## Register Online

Registration must be completed by a parent/guardian. A medical release form will need to be signed electronically before a camper's registration is considered complete. To register, go to [www.campsiloam.com](http://www.campsiloam.com). Make sure to select Week 9 "BLAST Week". All families will need to create an account to register campers (you may use the account you set up last year). Follow directions carefully. For those without internet access, a parent must come in to the church office to register their child so that the medical form can be signed in person.

## Camp Cost

The total camp fee is \$269. As this is an outreach ministry for members of our church and their friends, FBC will pay \$129 of the camp fee for all campers cutting the cost to \$140 per camper. For families who have more than one child attending camp, we will pay an additional \$40 toward the camp fee of multiples. (Example: Child 1 - \$140 fee, Child 2 - \$100 fee, Child 3 - \$100 fee.) Families with youth who are attending Student Life Camp this year will have a discounted rate on the youngest children.

## Deadlines & Refunds

All camp fees are due and payable to First Baptist Church **by July 18**. Installments are welcome. **Registration fees not paid in full by July 18 will be CANCELLED.** There will be no refunds for cancellations after this deadline. If bunks are available, campers may still register after this deadline by contacting the church office.

## General Information for Parents

### What is the dress code?

Camp Siloam requests each camper, whether a guy or girl, to be humble and modest in the way they dress during camp. Parents, please make sure all clothing conforms to the dress code (listed below) before your child leaves for camp. **There will be no exceptions made.** Since young people will wear whatever clothing is brought to the Assembly, parents and church leaders must see in advance that only clothing which meets the policies and spirit of this dress code be brought to the Assembly.

- No "short shorts." Shorts must extend to the campers' fingertips.
- No two piece bathing suits for gals, and no speedos for guys.
- No spaghetti strap shirts or visible bras.
- No deep cut tank tops for guys or girls.
- No sagging pants or shorts.
- No leggings worn as pants.

### What about camper medications?

A registered nurse or paramedic will be on duty at the First Aid Station. They are on call anytime in case of an emergency. Campers on regular medications MUST leave them with the dorm supervisor at check-in in the church office before leaving for camp.

### What items are not allowed?

- Cell phones
- Music players
- Gaming devices
- Alcohol
- Tobacco
- Illegal Drugs
- Weapons
- Fireworks
- Pets

### What should campers pack?

- Pillow and bed linens (twin size bunks) or sleeping bag
- Blanket
- Towels, washcloths
- Sweater or jacket, raincoat
- Pen or pencil, notebook
- Bible (with name/address inside)
- Bug repellent and sunscreen
- Non-perishable snacks
- Laundry bag for dirty clothes
- Mask
- Toiletries (a good idea is to get a pail or bucket to bring in the shower with you)
- Rope for clothesline (if desired)
- Flashlight
- Slip on shoes for shower
- Water bottle
- Wrist watch
- Spending money for the snack shack, bookstore, and 2 meals at McDonalds

### What will campers eat?

Campers are offered a variety of breakfast items. Lunch and supper meals offer three lines; a main line, a hamburger/hot dog line, and a salad bar line.

### Do campers need to bring extra money to camp?

Campers will be eating a fast food lunch on the way to camp and on the way home from camp. We recommend campers bring \$50-75 to camp as spending money for fast food and camp purchases. Camp Siloam has a concession stand inside "the Hub" and a Camp Store. The Hub is a hangout place for many campers. Inside you can purchase sodas, candy, snack food and pizza. The Camp Store has items such as tshirts, collectibles and more awesome stuff that are great for campers to keep as memories of their time at Camp Siloam. Campers will be giving the opportunity to give to a specific mission organization on Thursday night.

### EXTRA FUN:

- **The Screaminator** - a high ropes element in the form of a giant swing (\$5 per)
- **Bazooka Ball** - an activity similar to paintball with ammunition that flies slower and allows kids to experience the fun of competition without the sting of a paintball (\$5 for 1 hour playing time)

**THEME:** We encourage campers to dress up in costumes according to the theme.

Monday night - **Crobbster Hunt** - have your camper pack camo and/or black clothing.

Tuesday morning - **USA** - show your colors! Wear your red, white and blue.

Wednesday morning - **Western** - grab your cowboy hat and boots.

Thursday morning - **Favorite Team** - bring your jerseys, hats, and banners to show you're a real fan.

Spirit points are awarded to churches that go all out in dressing the part.
