Romans 7: For the believer, the presence of sin is a humbling reality. Romans 7:24

Romans 8:1-27: For the believer, the presence of the Spirit is a holy reality.

The Holy Spirit affirms our salvation. Romans 8:9
The Holy Spirit assures our resurrection. Romans 8:11
The Holy Spirit attests to our adoption. Romans 8:16
The Holy Spirit assists our intercession. Romans 8:26

Romans 8:28-39: For the Believer the Profoundness of God's Sovereignty is both a Humbling and a Holy Reality.

1. For God's Sovereign **Pleasure**, We were **Called**. Romans 8:29-30

a. God took the initiative to call us.

(1) We would not take the initiative.

Romans 3:10-12, 18, 23

(2) We could not take the initiative.

Ephesians 2: We were dead in trespasses and sins.

b. God has the **prerogative** to call whomsoever He will.

Luke 7:1-10; 37-39; 15:1-2

c. God is **effective** in His call.

2. To God's Sovereign **Purpose**, We are being **Conformed**. Romans 8:28-29

Jeremiah 18:1-6

- a. God confronts us when we stray.
- b. God convicts us of our sin.
- c. God chastens us for our sin.

d. God cleanses us when we repent.
