January 1– March 25, 2018

January 1-January 7, 2018 — Read Matthew 1:1-12

January 8-January 14, 2018 — Read Matthew 1:13-25

February 26-March 4, 2018 — Read Matthew 5:25-48

We must be kind and respectful to them. We must put their needs before ours. We must not treat them badly. Who does Jesus want you to love? Write their names and pray for them today.

March 5-March 11, 2018 — Read Matthew 6:1-17

March 12-March 18, 2018 — Read Matthew 6:18-34
How much does God care for you?

March 19-March 25, 2018 — Read Matthew 7:1-17
Jesus shows that we often make a big deal about other peoples' faults. Meanwhile we often overlook our own faults. He says it's like trying to get a speck of dust out of our friend's eye, while we have a huge stick in our own eye. First we should take care of our own problems and faults, before we tell others how to fix theirs. How does this look in your life? Write these thoughts in your journal and make it as a matter of prayer.
