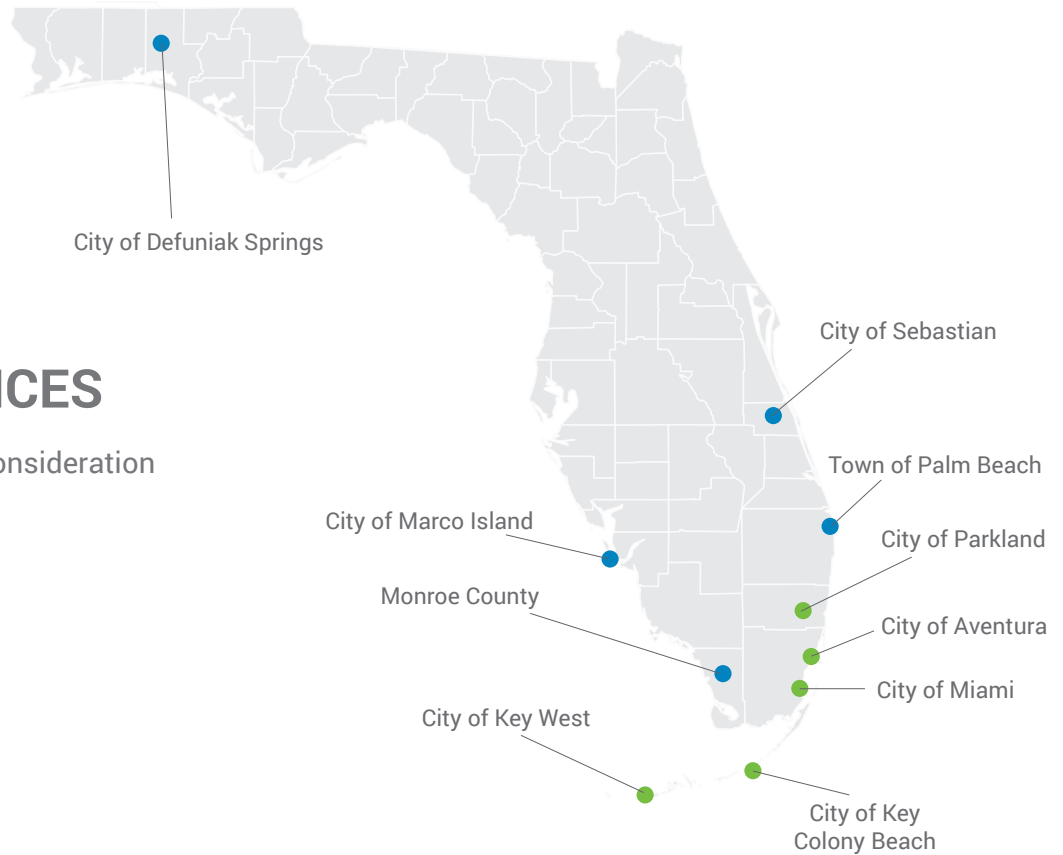
WHAT WE DO

LOCAL ORDINANCES

STATEWIDE LEGISLATION

2011/2012

- Prohibit images or recordings of farm land without the owner's written consent

2013

- Prohibit law enforcement using a drone to gather evidence or information

2015

- Prohibit use of a drone to record an image with the intent to conduct surveillance without written consent

- Require state to review impacts of commercial applications of UAS
- Require state to recommend liability insurance amounts for UAS in commercial applications

2016

- Hold the owner of a drone accountable for the actions of the operator of that drone.
- Allow a person injured by a drone to sue under the doctrine of joint and several liability
