Wedding at Cana, the Healing of the Official's Son, the Man at the Pool of Bethesda, the Feeding of the 5000, the Man Born Blind, Jesus Walking on the Water, and the Resurrection of Lazarus are called the “Signs” that Jesus was the Messiah. Unlike the synoptic gospels, the gospel of John originated from a hypothetical source called the *Book of Signs*. We will also study the 7 I AM statements that are correlated with each of the miracles.

Once we understand the spiritual laws behind these miracles and experience the level where these spiritual laws operate, we will then outline the steps for “creating miracles” in our own lives.
