


Below you will find just a portion of the benefits of being a member.

A Message from the GVBA Director of Community Ministries

So far in 2023, the GVBA Kathy J. Strange ANSWER Center has been open 20 Saturdays for shopping. Over those Saturdays, 1,838 people were helped with clothing, sheets, blankets, shoes, hygiene kits, and a whole lot more. We have had a total of 102 volunteers who have worked at least 1,631 hours. Those volunteers have worked Mondays & Thursdays sorting donations and getting the ministry ready for the Saturday shopping days. On the Saturdays that we are open, we have more volunteers come in and help people who come to shop. As you know, we pray with everyone during our exit interviews, and we share The Gospel with each one. So far this year, there have been 14 who have prayed to receive Christ. We praise God for all who come to know Christ.

An immediate concern and need we have is for more volunteers. We have lost a good number of our volunteers for the foreseeable future because of sickness or being injured in accidents. Of course, we surely miss Diane Rightmeyer who passed away this summer. She was a faithful and hardworking volunteer. So, if you have been thinking about volunteering, we can use your help. Monday's volunteers are at GVBA from around 10am until around 3pm sorting donations. Thursday's volunteers arrive between 8 & 9am and usually work until around noon.

The ministry is slated to be open on the following Saturdays.

- October 21
- November 11 & 18
- December 2 & 9

We will be giving away Christmas Backpacks on November 18, December 2 & 9. We hope to have as many as 300 backpacks to give away this year. We have a church in Georgia that is bringing backpacks to us. we will probably receive a good number of backpacks from the Daviess/McLean Association. I also understand we will receive several backpacks from churches and their WMU ladies here in GVBA. we are grateful for all that is donated to us.

Again, I invite you to volunteer with us. I know you will be greatly blessed if you do.

Green Valley Baptist Association Executive Board Meeting

The Executive Board of Green Valley Baptist Association met on Thursday, October 19, 2023, at 7:00 p.m. with seventeen (17) board members from eleven (11) churches registered.

Bro. Cohen Copley, GVBA AMS, brought a brief devotion, "Where is your heart". He then led in prayer.

Bro. Cole Caven, Moderator, called the meeting to order.

Motion to accept minutes from May 2023 was made by Rev. Paul Davis, second made by Rev. Rick O'Daniel. Motion carried with no opposition.

Entity Reports

- Bro. Cohen Copley, AMS, opened by wishing John & Karen Totton a happy anniversary, the EB members sang. He spoke on the churches he has visited, the Racetrack ministry this past summer, the C.R.O.S.S. ministry at HCC, he participated in a ZOOM meeting with Dr. Todd Gray, president of KBC & attended EQUIP in Bowling Green in September. Tuesdays at 10am & 6pm he holds a time of prayer & fellowship with the pastors. He received a Thank You note from Dr. Basinger in appreciation for the love offering taken up at the Annual Session.
- Bro. Rick Crowder, Finance Team Coordinator, presented the state of the GVBA Finances. He pointed out the Capital Expense Bld. Remodel. He spoke concerning the Disaster Relief grant from KBC for \$20,000. This is a grant received for DR to be used for equipment expenses. We have a net of over \$3,746. We are favorable on receipts by \$13,624.
- Bro. Bill Kramer, Disaster Relief Coordinator, spoke concerning some of our people who went to Vermont to help with flooding victims. We had one that experienced a heart attack. We had our leadership training in August. We've put our sign on the GVBA sign. Our training next year will be in Madisonville on March 16, 2024. That will be the closest training available.
- Bro. Jeff Burke, GVBA Director of Community Ministries, reported that in 2023 we've been open 20 Saturdays with 5 more coming up this year. We've had 102 volunteers. We need more volunteers & he encouraged everyone to come and help on Mondays & Thursdays. We've served 1,838 so far this year. We have lost a good number of our volunteers; Diane Rightmeyer passed away; we've had others who have suffered injuries. One of our volunteers has been diagnosed with ALS. A church in Georgia is bringing 100 backpacks, we do not know how many GVBA will have. We've had 14 people saved during this year.
- Mrs. Beverly Davis, WMU Coordinator, reported on the GVBA Picnic. We had 32 in attendance. Bro. Jeff Hesley & Bro. Paul Davis grilled our burgers & hot dogs. We had a great time at the Racetrack ministry. We've had an average of 35 attending C.R.O.S.S. She extended a big thank you to Dolores Gilmore for all her help. We are now collecting items for the Jail Bag Ministry. We will meet on December 5 at Hyland BC Family Life Center to put the bags together. We will have our Baptist Women's World Day of Prayer on November 4 at the GVBA at 10am. We will have Shirley Barlow. She spoke about other upcoming events.
- Bro. Paul Davis, Trustees/Building & Grounds, reported that they walked through the facility & made a list of items still needing to be addressed. A new roof has been put on the parsonage.
- Bro. Bob Hardison, Foundation, reported on the funds of the foundation. It generated over \$3,000 to fund mission work here locally. \$1,000 was given to Grace Point for their group that went to Minnesota this past summer. We've spoken at Zion & Corydon in the past months. We encourage members to remember their church & the GVBA Foundation in their estate planning. Our funds are over \$200,000 currently. 1)They would like to go to more churches to present their program concerning the Foundation. We are 1

