

Dogs and Turkeys

What is the difference between a dog and a turkey? The differences between a dog and a turkey are obvious, of course. A dog is a four-legged mammal while a turkey is a two-legged bird. They are not the same. They have some similar qualities. A dog and a turkey both have lungs, a heart, and a digestive system. They both reproduce and care for their young. Yet, they are distinctly different. We do not expect a turkey to behave like a dog, nor do we expect a dog to behave like a turkey.

What then can we say about a Christian and a non-Christian? These two are far more similar than a turkey and a dog, yet they too are distinctly different. All mankind is made in the image of God and worthy of respect. However, there are some fundamental differences between those who follow Christ and those who do not. The difference is the New Birth. Jesus tells Nicodemus that he must be born again (John 3:3). The fundamental difference between the Christian and the non-Christian is a matter of spiritual life. Those who are true followers of Christ have been born again. They have been brought from spiritual death to life.

So, if we do not expect a dog and a turkey to behave the same, can we expect a Christian and a non-Christian to behave the same? The answer is a resounding no. We cannot and should not expect it. This should have an impact in how we interact and engage with those whom we seek to tell about Christ. We engage them with gentleness and kindness rather than a sledgehammer.

A helpful example could be how we might handle evangelizing people who are in same sex relationships. Is the right move to bring down the sledgehammer and explain why homosexuality is ungodly? Perhaps not. There may be a time and circumstance where that is needed, but more often than not this probably is not the case. The aim is to tell them of the good news of Jesus Christ. We want them to understand their need for a savior and that His name is Jesus. This does not mean that we never address sin during our conversations with unbelievers. We do address sin, and we do not shy away from answering questions about it. Even so, the goal is for the person we are talking with to leave with a proper understanding of the Gospel and our love for them in sharing it.

We must engage the world for the sake of Christ. We expect the world to behave like the world. Even so, we must go and meet people where they are in life with the goal of telling them the good news of Jesus Christ. And by God's grace souls will be saved and lives will be transformed.
