

OSCE Scholarship for Peace and Security 2019  
for early career professionals



The Organization for Security and Co-operation in Europe (OSCE) and the Vienna Office of the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs, in partnership with other organisations, are offering a training programme on conflict prevention and resolution through arms control, disarmament and non-proliferation, with a focus on OSCE-relevant instruments.

Building on the success of the OSCE Scholarship for Peace and Security in 2018, the training programme in 2019 provides 100 new scholarship opportunities to facilitate the participation of early career professionals, especially female professionals from OSCE participating States and Partners for Co-operation. Previous knowledge of issues related to disarmament, non-proliferation and development is not required.

The course-programme, starting on 8 April 2019, is composed of two components:

- 8-week on-line initiation course, and
- 5-day in-person course in Vienna, Austria.

The training programme covers conceptual and practical aspects of the following topics:

- Conflict cycle, including conflict prevention and resolution

- Arms control, confidence and security building measures
- Combatting illicit trafficking in small arms and light weapons
- Non-proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, including nuclear security
- Conventional weapons and ammunition
- Disarmament and development
- Gender perspectives on disarmament and arms control
- The Secretary-General's Disarmament Agenda: Securing Our Common Future



All participants successfully completing the training programme will receive a Certificate of Completion from OSCE and UNODA.