of 2 associations in Kentucky to have a Foundation. 2)we ask that you remember the GVBA Foundation in your estate planning. 3)we are designating January as Make a Christian Will month. This is a time to make your wishes known that you wish to leave a portion of your assets to your church & the GVBA Foundation.

Motion to accept reports as presented made by Rev. Jeff Hesley, second by Rev. Kenny Kidd. Motion carried with no opposition.

Old Business

• Bro. Paul Davis reported that they are waiting for cooler weather to check out the cameras.

New Business

Bro. Rick Crowder, Finance Team Coordinator, presented the 2024 budget for approval. We have now included the income from the rental property which is \$950/month. Our budget will go from \$129,400 to \$150,630. We added a small amount to cover extra secretarial help in the case that the AMS & MA are out.

Bro. Paul Davis asked about the carrier for the Insurance. Brotherhood Mutual

Bro. Jeff Hesley asked concerning the amount of funds given to TAC. What are the expenses for TAC? What is the \$46,000 being used for? Jeff Burke answered these questions stating that they have helped people with food, & they're looking into other ministries that they could help. Bro. Jeff Hesley stated that TAC has \$46,000 just sitting in the bank & it keeps growing. He asked if maybe GVBA should suspend giving to TAC. He made the motion that GVBA cease contributing to TAC. Bro. Paul Davis 2nd the motion. Bring line 106 to -0-. Bro. Rick O'Daniel asked about the expenses on Second Street as opposed to being in GVBA. Bro. Jeff Burke stated that since moving in with GVBA they do not have anywhere close to the expenses they had while on Second Street. TAC would be willing to pay a portion of the utilities. Bro. Cohen stated that Bro. Jeff has offered to help pay some of the expenses with their funds, but Bro. C felt that people giving to the ministry would not appreciate their funds being used to pay bills when it is slated for that particular ministry. Bro. David Riley spoke to a time when GVBA suspended funds in the past.

• Rev. Jeff Hesley made a motion for GVBA to suspend funding the ANSWER Center for the foreseeable future due to the reasons stated above. Second by Rev. Paul Davis. Motion was not approved.

Bro. Bill Kramer, Disaster Relief, we are changing to a self-contained unit. We are going to a Quick Recovery Trailer. We are going out & serving without working with Red Cross & FEMA. Our Response time would be approximately 3 hours. We would need less volunteers by going to this new unit. We will be reducing our inventory. We will work out of local kitchens or our mobile kitchen. We have 50% of the funds, part comes from the \$20,000 KBC grant. We are currently looking for more grants. The motion is as follows: Allow our GVBA Disaster Relief Team to purchase this mobile kitchen, a self-contained unit. He asked for the support of GVBA to move forward in liquidating/selling items not needed. Disaster Relief is asking for permission from GVBA to move forward for DR to request funds be given from our churches & community. Motion carried with no opposition.

Bro. Paul Davis made a motion to adjourn; Bro. Hal Branson, Spottsville seconded. We were dismissed in prayer by Bro. Charley Westbrook, Bellfield.

AIRLINE WELCOMES NEW PASTOR

We welcome Rev. Jeremy Aliff to Airline & GVBA. Bro. Jeremy comes to us from Nicholasville, KY. He was born Dec. 31, 1982. After the passing of his dad in 2007, he started to feel the Lord working on his

heart. In 2009, in a mall food court, he made the decision to accept Jesus as his Lord & Savior. Shortly after this, he felt God's call to pastoral ministry.
