Register Online

Registration must be completed by a parent/guardian. A medical release form will need to be signed electronically before a camper's registration is considered complete. To register, go to www.campsiloam.com and click on "REGISTRATION" and select "SUMMER CAMP". Follow directions carefully. For those without internet access, a parent must come in to the church office to register their child so that the medical form can be signed in person.

Camp Cost

The total camp fee is \$246. As this is an outreach ministry for members of our church and their friends, FBC will pay \$116 of the camp fee for all campers cutting the cost to \$130 per camper. For families who have more than one child attending camp, we will pay an additional \$30 toward the camp fee of multiples. (Example: Child 1 - \$130 fee, Child 2 - \$100 fee, Child 3 - \$100 fee.) Camp Siloam offers a sizeable scholarship fund to offset the rising cost of camp. Scholarship forms will be available in the church office or online at www.campsiloam.com under the "REGISTRATION" menu.

Deadlines & Refunds

All camp fees are due and payable to First Baptist Church **by June 17**. Installments are welcome. **Registration fees not paid in full by June 17 will be CANCELLED.** There will be no refunds for cancellations after this deadline. If bunks are available, campers may still register after this deadline by contacting the church office.

What is the dress code?

Camp Siloam requests each camper, whether a guy or girl, to be humble and modest in the way they dress during camp. Parents, please make sure all clothing conforms to the dress code (listed below) before your child leaves for camp. There will be no exceptions made. Since young people will wear whatever clothing is brought to the Assembly, parents and church leaders must see in advance that only clothing which meets the policies and spirit of this dress code be brought to the Assembly.

- No "short shorts." Shorts must extend to the campers' fingertips.
- No two piece bathing suits for gals, and no speedos for guys.
- No spaghetti strap shirts or visible bras.
- No deep cut tank tops.
- No sagging pants or shorts.
- No leggings worn as pants.

What about camper medications?

A registered nurse or paramedic will be on duty at the First Aid Station. They are on call anytime in case of an emergency. Campers on regular medications MUST leave them with the dorm supervisor at check-in in the church office before leaving for camp.

What items are not allowed?

- Cell phones
- Music players
- Gaming devices
- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Illegal Drugs
- Weapons
- Fireworks
- Pets

What should campers pack?

- Pillow and bed linens (twin size bunks) or sleeping bag
- Blanket
- Towels, washcloths
- Sweater or jacket, raincoat
- Pen or pencil, notebook
- Bible (with name/address inside)
- Non-perishable snacks
- Laundry bag for dirty clothes
- Toiletries (a good idea is to get a pail or bucket to bring in the shower with you)
- Rope for clothesline (if desired)
- Flashlight
- Slip on shoes for shower
- Water bottle
- Wrist watch
- Spending money for the snack shack, bookstore, and 2 meals at McDonalds

What will campers eat?

Campers are offered a variety of breakfast items. Lunch and supper meals offer three lines; a main line, a hamburger/hot dog line, and a salad bar line.

Do campers need to bring extra money to camp?

Campers will be eating a fast food lunch on the way to camp and on the way home from camp. We recommend campers bring \$50-75 to camp as spending money for fast food and camp purchases. Campers can buy a card called "Crobster Cash" for \$5 per card. "Crobster Cash" allows campers to buy things without having to keep up with their change and can be used at The Hub. The Hub has items such as themed shirts, hats, snacks and more awesome stuff that are great for campers to keep as memories of their time at Camp Siloam.

EXTRA FUN:

- **The Screaminator** - a high ropes element in the form of a gian swing (\$5 per)
- **Bazooka Ball** - an activity similar to paintball with ammunition that flies slower and allows kids to experience the fun of competition without the sting of a paintball (\$5 for 1 hour playing time)
- **THEME:** We encourage campers to bring your favorite Star Wars, Star Trek, NASA or other space gear. On Wednesday for dinner and the rest of the evening, wear your themed costumes. Spirit points are awarded to churches that go all out in dressing the part.
