The Conference of Non-Nuclear-Weapon States,

Having discussed the question of measures to assure the security of non-nuclearweapon States,

Recognizing the need that, until such time as the production of nuclear weapons has ceased and all stockpiles of such weapons have been destroyed, the security of nonnuclear-weapon States should be adequately assured,

Recalling resolutions 2028 (XX) and 2153 (XXI) of the General Assembly of the United Nations.

Having in mind resolution 255 (1968) of the Security Council of the United Nations.

 $\underline{\text{Noting also}}$ the concern expressed by delegations participating in the Conference about the question of their security,

- Recommends that the General Assembly of the United Nations, at its twenty-third session, in order to achieve a solution to this problem, convene as soon as possible a conference with the participation of all the States Members of the United Nations, members of its specialized agencies and of the International Atomic Energy Agency and all nuclear-weapon States, for the purpose of concluding a multilateral instrument whereby the nuclear-weapon States undertake to adopt the appropriate measures to assure the security of all non-nuclear-weapon States;
- Requests the Executive Secretary of the Conference to transmit the text of the present resolution and all other documents concerning item 11 of the agenda of the Conference to the Secretary-General of the United Nations.
