 - b. Salvation is solely through faith: note the reactions of Matthew.

 - a. Jesus looked with eyes of compassion.

3. The Distance between Conversations

- a. The Pharisees spoke of Matthew's unfitness; Jesus spoke of his urgent need.
- b. The Pharisees spoke with judgment condemning the man; Jesus spoke with grace- calling Matthew to follow Him.
- c. The Pharisees spoke words of abandonment leaving the man as he is; Jesus spoke words of affection–preferring mercy for Matthew.

d. The Pharisees spoke in ignorance – all table guests with Jesus are sinners; Jesus spoke in truth– Sinners are the only ones He calls to dine with Him.
