


## 2018 Book of Matthew Reading Plan

Dear Parents,

Our Kids Matter Kid's Ministry team hope that you are enjoying using our resources with your child in reading through the book of Matthew during 2018. In the pages ahead, you will find your reading plan for the rest of June, July, August and September. As in our previous resource, we are encouraging your child to read the verses suggested each week and complete the very short assignment after each reading. We hope that you are encouraging them to journal their responses and activities. Journaling is a great habit for your child to get into!

On the back of this reading plan your child can track their progress by coloring in the shapes for the corresponding verses they read each week.



### June 18—September 30, 2018

#### **#1 June 18—June 24, 2018 — Read Matthew 13:18-36**

This week, we read another Parable about the Wheat and the Weeds (Tares). Why is the kingdom of heaven like an enemy messing up your garden?

#### **#2 June 25— July 1, 2018 — Read Matthew 13:37-58**

In the Parable of the Net, scripture says that there will be sorting out of the good and the bad. Why might it be important to sort the good from the bad?

**#3 July 2—July 8, 2018 — Read Matthew 14:1-18**

In our reading today, Jesus feeds 5000 people. Why do you think Jesus wanted to feed the 5000? What does this story tell you about who Jesus really was?

**#4 July 9—July 15, 2018 — Read Matthew 14:19-36**

What lesson or lessons was Jesus wanting to teach Peter and his disciples in this story?

**#5 July 16—July 22, 2018 — Read Matthew 15:1-20**

What does it mean to honor your father and your mother? How do you honor your father and your mother?

**#6 July 23—July 29, 2018 — Read Matthew 15:21-39**

Jesus went about healing people from what? How can Jesus heal you?

**#7 July 30—August 5, 2018 — Read Matthew 16:1-12**

What is a Pharisee and a Sadducee? Why were they trying to test Jesus?

**#8 August 6—August 12, 2018 — Read Matthew 16:13-28**

Jesus asked, “Who do people say that the Son of Man is?” What answers were given? Who do you say Jesus is? How do you explain Jesus to your friends?

**#9 August 13—August 19, 2018 — Read Matthew 17:1-13**

Jesus was God’s son. What did God tell the disciples to do? Why is it important to LISTEN to Jesus? Do you listen to Jesus well?

**#10 August 20—August 26, 2018 — Read Matthew 17:14-27**

Scripture tells us that faith is believing in something you can’t necessarily prove. Faith is a gift from God. • God wants us to live in faith. • Moving in faith causes us to be blessed. How did the man in this week’s story exercise faith?

**#11 August 27—September 2, 2018 — Read Matthew 18:1-14**

How does our scripture this week explain about being the greatest? Who is the greatest? How can you be the greatest?

**#12 September 3—September 9, 2018 — Read Matthew 18:15-35**

How many times are we supposed to forgive others? Is that a lot? What does this teach us about the importance of forgiveness?
