I. District Overview

A. Areas of Responsibility

- Covers the northern end of the City of San Leandro
- Adjacent to the City of Oakland
- Encompasses nearly three square miles
- Approximate Boundaries:
- North – Oakland border
- South – Bay-O-Vista, San Leandro High, Marina Blvd @ San Leandro Blvd
- East – Hills of the East including East Bay Regional park property
- West – Union Pacific Railroad tracks
- Home to one of the largest senior communities in the county
- Many single-family homes
- Light industrial and commercial properties
- Many high-density dwellings including 4 story interior corridor apartments
- Covers part of Lake Chabot recreation area
- San Leandro Creek with high density growth of shrubs and trees
- West and Eastbound 580 freeway – 98th Av to 164th Av

- Park under jurisdiction of the City of San Leandro, hillsides of park are EBMUD and EBRPD. Bridge is rated for fire apparatus crossing. Some hydrants are available on the road to the dam. Fire access roads lead to dam, Chabot gold course and Redwood Rd.

- Jailers will meet you at side access door on the rear of Bld. Prisoners may become violent, careful when performing duties.

 - Station 9 has a MRA agreement with the OFD. Per the MRA, ACFD apparatus will respond into Oakland east of 580 freeway between Estudillo and Golf Links Rd. OFD will respond into
 - Bay-O-Vista area for interface fires.

 - Mutual Aid response to Oakland:
Try to obtain an Oakland radio from their BC. While responding use White 1 or 4. Stay with 800 MHZ to communicate with ACFD units
 - 3449 and Truck 3479 is also a cover engine or truck when a single resource is needed for station coverage in the East end. Usually covers Station 20.

- The Bay-O-Vista housing community comprises the hillside residential tracts in the district and poses a significant interface fire problem similar to the Oakland hills. Hx of Station: The City of San Leandro was incorporated in 1876 and created its' own fire department named "The Union Hose Company #1", stationed at Davis and Hayes. With the incorporation of a high density building program in the downtown area the fire department was relocated to the city hall complex where it served until 1970 when it was moved to Estudillo Av. Station 9 is viewed by city officials as one of San Leandro's most important fire stations tied to its location to the downtown business community.
