For the time is come that judgment must begin at the house of God: and if it first begin at us, what shall the end be of them that obey not the gospel of God?

1st Peter 4:17

Judgment can come in different ways, but it will certainly include the exposure of sin that was thought to be hidden. David found that out when Nathan the prophet came to the palace and confronted him. 2nd Samuel 11. Something very similar to that occurred recently. The Houston Chronicle and San Antonio Express did an investigative report on sexual abuse in Southern Baptist Churches. Their findings were shameful and painful. The report stated, *"In the past 20 years, about 380 Southern Baptist church leaders and volunteers have faced allegations of sexual misconduct. They were pastors. Deacons. Ministers. They left behind more than 700 victims."*

Beloved, this ought to both anger and sadden us. Within the parameters of church ministries, individuals have been victimized by supposed ministers of the gospel of Jesus Christ. What an offense to God and to the victims! We recall the stern words of Jesus in Matthew 18:6, *"But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea."*

Predators beware. The Lord will execute vengeance in behalf of the victims.

But there is also the role and responsibility of the church to provide a safe place and to properly vet people to serve who are proven to be trustworthy. A fundamental element to the outreach of this and every congregation is to assure parents that the wellbeing of their children is our utmost concern. They must have every reason to believe that.

This scandalous report is an indictment that the enemy will use. As the prophet Nathan said to David, *"However, because by this deed you have given great occasion to the enemies of the LORD to blaspheme..."* 2nd Samuel 12:14. And we must accept the stigma for *"if one member suffers, all the members suffer with it."* 2nd Corinthians 12:26. As the body of Christ, we are not disconnected from these things. We must bear the reproach of cynics questioning and doubting not only our message but, in light of this report, also our motives.

The answer to judgment is repentance where we own the guilt and shame. Offering an excuse, or being defensive will serve no good purpose. Let us humble ourselves before God and plead for forgiveness even as we pray for healing for the victims. And genuine repentance will always lead to obedience, doing things according to God's Word.

The church is called to do *"all things...decently and in order."* And this involves the proper procedure for hiring, staffing and assigning workers in the church.

The early church in Jerusalem sought references [*"honest report"*] for the seven men assigned to handle ministry to the widows. Acts 6:3

In recent times we have taken two specific steps to enhance the safety of children and youth.

1. All classroom doors have a glass window that allows visibility into the class. This glass is to never be covered.
2. We now require new workers with children and youth to have a background check.

In addition,

3. A man, by himself, should never conduct a class with children or youth or travel alone with children or youth.
4. Every member has a responsibility to report any questionable matter to the pastors or deacons.

The days are evil. Let us not be unwise but understanding that we might do the will of the Lord. Ephesians 5:16-17

Dear Friends and Family,

I hope that this letter finds you well! It is very difficult to believe that I have only one year left at The University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill pursuing my degree in Exercise and Sport Science. Not only have I been blessed to receive an education in these past few years, but I also can say that I have seen tremendous growth in my faith in Jesus Christ while I have been in college. The Lord has been beyond kind to me surrounding me with an awesome community of believers during my time at UNC, which is in large part attributable to The Summit Church, which is the church that I have been involved with ever since I have stepped foot on campus.

With being involved in The Summit Church, I was made aware of an incredible opportunity called the GoNow initiative. This initiative involves a growing movement of college students with The Summit Church who are committing their summers, semesters, or two years of their lives after college to serve with one of the local, national, or international church plants. As a part of this initiative I will be spending this upcoming summer doing what is known as City Project, where I will have the opportunity to serve the church and the global mission of God. I am so excited to be a part of this as the Lord has recently been teaching me that the most important thing in my life should be making much of Him, and City Project is an amazing and practical step in doing so.

Specifically, City Project allows me to spend two months being immersed in the local church and cities around the globe. I will travel to New York City for one week to engage with Muslims, Hindus, Sikhs, Buddhists, and other unreached people groups. The middle of the summer includes several weeks in Wake Forest, NC where I will receive practical theological and ministry training by pastors at The Summit Church. During this time, I will learn how to effectively share the gospel and, in response, serve the community of Wake Forest. Finally, during the last two weeks, I will get to travel abroad to serve in an international context alongside of Summit church planters. I know this is an excellent opportunity to explore the mission of God, develop a heart and mind for God, and better understand what it means to leverage my life for the glory of Jesus Christ. I am confident that these eight weeks will help me learn how to practically love God, love others, and love the world in response to what Jesus has done for me!

The dates of this project are May 21st – July 19th, and in order to make this possible I am in need of support in two different ways. First, and most importantly, you can help by supporting me in prayer. Please pray for all of those who are involved in City Project, that God would do immeasurably more than we can ever ask or imagine. Also, please pray that the Holy Spirit would already be working in the hearts and minds of the people that we will encounter. Secondly, the support it will take financially to be involved in this trip is a huge step of faith for me. The total cost in being a part of City Project is \$5,200. I am asking you to consider being part of my support team through financial giving and prayer. Any amount that you are able to give will be greatly appreciated. I hope that you recognize that while you support me financially, ultimately, you are giving unto the Lord, for He is the one who will be glorified through this opportunity.

I have several support deadlines coming up soon, beginning in mid-March. **The biggest part of my support is due by March 29th.** The remaining portion is due the beginning of May.

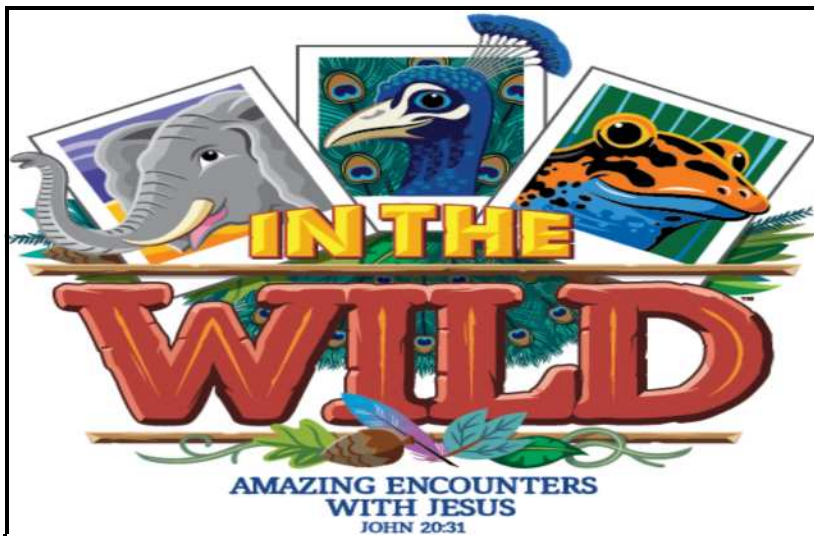
