

UNITED NATIONS  
CONFERENCE OF NON-NUCLEAR-WEAPON STATES  
REPORT FROM THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY TO THE  
CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE

1. At the present, 96 States have informed the Secretariat of their participation in the work of the Conference.

2. The Executive Secretary has received, as of 16 September, the following credentials:

(a) For the representatives of 69 States credentials were issued by the Head of State or Government, or the Minister for Foreign Affairs in accordance with Rule 3 of the Rules of Procedure adopted by the Conference: Afghanistan, Argentina, Australia, Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Burma, Burundi, Cameroon, Ceylon, Chile, China (Republic of), Czechoslovakia, Dahomey, Denmark, Dominican Republic, Ethiopia, Federal Republic of Germany, Finland, France, Ghana, Guatemala, Hungary, India, Indonesia, Iran, Ireland, Israel, Ivory Coast, Jamaica, Japan, Jordan, Kenya, Kuwait, Laos, Lebanon, Liberia, Libya, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Mauritius, Mexico, Morocco, Netherlands, New Zealand, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Republic of Korea, Republic of Viet Nam, Romania, San Marino, South Africa, Spain, Switzerland, Syria, Thailand, Uganda, United Arab Republic, United Kingdom, United Republic of Tanzania, United States, Yemen, Yugoslavia, Venezuela, Zambia.

(b) In respect of the representatives of six countries: Bolivia, Brazil, Costa Rica, Nicaragua, Paraguay, Sweden, an authorization to represent their Governments at the Conference has been received by cablegrams emanating from the Minister for Foreign Affairs.

3. The Secretariat has received communications relating to the composition of their Delegations from Permanent Missions to the United Nations or to the United Nations Office in Geneva of the following seventeen States: Algeria, Canada, Colombia, Ecuador, Greece, Iraq, Italy, Madagascar, Nigeria, Norway, Panama, Somalia, Trinidad and Tobago, Tunisia, Turkey, USSR, Uruguay.

4. The Executive Secretary has received no information from El Salvador, Mongolia, Saudi Arabia and Southern Yemen.
