Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the same day there were added unto them about three thousand souls. And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, and in breaking of bread, and in prayers. Acts 2:41-42

Does church membership matter? Sadly, some today act as if it does not, but if we turn to the Bible, we see that membership matters significantly. From Luke's record in Acts 2 we learn the first fundamental principle about church membership. **Doctrinal Agreement is the Foundation for Membership Acts 2:36-47**

We learn from Luke how Priority was placed upon Doctrine: *"And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine..."*

Four primary characteristics of the early church are given and *"the apostles' doctrine"* is listed first. We know that such a priority is consistent with our Lord's concern that He expressed in John 17:17. And we know from the Great Commission that our Lord commanded the church to teach Biblical doctrine.

Just a few days before the events in Acts 2 the apostles had walked with Jesus. It is not surprising that they would in turn pass on to the new believers what the Lord had taught them.

Secondly, Luke points out how Preference was given to Doctrine: One translation has verse 42: *"they devoted themselves to the apostles' doctrine."*

In other words the members who comprised the early church in Jerusalem demonstrated a preference for doctrine that was obvious, continuous, and infectious. Doctrine was not only treated as important; it was something to be desired.

In verses 43-47, Luke is very intentional in pointing out that Progress was made through Doctrine. This third feature in the Jerusalem church depicts a congregation that is maturing in the faith both vertically and horizontally.

Vertically, the people had reverence for God. *"And fear came upon every soul: and many wonders and signs were done by the apostles."* 43

Horizontally, the people practiced deference. Note that no mention is made here by Luke of anyone *comparing, competing, coveting, or complaining*. In their very practice, the people were a *congregation* of Christ-followers which was seen in how *cordial, content, and compassionate* they were. Luke tells us *"And they, continuing daily with one accord in the temple, and breaking bread from house to house, did eat their meat with gladness and singleness of [generous] heart..."*

And what was the outcome of this healthy balance? A positive influence was had in the community. *"Praising God, and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to the church daily such as should be saved."* 47

As we read on in the book of Acts, we learn that Precision was developed in Doctrine. The church wrestled and came to terms with two critical matters of the Christian faith.

One was the exclusivity and the sufficiency of Jesus Christ. (Acts 4:10-12; 5:29-31; 8:35; 9:20; 10:34-43; 11:19-21; 13:32-39; 15:11; 16:30-31)

The second was the exclusivity and the sufficiency of Holy Scripture. (2nd Timothy 3:15-17; 2nd Peter 1:20-21)

Later in the Reformation, the church would echo these two doctrines with the simple words, *Christ Alone* and *Scripture Alone*. And this all started with humble people who took their membership seriously!

Who gave himself for us to redeem us from all lawlessness and to purify for himself a people for his own possession who are zealous for good works.
Titus 2:14 (ESV)

At the age of thirty-eight, Philip P. Bliss died as the result of a “shocking train accident” at Christmas time in 1876. Mr. and Mrs. Bliss were returning to Chicago from a trip to his childhood home in Rome, Pennsylvania, when the railroad bridge near Ashtabula, Ohio collapsed. The train plunged into a ravine some sixty feet. Though some one hundred passengers perished, Mr. Bliss survived the fall and escaped through a window. The train caught fire, and Mr. Bliss died along with his wife while trying to save her from the flames.

This hymn’s text was found in Mr. Bliss’s trunk that escaped damaged in the accident. James McGranahan, who was in Chicago, was asked by Major Whittle to become the new song leader for future evangelistic endeavors. When James McGranahan discovered the text, he composed the tune we now sing to the words by Philip Bliss. The song had “great spiritual impact when it was first introduced to a large tabernacle audience in Chicago” as Major Whittle related how the text had been found among Bliss’s belongings, and that James McGranahan wrote the tune to the hymn.

The hymn first appeared in print in 1877 because James McGranahan continued the work of Philip Bliss as the song leader for Major Whittle and the evangelistic work already begun.

Can you name the hymn? It is based on the scripture above. Write it down and give it to me. I have a CD for the first one who is correct.

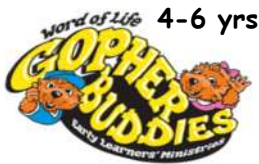

Biblical Counseling

What comes to mind when you think of biblical counseling?

Biblical counseling *is not* what many Christians often believe. It *is not* a professional issuing medication to mask problems. It *is not* a professional asking you to tell them what is bothering you but giving no solutions. It *is not* a professional giving you worldly wisdom sprinkled with some Bible passages to "Christianize" their advice.

Biblical counseling *is* discipleship where one spirit-filled Christian believer comes alongside another person in a crisis, struggle, hurt, and/or confusion showing him/her how God's inerrant Word is sufficient and practical in their situation. It *is* the wise use of God's word as the counselor/disciple enters the world of the other to walk alongside and demonstrate the practical application of Scripture and admonishes, encourages, and offers help and hope to the heart and mind of another, for the purpose of growing in grace and Christ-likeness to the glory of God. (1 Thessalonians 5:14)

To summarize, biblical counseling *is* concentrated biblical *discipleship* that maintains a high view of God, a high view of Scripture, and is Christ centered.

We are thankful to start a biblical counseling ministry at Tar Landing Baptist Church. In August, we will offer an introduction to biblical counseling class to train and equip interested Tar Landing Baptist Church members to engage as biblical counselors.
