

Youth Minister Responsibilities Approved 2013

The following is a list of responsibilities required of our Youth Leadership in order to stabilize the lives of our youth, ensure they are all presented with the Gospel of Christ, and help them to mature as young Christians. They are not to limit the work of our Lord but set to focus and direct the valuable time we have with the youth God has blessed us with.

- Biblical Teaching during Sunday School and Wednesday Bible Study.
- Leads the youth committee in planning(1 year ahead) for all youth functions to include financial and physical needs(chaperones, drivers, contributors, cooks, etc)
 - Participates in all youth functions as available with Job/family commitments
 - Provides 3 month calendar for youth activities to Church Council
 - Work with church Council in planning, conducting, and evaluating ministry opportunities
- Evangelism
 - Visiting un-churched youth as determined and available
 - Maintains a Youth/Parent contact list with home/cell/email info.
 - new visitors
 - Ensure you introduce self to each new youth(and youth family) that visits church
 - gets contact information to be added to contact list(to be shared with Pastor and all youth committee)
 - Follows up with all youth visitors(families) in a timely manner to answer any questions they might have
 - contacting all youth for all upcoming activities in a timely manner
 - School lunch visits – rotate eating lunch with kids at the various schools as job permits
 - Plan and Oversee opportunities for youth to participate in evangelism and service
- Spiritual Guidance
 - one on one mentoring all youth, and youth families, as needed
- Responsible for the Safety, Discipline, and physical/financial stewardship of all Youth Activities.
- Leads Youth worship(2 X year)
- Provides parents a quarterly opportunity to give feedback and become involved
- Preach as called upon by the Pastor
- Meets with the “Board of Deacons” once a month to discuss and review progress within the youth group
 - Reviews future plans
 - Spiritual health of the youth
 - Present known issues within families that are additional ministry opportunities
- As a youth leader you are to set the example for service and dedication for the youth of Salem Baptist Church by:
 - Showing the willingness to serve is your joy.
 - Being the role model for Christ
 - Loving each kid regardless of their Nationality, up-bringing, family, financial status, or how much they respond to you.
- Always seen as working to maintain unity within the Church.
