ISO Requirements Presentation Q&A

Q What is the best way to capture building walkthroughs or surveys?

A In record completions, you can select a category in show advanced options called Pre-Fire Planning Inspections, NFPA 1620, and then select a Pre-Plan Annual Review, in which case you can pick yourself or your crew to receive credit. Next, click continue and from there you can enter the pre-plan name and number. Once you complete all necessary fields, you can record it as a complete.

Q In the aerial topics, setting up aerial for windows and other various things, if you do this in your everyday check offs, can you document that?

A That is good training and I can say that you can do that, but you are still required to do your apparatus check and the apparatus check will not count towards ISO. If you're taking time to train someone on how the ladder should be positioned and how to set everything up, then that is considered training. Use your best judgment on if you are doing your job or if you are training someone on the job and that's the defining point between whether it counts for ISO.

Q Every day there are ladder truck checks, do we input that as an aerial training? What if someone is floating in who don't drive the truck?

A No, that's doing your job as a driver, but yes if someone is floating, then that gets documented as a training. This would fall under Driver Training chapter 6 which is for aerial. TargetSolutions has activity built for it.
