



Approaches to Learning: Teaching Methods for Children

VERBAL	<p>Reading/Listening to a story Puzzles & Riddles Listening to a story Telling or writing about an experience</p>	<p>Children write captions for pictures illustrating various ways they can show compassion as an application of the Bible story of the Good Samaritan.</p>
LOGICAL	<p>Games/Puzzles Sequencing Problem Solving</p>	<p>Kids work in groups. Each group creates riddles about creation for the opposing team to solve.</p>
VISUAL	<p>Drawing, painting & other visual mediums Imagining Videos Maps, graphs & other visual aids</p>	<p>The names of Paul's letters are posted on the bulletin board next to a map showing the places where the corresponding churches were located. Children use string to connect the book to the correct place.</p>
PHYSICAL	<p>Acting out the Bible story Active games Service/Mission Activities</p>	<p>Older children go on a field trip to restock/sort donated items at a food pantry.</p>
MUSICAL	<p>Learning new songs Making up songs Playing instruments Working with Rhythm</p>	<p>Children learn a new memory verse to a rhythm using clapping of hands and patting of legs.</p>
REFLECTIVE	<p>Working alone Activities that allow for self-expression</p>	<p>Based on Psalm 139:14, children make collages showing how they are fearfully and wonderfully made.</p>
RELATIONAL	<p>Cooperative activities Working with peers</p>	<p>Students work in pairs to resolve an assigned family conflict scenario in a way this peaceful and God-honoring.</p>
NATURAL	<p>Caring for plants and pets Taking nature walks Hands-on experiences with nature items</p>	<p>Children plant seed for flowers as the story of the sower and the seed are reviewed.</p>
