December 19, 2018

On Wednesday, December 19, Emily Miller, Director of Nursing of the Galion City Health Department visited all four building of the Galion City School District including the central office to obtain feedback of the nursing services provided by the Galion City Health Department. This site visit was conducted during the time of 9:00-10:30. Overall the feedback was positive.

Central Office – Both Cindy Parrott (Student Services Director) and Superintendent Jim Grubbs were unavailable. A business card was left with the Secretary, Stacy, and passed along a message to Cindy to contact Emily, DON, with questions or concerns. This secretary voiced no concerns commenting “The nursing services are excellent, I love Lynn, she is great with the kids.”

High School – During this visit at the high school, Emily met with Jake the assistant principal. Jake provided positive feedback and stated he had “zero concern” with the services provided by the nurses. He mentioned the large number of students and need for more nursing staff. Stating “We have a lot of students with high acuity” and it would be ideal to have a nurse in all buildings. The secretaries in office provided minimal feedback. The feedback was positive. No concerns were voiced during this visit.

Middle School – Nikki, the new secretary provided overall positive feedback. She voiced some concern with having to cover the diabetics in the afternoon and find it hard to remember as the student is often not coming down for coverage and needs to be called down. She continues on that she is comfortable with the care but has felt overwhelmed with other responsibilities, especially during that time of the day. *Concern was brought to Lynn on 12/19/18 and discussed efforts to cover this diabetic coverage need. Allison, middle school secretary had no comments or concerns.

Intermediate – No concerns were voiced at this school. Cindy Parrot was in the office at this time and discussed contacting the department to set up a time for the quarterly meeting. Both secretaries were in the office and did not have any concerns or comments. The office was busy with CU Lead going on.

Primary – The primary building was very busy at this time, Amy RN was in the office as well attending to some clinical needs. The secretaries were pleasant and voiced no comments or concerns.
