

My grandmother loved to fish. After my grandfather had passed I would sometimes take her and another widow friend of hers fishing. The man who owned the oil lease that my grandfather worked also owned other land. He had this one that was like a hunting and fishing camp. It had a little cabin that we could stay in and it had about 4 or 5 fishing tanks that we could fish.

In that dry season he can get way down there and bury himself in the mud in order to survive. I remember my Uncle used to say that you can keep a catfish alive just by wrapping him in a wet burlap sack.

Anyhow, we caught some catfish. We cleaned them and ate them. There's nothing better than fish freshly caught. I do remember however when cleaning this one particular "yellow cat" that inside it's stomach was just old nasty grass that was probably found at the bottom of the tank. Oh well. We fried him up and ate!

Guess what? That fish was nasty! In fact, he tasted like mud! He tasted like the bottom of dried up water hole. Whenever I think about that I think about several verses from the Bible.

I'm reminded how Jesus stood up on one of the feast days and cried out that if anyone believes in Him "... out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." Catch that? Out of that persons heart will flow rivers of living water. Not putrid, stale, muddy water. Instead it would be fresh and refreshing.
